Father Frank's Fire

It seems like we were just here yesterday to celebrate the joy of Christmas! We gather today to celebrate the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Through the centuries artists have depicted the Holy Family as a perfect family that does not seem to have a care in the world. Jesus appears obedient, and Mary and Joseph are pictured in a state of prayer. Often times we have this image of the Holy Family as being "perfect" that we quickly dismiss it as unattainable, for we know that we are far from perfect.

I am not sure where we ever got the idea that the family of Jesus was perfect. If we carefully examine the scriptures we can conclude that the Holy Family struggled like any other family. When Mary and Joseph went to the temple to present Jesus, they offered a pair of turtledoves. This was not the customary offering, but this was the offering of a poor family. The Holy Family struggled financially just like many of us do. Joseph, Mary and Jesus had to flee to Egypt because Herod was looking to kill Jesus. They lived in exile away from their home, their family and their friends. They did not have an easy life and not much else is know about them, except that they loved each other and took care of each other. The key to making any family holy is love.

As we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, let us remember that all families are different. They come in different shapes and sizes, and are not limited to biology. I count many of my good friends as family. I consider you, the people of St. Michael, as family. What is important to remember is that no family is perfect but that all families are holy.

In all families and communities there is often disagreement, disappointment and discouragement. We get angry, stubborn and sometimes vindictive. Sometimes we just want to prove we are right. Where love, compassion and forgiveness reign – God is present. Take time today to look at your own family. I urge you to ignore your family's imperfections and blemishes, and open your eyes to see its goodness and holiness.





Vivieron en el exilio lejos de su hogar, su familia y sus amigos. No tuvieron una vida fácil y no se sabe mucho más sobre ellos, excepto que se amaban y se cuidaban mutuamente. La clave para hacer que cualquier familia sea santa es el amor.

Al celebrar la Fiesta de la Sagrada Familia, recordemos que todas las familias son diferentes. Tienen distintas formas y tamaños y no se limitan a la biología. Considero a muchos de mis buenos amigos como familia. Considero a ustedes, la gente de San Miguel, como familia. Lo que es importante recordar es que ninguna familia es perfecta, pero que todas las familias son santas.

En todas las familias y comunidades, a menudo hay desacuerdo, desilusión y desánimo. Nos enojamos, nos volvemos tercos y, a veces, vengativos. A veces, solo queremos demostrar que tenemos razón. Donde reinan el

amor, la compasión y el perdón, Dios está presente. Tómense un tiempo hoy para observar a su propia familia. Los insto a que ignoren las imperfecciones y los defectos de su familia, abran los ojos y vean su bondad y santidad.

If a contribution dated in December was mailed to the Parish Office and **postmarked** on or before Dec. 31, it will be recorded as a 2024 contribution. However, all contributions delivered to the Parish Office in person or postmarked on or after Jan. 1 must be recorded as a 2025 contribution. Therefore, if a check was dated in December 2024 but mailed or delivered to the Parish Office in January 2025, that contribution must be recorded as a 2025 contribution.
