Father Frank's Fire

Some of Jesus' teachings are difficult for us to accept. Sometimes we are tempted to simply dismiss them as being just too impossible to follow. Today's gospel lays the foundation for Christian love and charity - a teaching that is difficult, and yet one that is at the essence of who Christ is. Jesus tells us, "love your enemies, do good to those who hate you." This is preposterous - you have to be kidding - Jesus wants me to love those who would harm me?

Authentic Christian love is perplexing to our society. Society tells us that we must protect ourselves from our enemies, get them before they get you, and never place yourself in a vulnerable position. The scriptures tell us to do just the opposite. Christian love is a virtue – it is not something that we can readily attain without prayer, the proper disposition of our hearts or the grace of the Holy Spirit. This is where our actions speak louder than our words.

Why is this so important for us? The way we treat others is the same way that God would treat us. So many times, we rattle off prayers and we do not even understand the words we are saying. Did you know that in the "Our Father" we pray, "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us"? In our prayer, we ask God to forgive us as we forgive others. Therefore, if we forgive unconditionally, then we are asking God to forgive us unconditionally; if we refuse to forgive, then we ask God not to forgive us.

There are times when we feel it is impossible to forgive. Perhaps a spouse, family member, friend, neighbor, business associate or someone we admired betrayed us. We may have thought, "I will never forgive them for what they did to me!" Or "I'll show them how long I can stay angry." Or even "They will pay for what they did to me!" Ironically, when we hold on to our anger, the only one we hurt is ourselves. Anger often turns into bitterness, rage, resentment and revenge. These feelings keep stirring within us and can literally make us ill.

Jesus offers us a way out of this vicious cycle. The only way out is to forgive those who have hurt us. This is no easy task, and we cannot do it without God's grace. With God, all things are possible. We are approaching the Holy Season of Lent – perhaps this is the time to work on forgiving the person or persons who have hurt you – you know... the ones that you just cannot seem to forgive. There is an old hymn that puts today's gospel into simple words: "They will know we are Christians by our love." During this time, look to Jesus crucified. Jesus showed us that it could be done. He forgave those who beat and killed him. We should follow his example.

Eileen Cocco – The Face of Christ

Eileen Cocco, wife of Deacon Tony, passed away on Feb. 9, 2025. I am deeply saddened by her passing, as I know many of you are. Eileen dedicated her life to her family and to the parish family of St. Michael. Let us take comfort in the words of St. Paul in his first letter to the Corinthians:

"Behold, I tell you a mystery. We shall not all fall asleep, but, we will all be changed, in an instant, in the blink of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed...

'Death is swallowed up in victory. Where, O Death is your victory? Where, O Death is your sting?'

The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."



For the truth is that death does not have the final word. Life does because of the Cross and Resurrection of Jesus. Eileen believed this with her whole being, and while she endured the Cross of suffering, she always kept the faith.

Deacon Tony and Eileen were married for 66 years, and their partnership was not only in the home but also in their shared love of ministry here at St. Michael. Eileen began the Elizabeth Ministry, and she helped with baptisms and RCIA. She also was a Lector, Eucharistic Minister, and a Minister of Communion to the Homebound, to mention only a few of ministries that she was involved in.

Her only desire was to constantly give of herself. Eileen was an excellent listener who always took time to be present to people. A professional teacher by trade for 38 years, she also taught so many on how to be a disciple by her example. One of Eileen's favorite scripture passages is from the Book of the Prophet Micah, Chapter 6 Verse 8: "You have been told, O Mortal, what is good, and what the Lord requires of you: Only to do justice and to love goodness, and to walk humbly with your God." Eileen not only liked this scripture; she lived by it.

Please continue to pray for the repose of the soul of Eileen. Let us also pray for Tony her husband, their five children, their spouses and their 14 grandchildren. Thank you, Eileen, for being a true disciple of Christ and a true friend to many. Your love and life are a reflection of God's love for us. Thank you for sharing your gifts with us, and until we meet again, may God hold you in the palm of his hand. Our world is brighter and filled with more love and joy because of you. It goes without saying – you are already missed – we love you!



Have you ever had mercy on someone? Mercy is when you have compassion or forgiveness for someone who has wronged you in some way, and yet you choose to let it go

and move on. It sounds easy when you read it, but have you ever really tried? Have you loved someone when they are mean to you? Have you forgiven someone when they have hurt you? Have you given someone a gift without expecting something in return?

These all sound a little upside down and opposite of how most of us live. God wants me to love and forgive someone that has hurt me? He wants me to give without wanting something in return? How is that possible and why? Let's think about that. How do you feel when someone hurts you? Think about the emotions that you feel. Sad, angry, hurt are a few emotions that come to mind. Those are all emotions that make us feel down.

God doesn't want you to feel down; He wants you to feel up! It doesn't mean that we should allow people to hurt and take advantage of us. What it means is that we have the ability to control our feelings, and how we handle situations and people. Now think about the times you have been treated nicely, or been forgiven for doing something wrong, or given a gift without the giver wanting something back? How does THAT feel? What emotions do you feel? Happy, loved and grateful are what come to mind. Those are all positive feelings.

When people hurt us, it is incredibly hard to let it go. But when we react with LOVE and MERCY – it helps us heal and to feel good. It is ok to feel ALL the emotions listed – but how we act is what is most important.

Imagine this: A little girl hits a little boy. The little boy hits her back. She hits him again. He hits her back again. This cycle continues on and on, and they just end up crying because they are both hurt. Now imagine this: A little girl hits a boy. The boy says, "Please stop. I care about you. Don't treat me like that. Be nice." And he gives her a hug. It's safe to think that the little girl would stop her bad behavior. But the main thing is that the little boy stopped the cycle of being mean. He chose to be kind, patient and loving. He chose to act like Jesus.

Let's remember to say this prayer: "Gentle and loving God, help me to be patient, kind and loving at all times, just like you are with me. Help me to forgive those that have hurt me – just like you forgive me when I hurt you. Thank you for always having mercy on me. I love you, Jesus!"







El Espiritu del Padre Frank

Algunas de las enseñanzas de Jesús nos resultan difíciles de aceptar. A veces, nos sentimos tentados a descartarlas por considerarlas imposibles de seguir. El evangelio de hoy sienta las bases del amor y la caridad cristiana, una enseñanza difícil pero que, sin embargo, está en la esencia de Cristo. Jesús nos dice: "Amen a sus enemigos, hagan el bien a quienes los odian". Esto es absurdo; ¿es broma? ¿Jesús quiere que ame a quienes me harían daño?

El amor cristiano auténtico desconcierta a nuestra sociedad. La sociedad nos dice que debemos protegernos de nuestros enemigos, vencerlos antes de que ellos nos venzan a nosotros y nunca ponernos en una posición vulnerable. Las Escrituras nos dicen que hagamos exactamente lo contrario. El amor cristiano es una virtud; no es algo que podamos alcanzar fácilmente sin la oración, la disposición apropiada de nuestro corazón o la gracia del Espíritu Santo. Aquí es donde nuestras acciones hablan más que nuestras palabras.

¿Por qué es esto tan importante para nosotros? La manera en que tratamos a los demás es la misma manera en que Dios nos trataría a nosotros. Tantas veces, recitamos oraciones que ni siquiera entendemos las palabras que decimos. ¿Sabías que en el Padrenuestro oramos: "Perdona nuestras ofensas como también nosotros perdonamos a quienes nos ofenden"? En nuestra oración, le pedimos a Dios que nos perdone como nosotros perdonamos a los demás. Por lo tanto, si perdonamos incondicionalmente, le pedimos a Dios que nos perdone incondicionalmente; si nos negamos a perdonar, le pedimos a Dios que no nos perdone.

Hay momentos en los que nos parece imposible perdonar. Tal vez un cónyuge, un familiar, un amigo, un vecino, un socio o alguien a quien admirábamos nos traicionó. Tal vez hayamos pensado: "¡Nunca los perdonaré por lo que me hicieron!". "Les mostraré cuánto tiempo puedo permanecer enojados". "¡Pagarán por lo que me hicieron!". Irónicamente, cuando nos aferramos a nuestra ira, el único al que lastimamos es a nosotros mismos. La ira a menudo se convierte en amargura, rabia, resentimiento y venganza. Estos sentimientos siguen agitándose dentro de nosotros y literalmente pueden enfermarnos.

Jesús nos ofrece una salida de este círculo vicioso. La única salida es perdonar a quienes nos han hecho daño. No es una tarea fácil y no podemos hacerlo sin la gracia de Dios. Con Dios, todo es posible. Nos estamos acercando a la Santa Cuaresma; tal vez sea el momento de trabajar en perdonar a la persona o personas que te han hecho daño; ya sabes, a aquellas a las que parece que no puedes perdonar. Hay un antiguo himno que expresa el evangelio de hoy en palabras sencillas: "Sabrán que somos cristianos por nuestro amor". Durante este tiempo, miremos a Jesús crucificado. Jesús nos mostró que se podía hacer. Perdonó a quienes lo golpearon y lo mataron. Debemos seguir su ejemplo.

Eileen Cocco – El rostro de Cristo

Eileen Cocco, esposa del diácono Tony, falleció el 9 de febrero de 2025. Estoy profundamente entristecido por su fallecimiento, como sé que muchos de ustedes lo están. Eileen dedicó su vida a su familia y a la familia parroquial de St. Mochael. Encontremos consuelo en las palabras de San Pablo en su primera carta a los Corintios:

"Presten atención, que les voy a contar un misterio: No todos moriremos, pero todos seremos transformados en un instante, en un abrir y cerrar de ojos, cuando suene la trompeta final. Pues la trompeta sonará, y los muertos serán resucitados incorruptibles, y nosotros seremos transformados...

'La muerte es devorada por la victoria.

¿Dónde, oh muerte, está tu victoria?

¿Dónde, oh muerte, está tu aguijón?'

Ya que el aguijón de la muerte es el pecado, y la potencia del pecado, la ley. Mas á Dios gracias, que nos da la victoria por el Señor nuestro."



La verdad es que la muerte no tiene la última palabra, la tiene la vida, gracias a la cruz y la resurrección de Jesús. Eileen lo creyó con todo su ser y, aunque soportó la cruz del sufrimiento, siempre mantuvo la fe.

El diácono Tony y Eileen estuvieron casados durante 66 años y su relación no se limitaba solo al hogar, sino también a su amor compartido por el ministerio aquí en St. Michael. Ella inició el Ministerio Elizabeth, ayudó con los bautismos, RCIA, lectora, ministra Eucarística, ministra de la Comunión y con los confinados en el hogar, por mencionar solo algunos ministerios en los que participó.

Su único deseo era entregarse constantemente. Era una excelente escuchando y siempre se tomaba el tiempo para estar presente con las personas. Profesora de profesión durante 38 años, también enseñó a muchos cómo ser discípulos con su ejemplo. Uno de los pasajes bíblicos favoritos de Eileen es del Libro del Profeta Miqueas, capítulo 6, versículo 8: "Se te ha dicho, oh hombre, lo que es bueno y lo que el Señor exige de ti: solamente practicar la justicia, amar la bondad y humillarte ante tu Dios". A Eileen no solo le gustaba este pasaje bíblico, sino que vivía según él.

Por favor, sigan rezando por el descanso del alma de Eileen. Oremos también por Tony, su esposo, sus cinco hijos, sus esposas y sus 14 nietos. Gracias, Eileen, por ser una verdadera discípula de Cristo y una verdadera amiga para muchos. Tu amor y tu vida son un reflejo del amor de Dios por nosotros. Gracias por compartir tus dones con nosotros y, hasta que nos volvamos a encontrar, que Dios te sostenga en la palma de su mano. Nuestro mundo es más brillante y está lleno de más amor y alegría gracias a ti.No hace falta decirlo, !ya te extrañamos, te amamos!
