undermines religion as avenue
for spiritual life



A decline in faith life



Mass attendance in our archdiocese has decreased by 27% over the past 20 years



Across the U.S., 2 in 5 children baptized are not confirmed



85% of children confirmed stop practicing their faith by age 21

- Inspiring witness












Overall goal for groupings

Parish Grouping Process




Discernment and decisions

Communities prayerfully discern the right parish structures for future vitality



Operations transition

Establish a strong, sustainable parish financial and operational foundation



Building our new reality

Establish a strong parish ministerial foundation to achieve our mission

Objectives of this phase of the process

- Connect to the larger RMC vision and begin building toward a culture of evangelization
- Build relationships across communities within the grouping
- Understand the current realities in the local community
- Evaluate structural options for moving forward
- Tangibly: Provide the RMC Commission with a feedback report to help inform a recommendation for Cardinal Cupich

Outcomes for Grouping Session Meetings

The goal of these Discernment and Decisions Meetings is to provide the Cardinal and his team with relevant feedback regarding:

- 1. The concrete needs of the community/communities
- 2. How we have and have not addressed them
- 3. The potential for the Church to impact the communities
- 4. Opportunities for growth, especially through collaboration between parishes

Two types of meetings through the process

Grouping conversations

- Discern scenario feedback
- Incorporates
 feedback or insights
 heard at the parishes
- Submit a Feedback Summary Report to the Commission


Grouping Feedback & Discernment Team

Why renew?



Our model of parish life was built for a different time.

Current parish model makes implicit assumptions that no longer hold

Christendom age

- Culture is supportive of faith
- Family formation & practice is strong
- Parishioners already knitted together through ethnic or neighborhood ties



New missionary age

- Secular culture
- Weak family formation




Crisis of social capital

New parish model needed for new missionary age


Population Shift

Percent change by vicariate, 2000 to 2014




Mass attendance (October Count) has declined significantly

Thousands




Parishes by October Count

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Renewal: three layers

- Behold, I make all things new. (Rev. 21,5)
- In this sense, renewal is conversion—a turning towards God.

- 1. Personal renewal. God doesn't just call the Church; he calls each one of us.
- 2. Cultural renewal. We are asked to be intentional around what we value collectively.
- 3. Structural renewal. What structures can help us to continue our cultural and personal renewal?

Current realities

Before we can begin to consider grouping scenarios, we need to:

- Pause and consider current realities in our national Church, Archdiocesan Church, and in our grouping and individual parishes
- Identify our ministerial and operational strengths and challenges

Making Disciples, Building Communities, Inspiring Witness

Keeping before us our mission imperatives, we answer the questions:

- What are current strengths within our grouping?
- What are challenges that present opportunities to unite resources and minister in renewed ways?

Our Grouping's Strengths and Challenges

Strengths identify...

- Effective mission (ministry, outreach and community)
- Ability to grow
- Operating budgets, buildings and resources that support current and future sustainability

Our Grouping's Strengths and Challenges

Challenges identify ...

- Needs to strengthen mission (ministry, outreach and community)
- Ways to address current challenges for growth
- Ways to better align resources (finances, buildings) to invest in ministry

Our grouping's strengths and challenges

Our Grouping's Strengths:

- There is a great sense of stewardship and generosity among the members of our parishes.
- Many parishes identified a spirit of welcoming as a strength.
- Many of our facilities are in very good condition.
- The number of active ministries speaks to the involvement of our parishioners.



Our grouping's strengths and challenges

Our Grouping's Challenges/opportunities

- A number of parishes highlighted the need to strengthen our youth engagement and attendance.
- Many of our engaged parishioners and volunteers are maxed out, and we struggle to recruit new help.
- The pandemic has pushed us to streaming platforms in ways we never imagined. Yet, we have a great opportunity for potential engagement through technology.
- The size of our communities gives us a great opportunity to develop strong small groups.
