

Father Frank's Fire

Today we begin the second Sunday of Advent. Two candles flicker on the Advent wreath reminding us that the true Light of the World is coming. Last week's readings were rather dismal, speaking to us about the end of time and the judgment that will come upon the world. This weekend we encounter John the Baptist, the crazy prophet wearing camel's hair and smelling of locusts and wild honey.

John's mission was clear; he was to prepare the way for Jesus by proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Repentance is a hopeful stance – the acknowledgement of our sins and the promise of changing our ways. It is hopeful because God offers us the gift of reconciliation and forgiveness, the opportunity to begin again. There is only one small catch – we must admit that we have sinned. I have noticed that many Catholics no longer have a sense of sin. They figure if they have "not killed" anyone, they are in good with God.

We no longer accept responsibility for our actions or inactions. Instead of saying we are sorry, we spend countless hours trying to justify our actions and prove that we are right. We have all sinned, and we are all in need of forgiveness and reconciliation. How many times have you heard, "I don't believe in confession?" Could this be our pride talking? I guess we know better than Jesus, who gave us this gift. Why are we afraid and why do we refuse to accept this gift of grace? In the Jordan River, the people came to see John the Baptist and publicly acknowledged their sinfulness.

There is no greater way to prepare for the coming of Christ than by going to confession and receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation. If you have been away from the Sacrament for a while – perhaps now is the time to return to experience the joy of God's embrace. I invite you to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Advent as a way of preparing for the birth of Christ into our hearts and homes.

May we have the courage to acknowledge our sinfulness, to repent for our actions and to receive God's grace and mercy through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. As we beg for God's mercy, it is important that we are merciful to one another.

Confessions will be heard on Saturday, Dec. 14 and Saturday, Dec. 21 from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. In addition, there will be two reconciliation services with individual confessions — at 6:15 p.m. on Monday, Dec. 9 and Tuesday, Dec. 10.

The Immaculate Conception

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is celebrated on December 8. This year, December 8 is a Sunday. However, according to the Code of Canon Law as well as Liturgical Laws, the Second Sunday of Advent takes precedence over the celebration of the Immaculate Conception. Consequently, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is transferred to Monday, Dec. 9.

There is some confusion if the Immaculate Conception, falling on a Monday, is a Holy Day of Obligation. The correct answer is yes, it remains a Holy Day of Obligation. However, many bishops have given their faithful a dispensation from attending Mass this year.



Cardinal Cupich, our Archbishop, issued a decree dated Oct. 22, 2024 that states, "Given the unusual circumstances, I therefore issue this decree granting a dispensation that is in keeping with canon 87, Section 1 of the Code of Canon Law that a 'diocesan bishop, whenever he judges that it contributes to their spiritual good, is able to dispense the faithful from universal and particular disciplinary laws issued for his territory or his subjects by the supreme authority of the Church."

The Cardinal continues, "This decree establishes that the obligation linked to the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, which has been transferred to Monday, December 9, 2024, is hereby suppressed in the Archdiocese of Chicago. No member of the Catholic Faithful is obligated to attend Mass on December 9, 2024."


In short, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Monday, Dec. 9. This year, the Immaculate Conception is a Holy Day but not a Holy Day of Obligation. You are not required to attend Mass. The Blessed Mother is the Patroness of the Archdiocese of Chicago and of the United States under the title of the Immaculate Conception; all are encouraged to attend Mass that day. Our Mass times are 6:30 and 8:00 a.m.

Christmas is coming. What an exciting time of year. It is often a time when we come together as families and friends to celebrate the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ. Everyone is different and celebrates with different

people. Maybe it is grandparents who will come for Christmas, or perhaps a favorite aunt or uncle. I love it when company comes, don't you? I love it, but it also means that there is a lot of work to do. We wouldn't want our company to arrive and find our house in a mess, would we? No way! We have to mop the floors, vacuum the carpet, dust the furniture, clean the bathrooms, make sure the beds are all made, and make sure there aren't any dirty clothes laying around.

In the Gospel today, we read about a man named John who went into the country around the Jordan River preaching and telling people to prepare for the coming of the Lord. When John told people this, he did not mean that they should go home and clean and sweep the floors, or pick up their toys, or even make their beds. He meant that they should prepare their hearts. But how? How do you prepare your heart for the Lord? By repenting of their sins and turning toward God.

The bible tells us Jesus is coming again and, just as in the day of John the Baptist, it is important for us to make sure our hearts are clean and ready for the coming of the Lord. We do that by confessing our sins and asking God to forgive us. If we do that, the Bible tells us He will forgive us and make our hearts clean.

Cleaning a house isn't something you can do one time and forget it. It is something that we must do every day. If we kept our house clean all the time, it would not be such a big job to get ready for company. That same thing is true when it comes to keeping our hearts ready for Jesus' return. We can't ask God to forgive us one time and then go on our merry way. It is something we must do every day. We must spend time each day in prayer, reading the bible, and asking God for forgiveness for those things that keep us from being ready to welcome Jesus' return. Jesus is coming! This is so exciting; but first, there is some heart cleaning that must be done!

Let's Pray: Father, forgive us of the things that we do each day that are not pleasing to you. Make our hearts clean so that we will be ready for the return of Jesus. In His name we pray. Amen.








Hey, Kids! "Lamb Of God" Gift Basket Raffle

El Espiritu del Padre Frank

Hoy comenzamos el segundo domingo de Adviento. Dos velas parpadean en la corona de Adviento, recordándonos que la verdadera Luz del Mundo está llegando. Las lecturas de la semana pasada fueron bastante deprimentes, hablándonos sobre el fin de los tiempos y el juicio que vendrá sobre el mundo. Este fin de semana nos encontramos con Juan el Bautista, el profeta loco que viste piel de camello y huele a langostas y miel silvestre.

La misión de Juan era clara: preparar el camino para Jesús proclamando un bautismo de arrepentimiento para el perdón de los pecados. El arrepentimiento es una actitud esperanzadora: el reconocimiento de nuestros pecados y la promesa de cambiar nuestro modo de ser. Es esperanzadora porque Dios nos ofrece el don de la reconciliación y el perdón, la oportunidad de empezar de nuevo. Sólo hay un pequeño inconveniente: debemos admitir que hemos pecado. He notado que muchos católicos ya no tienen sentido del pecado. Creen que si "no han matado" a nadie, están bien con Dios.

Ya no aceptamos la responsabilidad por nuestras acciones o nuestras inacciones. En lugar de pedir perdón, pasamos incontables horas tratando de justificar nuestras acciones y demostrar que tenemos razón. Todos hemos pecado y todos necesitamos perdón y reconciliación. ¿Cuántas veces has oído decir: "No creo en la confesión"? ¿Podría ser nuestro orgullo el que habla? Supongo que sabemos más que Jesús, quien nos dio este regalo. ¿Por qué tenemos miedo y por qué nos negamos a aceptar este regalo de gracia? No hay mejor manera de prepararse para la venida de Cristo que confesarse y recibir el Sacramento de la Reconciliación. Si usted ha estado alejado del Sacramento por un tiempo, tal vez ahora sea el momento de volver a experimentar la alegría del abrazo de Dios. Lo invito a recibir el Sacramento de la Reconciliación durante el Adviento como una forma de prepararse para el nacimiento de Cristo en nuestros corazones y hogares.

Que tengamos el valer de reconocer nuestra pecaminosidad, arrepentirnos de nuestras acciones y recibir la gracia y la misericordia de Dios a través del Sacramento de la Reconciliación. Mientras rogamos por la misericordia de Dios, es importante que seamos misericordiosos unos con otros.

Las confesiones se escucharán el sábado 14 y 21 de diciembre, de 3:00 a 4:00 p.m. Además, habrá dos servicios de reconciliación con confesiones individuales el lunes 9 de diciembre a las 6:15 p.m. y el martes 10 de diciembre a las 6:15 p.m.

La Inmaculada Concepción

La Solemnidad de la Inmaculada Concepción de la Bienaventurada Virgen María se celebra el 8 de diciembre. Este año, el 8 de diciembre es domingo. Sin embargo, según el Código de Derecho Canónico, así como las Leyes Litúrgicas, el Segundo Domingo de Adviento tiene precedencia sobre la celebración de la Inmaculada Concepción. En consecuencia, la Solemnidad de la Inmaculada Concepción se traslada al lunes 9 de diciembre.

Existe cierta confusión sobre la Inmaculada Concepción: al caer en lunes es un Día Santo de Precepto. La respuesta correcta es sí, y sigue siendo un Día Santo de Precepto. Sin embargo, muchos obispos han concedido a sus fieles una dispensa de asistir a Misa este año. El Cardenal Cupich, nuestro Arzobispo, emitió un decreto con fecha del 22 de octubre de 2024, que establece: "Dadas las circunstancias inusuales, emito este decreto otorgando una dispensa que está de acuerdo con el canon 87, Sección 1 del Código de Derecho Canónico, de que un obispo diocesano, siempre que juzgue que contribuye a su bien espiritual, puede dispensar a los fieles de las leyes disciplinarias universales y particulares emitidas para su territorio o sus súbditos por la autoridad suprema de la Iglesia."

El Cardenal continúa: "Este decreto establece que la obligación vinculada a la Fiesta de la Inmaculada Concepción, que ha sido transferida al lunes 9 de diciembre de 2024, queda suprimida por la presente en la Arquidiócesis de Chicago. Ningún miembro de los fieles católicos está obligado a asistir a la Misa el 9 de diciembre de 2024."

En resumen, la Iglesia celebra la Solemnidad de la Inmaculada Concepción el lunes 9 de diciembre. Este año, la Inmaculada Concepción es un día sagrado, pero no un día de precepto. No es obligatorio asistir a Misa. La Santísima Madre es la Patrona de la Arquidiócesis de Chicago y de los Estados Unidos bajo el título de la Inmaculada Concepción; se anima a todos a asistir a Misa ese día. Nuestros horarios de misa son a las 6:30 y a las 8:00 a. m.
