

How many times do we feel alone, isolated and fearful. We are like the disciples on that first Easter – they did not know nor understand the power of the Risen Christ. In today's gospel, the disciples are locked in the upper room. They are afraid, worried and anxious. In the midst of the turmoil Jesus simply says, "*Peace be with you.*" After seeing his hands and his side, they realized that it was He and then peace settled over them.

Jesus offers us that same peace. Sometimes our doors are locked. Today we are worried, anxious and afraid. Perhaps OUR hearts are locked because of anger or fear. Again, Jesus bursts through the locked doors and offers us peace. Jesus' peace is not an absence of conflict – Jesus' peace is knowing that God walks with us in good times and bad. We are not abandoned because He is at our side.

Jesus breathed on them and gave them the Holy Spirit. In the Book of Genesis, God breathed into the clay and gave us human life. Now the Lord of Life breathes onto us and we receive eternal life.



Today is a day to believe. To believe that Jesus broke the chains of death and he broke the chains of hell. Jesus opened heaven's gates and now invites us to follow in his footsteps. This is not a time for fear – but a time for faith!

Divine Mercy Sunday


St. Pope John Paul II declared that the Second Sunday of Easter is to be Divine Mercy Sunday. The message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun that received revelations about God's mercy. The message of mercy is nothing new, but it is a reminder of what the Church has always taught — that God is merciful and forgiving and that we, too, must show mercy and forgiveness to others.

The message of Divine Mercy is simple: Ask God to pour out his mercy upon us and the whole world, be merciful to others, and trust in Jesus. In 2005, I had the opportunity to go to Poland and I visited the chapel where Saint Faustina received her visions of Jesus' Divine Mercy. Above our baptismal font is the image of Jesus' Divine Mercy and from his heart flow rays of red and white. The white rays represent the baptismal waters and the red rays represent the blood that Jesus shed to save us. The rays flow from the heart of Jesus and surround the world. On the bottom of the image are the words, *Jesus I trust in You*. I invite you to behold the beauty of this image and to prayerfully reflect on God's mercy freely given to the world.

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, let us once again commit ourselves to trust in Christ. For Jesus is the answer to all our needs. We will have a Holy Hour on Sunday, April 7 at 3:00PM. This is the hour of Divine Mercy and all are invited to attend.


Feast of Divine Mercy This Sunday, April 7, 2024 at St. Michael Divine Mercy Holy Hour — 3:00-4:00 PM

too, can be much more. We can realistically profess that tomorrow will be better than today. We are not bound by the past. There is a future that is created by God, and it is much bigger than what we can do on our own. We do not only believe in survival, or immortality, or just "life after death" — but in "Resurrection." We will become a "new creation" . . . an utterly and amazingly new creation. We will be transformed into the "Great Love" that will be the final chapter of all history. We will be immersed in God's great love that prompted God to send Jesus to live among us. That is why a true Christian is an eternal optimist.

But in today's gospel, Thomas doesn't show much optimism. In fact, he is a pretty pessimistic doubter. Thomas just doesn't get it—until he puts his finger into the wound in Jesus' hand and places his hand in Jesus' torn side. Then Thomas believes! Often, we are like Thomas. We need physical proof.

But Jesus goes on to say that even more blest are those who believe, and do not have to see with their own eyes. We can see with the eyes of our hearts. We sing a song that says . . . "Open the Eyes of my Heart, Lord . . . I want to see you." And once our eyes are opened, we need to go even further. We need to show others how to open the eyes of their hearts—and make Christ visible through our loving actions and compassionate, merciful and charitable words. We *can* become signs of the servant Christ who brightens our world today!

- This Easter season, how well will we show forth Christ's presence as individuals? As a parish?
- Who is a sign or sacrament of the Resurrected Christ's presence for me? What loving service am I being called to perform this week?

It can be hard to believe in something when you don't actually see it. Sometimes, I have to see something to fully understand how it works. I know that when I was little, I had a

hard time understanding that God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, are all one person! How can that be? That's hard to understand. After all, it is one of the mysteries of our faith.

Even though you may have a hard time understanding God's glory, you are not alone. Even Jesus' disciples had a hard time believing some of his miracles. In today's Gospel reading, Jesus' disciple Thomas could not believe the other disciples when they said that they saw Jesus after his crucifixion. Thomas said, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger into the nail marks, and put my hand in his side, I will not believe." Then a week later – guess who shows up at the door to visit Thomas? Jesus!

He told Thomas to feel the wounds on his body but he also said, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Jesus knew that he was not going to be able to appear to everyone who called his name. So Jesus told Thomas that those that believe in him without "proof" are truly blessed because he knew they would be saved. But let's think about that for a second. Jesus is talking about US! Blessed are YOU and ME for believing! Over 2000 years later, we believe in Jesus, we honor him by reading the bible, going to church, celebrating the Eucharist and treating others the way Jesus would have. We are blessed because WE know Jesus – even though we have not seen him.

It doesn't mean that it still won't be confusing. This is why we do need to read about Jesus and learn about why he was sent to us by God. Lucky for us, there are a lot of wonderful ways to understand Jesus. The Holy Spirit lives in each of us and that is a



mystery of faith that will get us to heaven – and when that happens, we will see Jesus seated next to God.

Let's pray: Jesus, may we live with You in Glory. Amen.







Cuantas veces nos sentimos solos, aislados y temerosos. Somos como los discípulos en aquella primera Pascua: no conocieron ni comprendieron el poder de Cristo Resucitado. En el evangelio de hoy, los discípulos están encerrados en el aposento alto. Están asustados, preocupados y ansiosos. En medio de la agitación, Jesús simplemente dice: *"La paz sea con ustedes"*. Después de ver sus manos y su costado, se dieron cuenta de que era Él y que la paz se apoderó de ellos.

Jesús nos ofrece esa misma paz. A veces nuestras puertas están cerradas. Hoy estamos preocupados, ansiosos y asustados. Quizás nuestros corazones estén bloqueados por la ira o el miedo. Nuevamente, Jesús atraviesa las puertas cerradas y nos ofrece paz. La paz de Jesús no es la ausencia de conflicto: la paz de Jesús es saber que Dios camina con nosotros en los buenos y en los malos tiempos. No estamos abandonados porque Él está a nuestro lado.

Jesús sopló sobre ellos y les dio el Espíritu Santo. En el Libro del Génesis, Dios sopló en el barro y nos dio vida humana. Ahora el Señor de la Vida sopla sobre nosotros y recibimos la vida eterna.

Hoy es un día para creer. Creer que Jesús rompió las cadenas de la muerte y rompió las cadenas del infierno. Jesús abrió las puertas del cielo y ahora nos invita a seguir sus pasos. ¡Este no es un momento para el miedo – sino un momento para la fe!

Sobre nuestra pila bautismal está la imagen de la Divina Misericordia de Jesús y de su corazón brotan rayos rojos y blancos. Los rayos blancos representan las aguas bautismales y los rayos rojos representan la sangre que Jesús derramó para salvarnos. Los rayos fluyen del corazón de Jesús y rodean el mundo. En la parte inferior de la imagen están las palabras Jesús, en ti confío. Los invito a contemplar la belleza de esta imagen y a reflexionar en oración sobre la misericordia de Dios dada gratuitamente al mundo.
