## Father Frank's Fire

The days are becoming shorter and the nights longer and darker. Darkness, cold and chill are around us. December reminds us that we are approaching the dawning of a new year. There are emotions of anticipation and apprehension. Many are excited about what the New Year will hold for them – a time of hope and endless possibilities. This can be seen as a time of new beginnings, and it can be an opportunity to start with a clean slate.

The world is facing difficult times. There is conflict among the nations. Political, religious, racial and family divisions among people seem to be widening. These tensions often lead to fear and apprehension. Many wonder what is going to happen to our cherished way of life. Educational costs continue to rise, and college graduates are having difficulty finding employment and are burdened by their student loans. We wonder if we will ever be able to retire and enjoy our “golden” years. There is so much built up fear and frustration that people are no longer smiling; they are complaining about everything and everyone. Social media provides a platform for trash talking all forms of authority and others who may disagree with their particular point of view. Where has simple courtesy and kindness gone? Where has all of the joy gone? And yet, in the midst of the world’s darkness and fear, there is a glimmer of light, a flickering flame that brings hope and comfort to those who patiently await the fulfillment of God’s promises.

Advent marks a time of new beginning, for it is the beginning of the Church’s Liturgical Year. Like the outdoors, the Church also darkens, except for the gentle glow of the candles from the Advent wreath. The vestments change from green to violet. Our liturgies will be simpler, the Gloria is omitted, and the music and prayers reflect the world’s longing for the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ – the Savior of the world. We wait patiently in joyful hope for Jesus, the true Light of the world, and yet we are uneasy, because we know that when we encounter Jesus we have to change.

Advent seems to mirror the world’s emotions of joyful anticipation and fearful apprehension. The scriptures speak to us about the promises of salvation being fulfilled, while there is an urgent message to turn away from sin. It is clear that before we can encounter the Babe of Bethlehem, we must first encounter John the Baptist who calls us to repentance and conversion.

The scriptures help us to understand that Advent is a bridge between the past, present and future. In the first reading, Jeremiah reminds us “*the days are coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill my promise.*” We are invited to remain awake and prepare for the return of Christ. In the gospel, Jesus reminds us, “*Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man.*” Yes, the challenge is clear – we should not be asleep but be fully alert and prepared for when Jesus returns in his glory.

Advent reminds us of the patient waiting of our ancestors in faith – our past. Their hopes were fulfilled in the birth of Christ. However, Advent is not simply a time of preparation for Christmas. Advent should find us watching and waiting to see the presence of Jesus in our midst. We are aware that God’s Kingdom is not fully here. There are threats to God’s Kingdom everywhere; it seems as if nations, neighborhoods and families are wounded, broken and in need of healing. There is crime, poverty, injustice, oppression, intolerance, sickness and death. This is our present. Therefore, we too, wait patiently and expectantly for the coming of our Savior – the true Light of the world – Christ the Lord. This is our future. Advent is the bridge between the past, present and future.

Please do not let this Advent pass by without preparing your soul for Christmas. The scriptures call us to repentance so that we can be children of the Light. We are called as individuals and, as a community of faith, to be light for those who live in darkness, and to be a beacon of hope for those who live in despair. We trust that Jesus will come again to fulfill our deepest longings. Let Jesus enter your hearts and homes this Christmas. Advent is indeed a special season because it reminds us that, as God's people, we are to keep the light of faith shining into eternity. We are a constant reminder that God has not abandoned us, but is here among us brightening our world with his presence and peace.

### **The Gospel of Luke**

The Scripture readings used at Sunday Mass are divided up into three cycles – A, B and C. Since the beginning of Advent 2023, we have been in Cycle B and the majority of the gospel readings were from Mark. Today we begin a new Cycle – Cycle C – and most of the gospel readings will be taken from Luke. Luke's audience was most likely non-Jewish Greek-speaking Christians. Luke's account is primarily a historical perspective of salvation history. God's plan for salvation was fulfilled during the life of Jesus and that Jesus fulfilled the promises of the Old Testament. Since Luke is writing to a non-Jewish audience, his focus becomes how salvation is extended to all people and that there is a universal call to discipleship — a call that is still present today.

Luke makes it clear that he is not an eyewitness to the ministry of Jesus. His writing is clearly dependent upon the traditions and eyewitness testimony of the first disciples. Throughout Luke's gospel, it is evident that he was not familiar with the Jewish practices, nor with the territory at the time when Jesus lived. This has led many scripture scholars to conclude that Luke was not Jewish, and he was writing to a Gentile Christian audience that did not live in Palestine. St. Luke the Evangelist – pray for us!

### **Retirement Fund for the Religious**

Next weekend, the annual Retirement Fund for the Religious will take place. This fund has provided much-needed assistance to religious men and women who have spent their lives serving our Church and our world. They've ministered in our schools, hospitals, parishes and charitable agencies, asking for little in return. They did not invest in pension plans, but in people, in service and in the future of the Church they served. We have all benefited from the sacrifices of the religious sisters, brothers and priests.

Like many Americans, religious communities face the monumental challenge of funding eldercare. Currently the average annual cost of care for women and men religious past age 70 is nearly \$60,000 per person. Skilled care averages \$90,000. The total cost of care for senior religious in the United States has exceeded \$1 billion annually for each of the past 16 years. Can you help those that have helped us? Next week we will have an opportunity to help ease their financial burden and to simply say thank you.

Last year, the people of the Archdiocese of Chicago contributed over \$1 million dollars to this fund. Envelopes were included in your monthly packets and will be available in the Church. Thank you for your continued generosity.

Today marks the first week of Advent, which means it is the start of a new season for our church! We celebrate Christmas in four weeks. Each week in Advent, we light a candle on the Advent wreath. When we reach Christmas day, all of our candles should be lit in honor of Jesus being born!

Look around your church and see if there is an Advent wreath hanging. Some of them have only four candles and others have five. You also can make a wreath for your own home. You can draw a wreath on paper, hang it up on a wall and color in the candles as each week goes by. It's a fun way to prepare for the holidays. It can also help you be mindful of the true meaning of Christmas.

The season of Advent is a time where we can change our ways for the better. We must prepare ourselves for Jesus' birthday – Christmas Day! People were lost before Jesus was born. They believed in God but they didn't understand Him because he seemed too big to understand. When Jesus came, He set an example of what God's love is like for us and showed us how to behave, love and forgive.

I think sometimes we forget the meaning of Christmas. We are so busy focusing on buying presents for our loved ones or what we want for ourselves. Sometimes the focus becomes decorating the house so that we get into the Christmas spirit. All of these things are good to do, but it is very important to be ready for Jesus in mind and in spirit.

I know when I was little, I was always on my best behavior during Advent because I knew it was going to mean presents or coal under the tree for me on Christmas Day. However, as I got older, I found that continuing to be good even after Christmas felt just as good as it did during Advent. I learned that being loving and caring towards those that I loved was the best present I could give myself and others. Being good during Advent is wonderful but continuing to be well-behaved after Advent is most important. Use this time during Advent to change for the better. Let us use this time of Advent to be watchful of our actions. And...let's be like Jesus.

## El Espíritu del Padre Frank

Los días son cada vez más cortos y las noches más largas y oscuras. La oscuridad y el frío nos rodean. Diciembre nos recuerda que nos estamos acercando al amanecer de un nuevo año. Hay emociones de anticipación y aprensión. Muchos están entusiasmados por lo que el Año Nuevo les deparará: un tiempo de esperanza y posibilidades infinitas. Esto puede verse como un tiempo de nuevos comienzos y puede ser una oportunidad para empezar de cero.

El mundo se enfrenta a tiempos difíciles. Hay conflictos entre las naciones. Las divisiones políticas, religiosas, raciales y familiares entre las personas parecen estar ampliándose. Estas tensiones a menudo conducen al miedo y la aprensión. Muchos se preguntan qué va a pasar con nuestra preciada forma de vida. Los costos de la educación siguen aumentando y los graduados universitarios tienen dificultades para encontrar empleo y están agobiados por sus préstamos estudiantiles. Nos preguntamos si alguna vez podremos jubilarnos y disfrutar de nuestros años “dorados.” Hay tanto miedo y frustración acumulados que la gente ya no sonríe; se queja de todo y de todos. Las redes sociales brindan una plataforma para hablar mal de todas las formas de autoridad y de otras personas que pueden estar en desacuerdo con su punto de vista particular. ¿Dónde se han ido la simple cortesía y la amabilidad? ¿Dónde se ha ido toda la alegría? Y, sin embargo, en medio de la oscuridad y el miedo del mundo, hay un destello de luz, una llama parpadeante que brinda esperanza y consuelo a quienes esperan pacientemente el cumplimiento de las promesas de Dios.

El Adviento marca un tiempo de nuevo comienzo, ya que es el comienzo del Año Litúrgico de la Iglesia. Al igual que el exterior, la Iglesia también se oscurece, a excepción del suave resplandor de las velas de la corona de Adviento. Las vestimentas cambian de verde a violeta. Nuestras liturgias serán más sencillas, se omite el Gloria, y la música y las oraciones reflejan el anhelo del mundo por la venida del Señor Jesucristo, el Salvador del mundo. Esperamos pacientemente con gozosa esperanza a Jesús, la verdadera Luz del mundo, y sin embargo estamos inquietos porque sabemos que cuando nos encontramos con Jesús, tenemos que cambiar.

El Adviento parece reflejar las emociones del mundo, de alegre anticipación y aprehensión temerosa. Las Escrituras nos hablan de las promesas de salvación que se están cumpliendo, mientras que hay un mensaje urgente de alejarnos del pecado. Está claro que antes de poder encontrarnos con el Niño de Belén, primero debemos encontrarnos con Juan el Bautista, quien nos llama al arrepentimiento y la conversión.

Las Sagradas Escrituras nos ayudan a entender que el Adviento es un puente entre el pasado, el presente y el futuro. En la primera lectura, Jeremías nos recuerda que “*vienen días, dice el Señor, en que cumpliré mi promesa.*” Se nos invita a permanecer despiertos y prepararnos para el regreso de Cristo. En el Evangelio, Jesús nos recuerda: “*Estén atentos en todo momento y oren para que tengan la fuerza para escapar de las tribulaciones que son inminentes y presentarse ante el Hijo del Hombre.*” Sí, el desafío es claro: no debemos estar dormidos, sino completamente alertas y preparados para cuando Jesús regrese en su gloria.

El Adviento nos recuerda la paciencia con la que nuestros antepasados esperaron en la fe, nuestro pasado. Sus esperanzas se cumplieron con el nacimiento de Cristo. Sin embargo, el Adviento no es simplemente un tiempo de preparación para la Navidad. El Adviento debería encontrarnos observando y esperando ver la presencia de Jesús en medio de nosotros. Somos conscientes de que el Reino de Dios no está completamente aquí. En todas partes hay amenazas al Reino de Dios; parece que las naciones, los barrios y las familias están heridos, destrozados y necesitan sanación. Hay crimen, pobreza, injusticia, opresión, intolerancia, enfermedad y muerte. Este es nuestro presente. Por lo tanto, nosotros también esperamos, pacientemente y con expectación, la venida de nuestro Salvador, la verdadera Luz del mundo, Cristo el Señor. Este es nuestro futuro. El Adviento es el puente entre el pasado, el presente y el futuro.



Por favor, no dejen pasar este Adviento sin preparar su alma para la Navidad. Las Escrituras nos llaman al arrepentimiento para que seamos hijos de la Luz. Estamos llamados, como individuos y como comunidad de fe, a ser luz para los que viven en la oscuridad y faro de esperanza para los que viven en la desesperación. Confiamos en que Jesús vendrá de nuevo para cumplir nuestros anhelos más profundos. Dejad que Jesús entre en vuestros corazones y hogares esta Navidad. El Adviento es, sin duda, una temporada especial porque nos recuerda que, como pueblo de Dios, debemos mantener la luz de la fe brillando en la eternidad. Somos un recordatorio constante de que Dios no nos ha abandonado, sino que está aquí entre nosotros, iluminando nuestro mundo con su presencia y su paz.

### **El Evangelio de Lucas**

Las lecturas de las Sagradas Escrituras que se utilizan en la misa dominical se dividen en tres ciclos: A, B y C. Desde el comienzo del Adviento de 2023, hemos estado en el Ciclo B, y la mayoría de las lecturas del Evangelio fueron de Marcos. Hoy comenzamos un nuevo Ciclo, el Ciclo C, y la mayoría de las lecturas del Evangelio serán de Lucas. La audiencia de Lucas probablemente eran cristianos no judíos de habla griega. El relato de Lucas es principalmente una perspectiva histórica de la historia de la salvación. El plan de Dios para la salvación se cumplió durante la vida de Jesús, y Jesús cumplió las promesas del Antiguo Testamento. Dado que Lucas está escribiendo a una audiencia no judía, su enfoque se centra en cómo se extiende la salvación a todas las personas y en que existe un llamado universal al discipulado y un llamado que todavía está presente hoy.

Lucas deja en claro que no es un testigo ocular del ministerio de Jesús. Su escritura depende claramente de las tradiciones y el testimonio de los primeros discípulos. A lo largo del evangelio de Lucas, es evidente que no estaba familiarizado con las prácticas judías ni con el territorio en la época en que vivió Jesús. Esto ha llevado a muchos estudiosos de las Escrituras a concluir que Lucas no era judío y que estaba escribiendo a un público gentil, es decir, cristiano, que no vivía en Palestina. San Lucas Evangelista: ¡ruega por nosotros!

### **Fondo de Jubilación para Religiosos**

El próximo fin de semana se tratará el Fondo de Jubilación anual para los Religiosos. Este fondo ha proporcionado una ayuda muy necesaria a los hombres y mujeres religiosos que han dedicado su vida al servicio de nuestra Iglesia y de nuestro mundo. Han trabajado en nuestras escuelas, hospitales, parroquias y organismos de beneficencia, pidiendo poco a cambio. No han invertido en planes de pensiones, sino en las personas, en el servicio y en el futuro de la Iglesia a la que han servido. Todos nos hemos beneficiado de los sacrificios de las hermanas, hermanos y sacerdotes religiosos.

Al igual que muchos estadounidenses, las comunidades religiosas se enfrentan al monumental desafío de financiar la atención a los ancianos. Actualmente, el costo anual promedio de la atención para mujeres y hombres religiosos mayores de 70 años es de casi \$60,000 por persona. La atención especializada cuesta en promedio \$90,000. El coste total de la atención a los religiosos mayores en los Estados Unidos ha superado 1 millón de dólares anuales durante cada uno de los últimos 16 años. ¿Puede ayudar a quienes nos han ayudado? La semana que viene tendremos la oportunidad de ayudar a aliviar su carga financiera y simplemente decírselas gracias.

El año pasado, la gente de la Arquidiócesis de Chicago contribuyó con más de un millón de dólares a este fondo. Se incluyeron sobres en sus paquetes mensuales y estarán disponibles en la Iglesia. Gracias por su continua generosidad.


