Father Frank's Fire

In today's gospel, Jesus transfigured before Peter, James and John. His garments became dazzling white and Jesus changed before their eyes. On the mountain, Jesus showed his disciples his glory. What is important for us to remember is that Jesus' glory is also our destiny. Jesus invites us to share his glory and to be a part of the divine life.



The white garment Jesus wears is the same white garment of our baptism. For it is through the waters of baptism that we are made clean and original sin is washed away. Lent provides us with the opportunity to keep our baptismal robes a dazzling white. Please do not let these 40 days pass without performing some acts of penitence. By spending some time in prayer and receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation, you can have your robes ready for Easter glory.

Never be afraid of seeking God's forgiveness. Our God loves us so much and forgives those who seek it with sincerity of heart. Be open to God's grace this Lent and you will be amazed at how your life will be changed. You will be transformed into the image and likeness of

Christ. Our parish reconciliation services are Monday and Tuesday of this week beginning at 6:15PM.

Baptismal Gown

We are clothed with a beautiful white garment on the day of our baptism. On the day of our Funeral Mass, we are covered with the funeral pall that represents our baptismal robes. Funeral practices have been changing worldwide. Some families choose not to have a wake and some chosoe not to have a Funeral Mass.

Recently, Fathers Geofrey, Daniel and I have noticed a disturbing trend. We are called to anoint someone that is dying but we never hear from the family again. I have begun to check the internet for the names of those who we have anointed and, to my dismay, realized that they had passed away but did not have a Funeral Mass. Many had a wake and then a burial. Sometimes, a faithful Catholic who never missed Mass does not receive a Funeral Mass simply because their children do not practice the faith.

When we are baptized, we are brought into a sacred place (Church) and baptized into the mystery of Christ's death and resurrection. This gives us the promise of eternal life. It is only appropriate that when we reach the end of our earthly life, we return to a sacred place to give thanks as we await the resurrection.

The Funeral Mass is for our salvation. The Funeral Mass is about Jesus Christ. The promise of Jesus Christ is a powerful message of hope. As Catholics, we believe that what happened to Jesus in His resurrection from the dead will also happen to us. The Funeral Mass places an emphasis on God's saving work through Jesus. The Mass is a special moment — a sacred moment in a sacred place that entrusts the deceased into God's loving and merciful hands.

The Mass should be the center of all of our lives, and it is at Mass that we look forward to the heavenly banquet. There we are united with God, the saints and all who share eternal life. The Funeral Mass is your right as a Catholic.

It does not matter if you choose a traditional burial or a cremation — what matters is that you have a Funeral Mass. Please inform your children or another loved one of your wishes to have a Funeral Mass. In my many years as a priest, I have presided over large and small funerals. It does not matter if your children do not practice the faith. The Funeral Mass is not for them — it is for the salvation of your soul.

2nd Sunday of Lent February 25, 2024

Today's second reading assures us that nothing can take us from the love of God. God is

on our side, and we have nothing to fear. *Absolutely nothing* can separate us from the love of God, and the hope it brings to all people.

Today's gospel from Mark recounts a strange and wondrous event that we call the transfiguration. Three apostles experience first-hand the glory of Jesus, God in our midst. Jesus' transformation was so mysterious that the apostles did not understand what had happened until after the resurrection. At first glance, the transfiguration may seem too strange and far from the ordinary to take seriously. But if you think about it, it is not so odd that Jesus would reveal himself in this way.

The risen Christ comes to us today in a host of different ways, and is with us every time we come to our Church for liturgy, listen to the scriptures, hear them unpacked by the priest, encounter Christ in the Eucharist and in each other.

Jesus is with us as we go back out to our homes, schools, jobs and countless activities. His Holy Spirit is with us as we face each day—the good and the bad. Jesus went beyond the tragedy of the crucifixion bringing His compassionate love and healing and the reconciliation of humanity with God. Jesus' death and resurrection continue to bring hope into our lives and into our world.

- The apostles saw a little bit of the glory of the heavenly God. How do I experience the glory of Jesus in this day and age?
- What seems impossible for me at this moment? How can/does Jesus' presence in my life get me through the day? When do I feel separated from the love of God? What can I do about it?

In today's Gospel, it says that Jesus transfigured (or changed before their eyes) into something more beautiful. Jesus was speaking to Moses and Elijah (people believed Moses

represented the law, and that Elijah represented the prophets, or those who called people to change). So, for Peter, John and James to see people who were no longer alive talking to Jesus, it meant that Jesus was no ordinary man. Then, we are told, a cloud floated by and God's voice came from the cloud saying to them, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him."

When I read the bible, sometimes I take a step back and think about it, or I reflect on it. This is one of those moments. God is present all over the bible, but when He speaks, we know he is going to be something very important, and we should stop and listen!

God had the chance to say whatever He wanted in this moment, and he chose to tell the apostles, and us, to listen to his Son, Jesus. God is telling us that he has sent someone special—his Son—to guide us in our daily lives. If we follow Jesus, we will continue to live according to God's laws. When Moses and Elijah who were very important people appeared with Jesus, it helped people to believe and feel safe that the voice those three men heard was truly God and the right thing to do was to follow Jesus.

We live in a world that can be so confusing. We see so much heartache all around us. It can be very sad to watch the news, at times. It can also be hard to hear stories about recent heartaches or about times when someone we love or trust hurts us.

How do we get past all of this sadness and darkness? When people don't follow God's commandments or break His laws, they hurt others and they hurt their relationship with God. We know that God loves us no matter what – but we need to do our part to follow His commandments. We should put our faith in God, listen to Jesus and try our best to act like him. If we do, we will be free of sin! We must open our eyes, set our sights on Jesus and pray for those that do not know who Jesus is.

Let's close our eyes for a moment. Take a deep breath and imagine being on that high mountain where Jesus appeared to Peter, John and James. Imagine Jesus transfiguring before your eyes. Imagine the peace that filled the hearts of those that saw it. Let that peace fill your heart and soul.

Let us pray: May the grace of the Lord Jesus be with everyone. Be kind...be like Jesus!





Recientemente, los padres Geofrey, Daniel y yo hemos notado una tendencia inquietante. Somos llamados a ungir a alguien que está muriendo pero nunca volvemos a saber de la familia. Comencé a buscar en Internet los nombres de aquellos que hemos ungido y, para mi consternación, me di cuenta de que habían fallecido pero no tuvieron una misa de funeral. Muchos tuvieron un velorio y luego un entierro. A veces, un católico fiel, que nunca faltó a Misa, no recibe una Misa de funeral simplemente porque sus hijos no practican la fe.


