

How many times do we feel alone, isolated and fearful. We are like the disciples on that first Easter – they did not know nor understood the power of the Risen Christ. In today's gospel, the disciples are locked in the upper room. They are afraid, worried and anxious. In the midst of the turmoil, Jesus simply says, "*Peace be with you.*" After seeing his hands and his side, they realized that it was He and peace settled over them.

Jesus offers us that same peace. Sometimes our doors are locked. Today we are worried, anxious and afraid. Perhaps our hearts are locked because of anger or fear. Again, Jesus busts through the locked doors and offers us peace. Jesus' peace is not an absence of conflict – Jesus' peace is knowing that God walks with us in good times and bad. We are not abandoned because He is at our side.

Jesus breathed on them and gave them the Holy Spirit. In the Book of Genesis, God breathed into the clay and gave us human life. Now the Lord of Life breathes onto us and we receive eternal life.

Today is a day to believe -- To believe that Jesus broke the chains of death and he broke the chains of hell. Jesus opened heaven's gates and now invites us to follow in his footsteps. This is not a time for fear – but a time for faith!



Divine Mercy Sunday

St. Pope John Paul II declared that the Second Sunday of Easter is to be Divine Mercy Sunday. The message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun that received revelations about God's mercy. The message of mercy is nothing new, but it is a reminder of what the Church has always taught that God is merciful and forgiving and that we, too, must show mercy and forgiveness to others.

The message of Divine Mercy is simple: Ask God to pour out his mercy upon us and the whole world, be merciful to others and trust in Jesus. In 2005, I had the opportunity to go to Poland and I visited the chapel where Saint Faustina received her visions of Jesus' Divine Mercy. Above our baptismal font is the image of Jesus' Divine Mercy and from his heart flow rays of red and white - the white rays representing the baptismal waters and the red rays representing the blood that Jesus shed to save us. The rays flow from the heart of Jesus and surround the world. On the bottom of the image are the words, *Jesus I trust in You*. I invite you to behold the beauty of this image and to prayerfully reflect on God's mercy freely given to the world.

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, let us once again commit ourselves to trust in Christ. For Jesus is the answer to all our needs. We will have a Holy Hour this Sunday at 3:00 p.m. This is the hour of Divine Mercy and all are invited to attend.

Fr. Geofrey Andama

I am sure that some of you have heard that Fr. Geofrey will be leaving St. Michael at the end of June. He has faithfully served our parish for nine years. An associate pastor's term is generally five years and is renewable for two additional years. Due to COVID and other circumstances, Fr. Geofrey was able to stay with us longer.

I understand that this may be upsetting to you, as many of you have developed a strong relationship with him. Sharing of one's faith forges a deep bond between people.




This reassignment is not going to be easy for Fr. Geofrey, either. I know the deep loss a priest has when he has to leave a parish that he loves. I had to do so at St. Alexander in 2005, when after seven years as an associate it was time for me to leave, and again in 2018 when I left my first pastorate at St. Cajetan after thirteen years. That sadness eventually turned to gratitude for my years at those parishes and new joy when I was assigned to St. Michael. All of our lives are patterned after the Pascal Mystery – dying to something and then rising again.

The placement board will be meeting in mid-May to make associate assignments and Fr. Geofrey will not know where he is going until then. I do ask you to keep him in your prayers.

I have asked for another associate pastor. There is a shortage of priests and it is likely that Fr. Geofrey will not be replaced and the parish will have to make adjustments to this possible reality. The sad reality is that this year the Archdiocese of Chicago will be ordaining only one priest. Please continue to pray for vocations.

We will have a day to honor Fr. Geofrey before he departs. I will let you know once this date is finalized.

Pope Francis

On Monday, April 21, we learned of the passing of our Holy Father – Pope Francis. This is a time of sadness for many, and also a time of fear, as we all wonder who will be the next pope. Due to the bulletin deadline, I have not heard anything about the Holy Father's arrangements or the traditional nine-day mourning period.

I have found an article I wrote in 2013 to the people of St. Cajetan – I think it still holds true today about the life of Pope Francis. The article will be in italics so you will know it was written so many years ago.

The College of Cardinals elected our new Holy Father, Pope Francis. I have been listening and reading about the words and actions of our Pope. He has shown us many examples of goodness, humility and pastoral care for the people of God, especially the poor.

I have been amazed at his simple style and his desire not to get caught up in all the comforts of the papacy. He received the Cardinals standing and not in the papal chair, he took the bus with the Cardinals, he chose not to live in the Apostolic Palace, and he washed the feet of those in prison. I have truly been fascinated, intrigued and challenged by his words, and his actions that speak so much louder than words. In his talk to the College of Cardinals, Cardinal Jorge Bergoglio said, "The Church is called to come out from itself and to go to the peripheries, not only geographical, but also the existential: those of the mystery of sin, of suffering, of injustice, those of ignorance and absence of faith, those of thought, those of every form of misery."


I think that the Archbishop of Los Angeles, Archbishop Gomez, summarized the message of Pope Francis, "Pope Francis is saying that all of us in the Church need to come out of our pious shells – the comfortable patterns and practices that keep us protected from the demands of truly living our faith in our everyday life. We need to overcome our natural tendencies to self-centeredness so that we can really live for the good of others and for the Church's mission."

We are an apostolic Church. We are called to go out into the world. If we just remain focused on our ministries and have the attitude "they can come to us," we are not being apostolic but self-centered, we are not sharing the treasures of faith but hoarding them as private treasure; our parishes and churches become museums for the saints and not hospitals for the sinners. If this happens, we have lost our way.

We are all called to be apostles – that is to go into the world and share our faith. This does not mean we have to shout in the public square or on street corners. It simply means that we are to live our lives as Jesus taught by loving God and loving one another. When we love, forgive, and live a good and holy life – our actions speak so much louder than our words. St. Francis of Assisi said it best, "Preach the Gospel always and if necessary use words." May Pope Francis rest in peace.

Today's readings really focus on the idea that SEEING IS BELIEVING. We are more inclined to believe something if we see it. If you were outside playing all day in the beautiful sunshine and, once you came indoors, someone told you that it was snowing, you probably wouldn't believe it, right? We've had a few weeks like that recently. It was gorgeous on one day — many of us played outside — and then next day, it snowed! Many of us took pictures and showed our family and friends because it seemed so unbelievable.

The 1st reading focuses a bit on the signs and wonders that were performed by the apostles. The apostles were Jesus' close friends and followers. Because of this, many of those who also believed in Jesus continued to follow the apostles. And there were others who were unsure about Jesus but still watched the apostles with respect and admiration. They probably were so surprised because they knew that Jesus died in a horrible way, and yet His followers were not broken or falling apart. In fact, Jesus' followers were stronger than ever because they had a mission to continue to spread Jesus' message of love and forgiveness.

The Gospel reading then starts to talk about how Jesus first appeared to his disciples after he had died and rose from the dead. Imagine how his disciples felt after seeing Jesus stand there before them. Jesus gave the special gift of the Holy Spirit by breathing on them. However his disciple Thomas had a hard time believing that Jesus had returned from the dead.

Thomas said, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Thomas wanted to see and feel before he believed that it was Jesus who rose from the dead. Now this is very important to read and see in the bible. Jesus knew that even his best of friends would have a hard time believing it was Jesus. So he said, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Jesus was talking about US here. He knew that we would not be able to see him because he would go back to heaven. We — all of us — and our past and future family members, will have to TRUST that these stories about Jesus are true. The apostles started to write down everything about Jesus so that ALL of us would believe that Jesus is the Christ and the Son of God, and through this belief we may have LIFE in his name.

When you invite Jesus into your heart by praying, reading the bible and going to religion classes, you are being blessed for believing in Him without seeing Him. Believe that God is with you always. He hears your prayers and loves you so much. Amen.



No estamos abandonados porque Él está a nuestro lado.

Jesús sopló sobre ellos y les dio el Espíritu Santo. En el libro del Génesis, Dios sopló sobre el barro y nos dio vida humana. Ahora el Señor de la Vida sopla sobre nosotros y recibimos la vida eterna.


Domingo de la Divina Misericordia

En 2005, tuve la oportunidad de ir a Polonia y visité la capilla donde Santa Faustina recibió sus visiones de la Divina Misericordia de Jesús. Sobre nuestra pila bautismal se encuentra la imagen de la Divina Misericordia de Jesús, y de su corazón brotan rayos rojos y blancos. Los rayos blancos representan las aguas bautismales y los rayos rojos representan la sangre que Jesús derramó para salvarnos. Los rayos fluyen del corazón de Jesús y rodean el mundo. En la parte inferior de la imagen se lee: "*Jesús, en Ti confío*". Los invito a contemplar la belleza de esta imagen y a reflexionar en oración sobre la misericordia de Dios, dada gratuitamente al mundo.

En este Domingo de la Divina Misericordia, comprométamonos una vez más a confiar en Cristo. Porque Jesús es la respuesta a todas nuestras necesidades. Tendremos una Hora Santa este domingo a las 3:00 p.m. Esta es la Hora de la Divina Misericordia y todos están invitados a asistir.

Ven y experimenta la misericordia y sanación de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo

Papa Francisco

El lunes 21 de abril nos enteramos del fallecimiento de nuestro Santo Padre, el Papa Francisco. Este es un momento de tristeza y temor para muchos, ya que todos nos preguntamos quién será el próximo Papa. Debido a la fecha límite del boletín, no he tenido noticias sobre los preparativos del Santo Padre ni sobre el tradicional período de luto de nueve días.

Encontré un artículo que escribí en 2013 a los feligreses de San Cayetano, que creo que sigue vigente hoy en día, sobre la vida del Papa Francisco. El artículo estará en letra itálica para que sepan que fue escrito hace muchos años.

El Colegio de Cardenales eligió a nuestro nuevo Santo Padre, el Papa Francisco. He estado escuchando y leyendo sobre las palabras y acciones de nuestro Papa. Nos ha dado muchos ejemplos de bondad, humildad y atención pastoral al pueblo de Dios, especialmente a los pobres.

Me ha sorprendido su estilo sencillo y su deseo de no dejarse llevar por las comodidades del papado. Recibió a los cardenales de pie y no en la silla papal, tomó el autobús con ellos, eligió no vivir en el Palacio Apostólico y lavó los pies a los presos. Realmente me han fascinado, intrigado y desafiado sus palabras y sus acciones, que hablan mucho más que las palabras. En su discurso ante el Colegio de Cardenales, el cardenal Jorge Bergoglio dijo: "La Iglesia está llamada a salir de sí misma e ir a las periferias, no solo geográficas sino también existenciales: las del misterio del pecado, del sufrimiento, de la injusticia, las de la ignorancia y la ausencia de fe, las del pensamiento, las de toda forma de miseria."

Creo que el arzobispo de Los Ángeles, Monseñor Gómez, resumió el mensaje del Papa Francisco: "El Papa Francisco dice que todos en la Iglesia debemos salir de nuestras conchas piadosas: los patrones y prácticas cómodas que nos protegen de las exigencias de vivir verdaderamente nuestra fe en la vida cotidiana. Necesitamos superar nuestras tendencias naturales al egocentrismo para que podamos vivir verdaderamente por el bien de los demás y por la misión de la Iglesia."

Somos una Iglesia apostólica. Estamos llamados a salir al mundo. Si nos centramos en nuestros ministerios y tenemos la actitud de que "pueden venir a nosotros", no estamos siendo apostólicos, sino egocéntricos; no compartimos los tesoros de la fe, sino que los atesoramos como un tesoro privado; nuestras parroquias e iglesias se convierten en museos para los santos y no en hospitales para los pecadores. Si esto sucede, nos hemos extraviado.

Todos estamos llamados a ser apóstoles, es decir, a ir al mundo y compartir nuestra fe. Esto no significa que tengamos que gritar en la plaza o en las esquinas. Simplemente significa que debemos vivir como Jesús enseñó, amando a Dios y amándonos unos a otros. Cuando amamos, perdonamos y vivimos una vida buena y santa, nuestras acciones hablan mucho más que nuestras palabras. San Francisco de Asís lo expresó mejor: "Predicad el Evangelio siempre y, si es necesario, usad las palabras." Que el Papa Francisco descansese en paz.

Por qué la Pascua dura 50 días?

La Pascua dura 50 días porque este período, llamado Tiempo Pascual, representa el tiempo que pasó desde la Resurrección de Jesús hasta la venida del Espíritu Santo en Pentecostés. Según la tradición cristiana, Jesús resucitó y permaneció con sus discípulos durante 40 días antes de ascender al cielo; luego, los apóstoles esperaron 10 días más hasta Pentecostés, cuando recibieron el Espíritu Santo. Así, la Pascua comienza el Domingo de Resurrección y termina 50 días después, en Pentecostés, celebrando la victoria de Cristo sobre la muerte y el nacimiento de la Iglesia.


