
Father Frank's Fire

Today we celebrate Passion Sunday. We begin our liturgy today with Jesus' entry into the city of Jerusalem. The crowds were joyful and excited, and they literally tore the branches off the trees and waved them like flags shouting, "Hosanna! Hosanna in the Highest!" How ironic it is that the same crowd shouting with joy at the sight of Jesus would soon turn into an angry mob and begin shouting, "Crucify Him, Crucify Him!" Today, let us open our hearts to God's mercy. Let us be mindful of Jesus' tremendous love for us, for there is no greater love than this, then to give one's life for another.

Holy Week

Today we begin Holy Week, the most sacred time of the Church's year. Throughout this week we experience the events that bring us salvation. We are not spectators to these events, but we are participants. These days are not ancient history but have **everything** to do with your lives today. I invite you to devote a significant amount of time in prayer this week meditating on the Pascal Mystery (the suffering, death, and resurrection of the Lord), as well as giving thanks to God for the gift of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world.

The sacred days of Thursday of the Lord's Supper (Holy Thursday), Friday of the Passion of the Lord (Good Friday), and Holy Saturday have the most moving liturgies of the entire year. I invite you to come and celebrate with us as we experience salvation history. Please plan on attending these powerful liturgies.



Easter

There is no greater day than Easter Sunday. Come and celebrate this most glorious day with us. We have watched and waited, and now we celebrate for Christ is truly Risen and living among us. Remember that we celebrate Easter each time we gather around the Lord's Table. Let us not be strangers to the Sunday Eucharist, but let us celebrate Easter glory each week. I ask you once again to look at your lives and see all that you have to be grateful for. Know that everything we have is a gift from God – including life itself. I invite you to consider making a donation to your parish this Easter as a response to all that God has given.

Were you there when they crucified my Lord? I pray that you are – for if we are willing to die with the Lord then we will certainly rise with Him to new Glory! We have journeyed as Pilgrims of Hope with Christ to the Cross – now we continue to journey to resurrection and new life!

Divine Mercy Sunday

Saint John Paul II declared that the Second Sunday of Easter is to be Divine Mercy Sunday. The message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy are based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun that received revelations about God's mercy. The message of mercy is nothing new, but it is a reminder of what the Church has always taught — that God is merciful and forgiving and that, we too, must show mercy and forgiveness to others. I invite all to devote a part of this day to prayer.

We will celebrate Divine Mercy on Sunday, April 27 at 3:00 p.m. in the Church. All are invited to come to pray and to reflect on Divine Mercy. Confessions will be heard on Saturday, April 26 from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m.



The Passion of Christ can be a very difficult part of history to read about. There are so many parts of the story that can sadden anyone's heart. Jesus is

betrayed by his friend Judas. Peter denied knowing him. Then, Jesus was tortured and hung on a cross. If you are lucky enough to belong to a parish that performs the Passion of Christ, it truly is a great gift to really help us understand what Jesus went through on his final days. It gives us the ability to see and hear, and it can be very powerful.

You may wonder why it is so important to see this happen every year. It's hard to watch. I think about how Jesus must have felt knowing he was going to be betrayed, denied and tortured. and there was nothing he could do about it. I always get sad when I see Mother Mary cry as she holds her son after he died. I think about how it must have been so hard for his friends to watch him suffer and die in such a cruel way.

Although it is very sad to see and hear this part of history, we need to be reminded of what Jesus did for US! When we walk into our churches, we see Jesus on a cross. It is a constant reminder that Jesus died for our sins. It is something we should never take for granted. Taking something for granted means that we easily forget or we don't think it is important. It is SO important to know that Jesus died for our sins. He did it because he loved us and he wanted us to be in heaven with God, our Father! He showed us how to get along with one another so that we could have peace on earth and everyone could be saved.

We may only hear the Passion story one time a year but there is a section in this story that we celebrate each time we attend Mass. It is the Holy Eucharist. When the priest turns the bread and wine into the body and blood of Christ, we are remembering the sacrifices that Jesus made for us. We remember and reflect on how Jesus wanted us to love one another and to be in heaven with God. We celebrate him during this time.

Let us pray: Heavenly Father, what an amazing hero Jesus was and is for us! Thank you for sending him to save ME! Thank you for letting me know that You love me and that you sent Jesus to tell me your message! Help me to always remember and to never take You for granted. Amen.

The youngest members of our Eucharistic community give great witness to all of us each time they stretch out their hands to receive Jesus. We are reminded that Jesus has given himself for all of us for over 2,000 years and will continue to do so as long as there are parents who bring their children to the feast.

DAILY LENTEN MASSES THIS WEEK

TRIDUUM MORNING PRAYER

Thursday, April 17, Friday, April 18, and Saturday, April 19 at 8:00 AM

On Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday, no morning Eucharistic liturgies (no Masses) are celebrated. Instead we pray the Liturgy of the Hours together. Only the special Triduum liturgies celebrated for the entire faith community are allowed, and the liturgies for each day of the Triduum are different from a normal daily or Sunday Eucharistic liturgy. **The liturgies of the Triduum are one liturgy that is continued over three days.**



HOLY THURSDAY, April 17
8:00 AM — Morning prayer in the Chapel
7:00 PM — Mass of the Lord's Supper followed by Adoration
11:45 PM — Night Prayer

As we begin our Holy Thursday celebration, a festive procession into the church takes place as our worship space is prepared. The Oil of Catechumens, the Oil of the Sick and the Sacred Chrism, previously blessed at our diocese's Chrism Mass, are then carried into the church. Representatives of those who will be blessed with these oils in our parish, place the holy oils in the ambry near the Baptismal Font. The oils remain in this special place of honor, ready to be used to consecrate, heal, and strengthen the people of God at the Easter Vigil and throughout the year.

Our Holy Thursday scriptures recall the Jewish Passover meal and the Eucharistic meal Christ has given us to celebrate in memory of Him. The gospel highlights the importance of Christ's mandate to partake of the meal and to offer ourselves in loving service to one another. We listen to the scriptures and homily. The feet of parish representatives are washed by the priest (the Mandatum). This is a wonderful sign of our willingness to accept Jesus' mandate to give of ourselves in humble service.

Following the washing of feet, we set the altar for the Eucharistic feast, offer ourselves with Christ, share in Communion and conclude our liturgy with a procession of the Eucharist to the Chapel. This consecrated bread will be consumed at our Good Friday liturgy. We vigil there with our Lord until midnight. Our Eucharistic Ministers, our Choir and our 2nd and 3rd Graders accompany Our Lord to the altar of repose. Like the Jewish people, we place great value on including even the youngest in the rituals and traditions we hold in esteem. We remain there peacefully with our Lord to watch and pray. Adoration concludes with Night Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours at 11:45 PM.



GOOD FRIDAY, April 18 8:00 AM — Morning Prayer in the Chapel 1:00 PM — Bilingual Stations of the Cross

The official Good Friday liturgy, the Celebration of Our Lord's Passion (with veneration of the cross), takes place three times to accommodate all — at 11:30 AM in Spanish and at 3:00 PM and 7:30 PM in English

In Good Friday's liturgy we ponder the "mystery of our faith"...the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. It is not a Eucharist but an extended Celebration of the Word with reception of pre-consecrated Eucharist. We participate in the reading of St. John's passion narrative. John is the disciple whom Jesus loved and who stayed with him until the end. General intercessions for all people conclude the Liturgy of the Word.

In silence, all turn to face the cross as it is carried into the Church and presented to the assembly. "Behold the wood of the cross, on which is hung our salvation. O come let us adore." Together, as one redeemed people, we communally venerate the cross by kneeling in silence for a period of time. This gesture shows our deep love and respect for Christ, who died for our sins. Following veneration, the altar is simply prepared, the Eucharist is placed upon it and Jesus, Our Savior, is presented to us. "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world." We process to the altar to receive Our Lord who offered himself as a redeeming sacrifice of love. Following our Communion, we come to venerate the cross individually, bowing, genuflecting, touching or kissing it. All are invited to linger in silent prayer.



HOLY SATURDAY, April 19 8:00 AM — Morning Prayer in the Chapel 2:30 PM — Blessing of Easter Food and Baskets 7:30 PM — Easter Vigil Liturgy

There are no Confessions and no 4:30 PM Mass on April 19

On Holy Saturday afternoon in preparation for our Easter feasting, we bless our Easter foods. We then gather at the Solemn Easter Vigil at 7:30 PM to welcome our Risen Lord, as the new fire is blessed and the new Paschal candle is lit. "May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds." The candle is raised high. "Christ our Light!" We respond with joy: "Thanks be to God!" The Easter candle is then reverently carried into and through the Church, as the faithful receive Christ's light and pass it on to one another. We rejoice in the beauty of the spreading light and listen to the joyful message of the Easter proclamation of the "Exsultet."

This is the night when we take our time to tell some of the most treasured stories from the Hebrew and Christian scriptures — the stories of God's people throughout the ages — the stories of our salvation history. As we proclaim the Gospel, we welcome back the "Alleluia" as we would a good friend who has just returned from a 40-day journey. We break open the meaning of this holy night in the Homily.

This year we are blessed with OCIA Catechumens and Candidates, and will celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation at the Vigil. The Easter water will be blessed as the new Paschal Candle is dipped into the font three times, and all present will renew our baptismal vows and be signed with the newly blessed Easter water. We will offer prayers for the Church, the world, our parish and the sick and dead who celebrate this holy night with us from afar. We offer gifts of bread and wine and become what we receive in Holy Communion. The Body of Christ at St. Michael Parish once again affirms that we wish to be a sacramental sign of Christ's presence in the world. Amen. Alleluia!!

HOLY THURSDAY VISITATION TO SEVEN CHURCHES

The tradition of visiting seven churches on Holy Thursday began in the 1500s. It allows Catholics a way of keeping watch with Christ as though at the Garden of Gethsemane before His passion.

St. Michael Knights of Columbus Council 10858, is sponsoring a bus to visit seven churches on Holy Thursday, April 17 following 7 PM Mass. We will enter each church to pray for 10 to 15 minutes and then proceed to the next church. The entire trip should take 2-3 hours. The bus is free but




