FR. FRANK'S FIRE



Today Jesus tells us, “*you are the light of the world.*” We are the ones that must shine before others. WHAT LIGHT, you may be asking. Well each of us is created in the image and likeness of God. Somewhere deep in each one of us, there is the image of God. It is there waiting for us to discover its power and goodness. This is God’s gift to us. We can however, eclipse our own light, obscure it, or even try to hide it. Then we miss part of our calling, for the light that is not to be used exclusively for our own benefit. It is for the benefit of the entire world. “*Just so, your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father.*”

We are always in need of true light. Our world is filled with darkness and we need the Light of Christ to guide us through it. We are light and can help others find their way. I often speak about the Paschal Candle (Easter) at Mass. This candle is brought into a darkened Church at the Easter Vigil. This candle represents the Light of Christ that has come to dispel the darkness of the world. From this one candle – all present light

their candles – and the church is washed in light – the true Light of the world.

We are asked to demonstrate God’s love to others and set the example for all to see. Isaiah reminds us to “*Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked when you see them.*” What we do and how we do it is very important. Our actions tell others who we are and what we believe. Do your actions tell others that you belong to Christ? The message of today’s gospel can be summed up in one line of a favorite children’s song, This Little Light of Mine: “*Let it shine, let it shine, let it shine!*” Do not be afraid – let your light shine for all to see.

HEY KIDS! *This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine!* We are all familiar with this song. We hear it in school, church, home, television and it is very popular and a joyful song to sing along to. When we sing

this song, we can even add hand gestures and dance movements to make it even more joyful. The LIGHT they talk about isn't a light that you would find in a dark room or the brightness of the sun. We know they are talking about the LIGHT that is within each and every one of us. How do we know this? The song continues on to say, *Jesus gave it to me, I'm gonna let it shine.* From the moment we are blessed with life, there is a LIGHT that is sparked! This LIGHT is what God has instilled in each of us. Each of us is here today because of the one-of-a-kind SPARK or LIGHT that makes each one of us different from everyone else and it is a blessing from God. Jesus tells us in the Gospel of Matthew, "Your light must shine before others, so that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father." Jesus knew that God gave us all the ability to do wonderful things. He wanted us to know that we were in charge of helping people see our LIGHT. When you try your best to live your life like Jesus - it shows. People are watching you and when they see that you are short to anger and rich with kindness, you are acting in the way Jesus has taught you! One of Jesus' fears was that we would waste our beautiful light. He said when we have light from a lamp, we want to put it out on a table so that it can fill the room with light. However, if we put a lamp under a table, it will not be able to give us the bright light that we need for a dark room. Remember, the LIGHT He is talking about is not a light from a lamp but the LIGHT in us. We need to use our wonderful gifts and share them with others. Today the Prophet Isaiah tells us to share our bread with the hungry, help the homeless and do other good deeds. It goes on to say that when we help others, the LIGHT within us will shine! Helping others is a way to let our LIGHT shine so others can see. When people see our LIGHT, it may inspire them to want to share their LIGHT too! Our gifts are all different. If you are good in math, you can help someone who is having a hard time with math and share your gift of knowledge. If you are good at a sport, you can offer to play with someone that may not be as good as you are. Sharing your gifts can be done in a number of different ways. Think about the times that you do help others in need. What is a feeling that you get when you do a nice deed? Most of us feel GOOD feelings when we do good deeds. The reason for that is simple. Our LIGHT is shining brightly; a good deed will always make you feel good! When we behave badly, our light dims and it makes us feel sad or down. We must try our best to keep the LIGHT bright and show others that we are God's children!

Let us pray: God, my Father, please help me to remember to take my LIGHT everywhere I go because Jesus gave it to me and I want to let it shine!





Hoy, Jesús nos dice: “Ustedes son la luz del mundo.” Somos nosotros quienes debemos brillar ante los demás. ¿QUÉ LUZ?, se reguntarán. Pues bien, cada uno de nosotros ha sido creado a imagen y semejanza de Dios. En lo más profundo de cada uno de nosotros reside la imagen de Dios. Está allí, esperando que descubramos su poder y su bondad. Este es el don de Dios para nosotros. Sin embargo, podemos eclipsar nuestra propia luz, oscurecerla o incluso intentar esconderla. Entonces, perdemos parte de nuestra vocación, pues la luz no debe usarse exclusivamente para nuestro propio beneficio. Es para el beneficio del mundo entero. “Así también, que brille la luz de ustedes ante los demás, para que vean sus buenas obras y glorifiquen a su Padre celestial.”

Se nos pide que demos el amor de Dios a los demás y que seamos un ejemplo para todos. Isaías nos recuerda: “Comparte tu pan con el hambriento, da refugio al oprimido y al desamparado; viste al desnudo cuando lo veas.” Lo que hacemos y cómo lo hacemos es muy importante. Nuestras acciones revelan a los demás quiénes somos y en qué creemos. ¿Reflejan tus acciones que perteneces a Cristo? El mensaje del evangelio de hoy se puede resumir en una frase de una conocida canción infantil: “¡This Little Light of Mine: “Let it shine, let it shine, let it shine!” No tengas miedo: deja que tu luz brille para que todos la vean.

CUARESMA

La Cuaresma es un tiempo litúrgico de preparación en la Iglesia Católica que dura 40 días, desde el Miércoles de Ceniza hasta antes del Jueves Santo. Es un camino espiritual que nos prepara para la Semana Santa y la Pascua, que es la celebración más importante de la fe cristiana: la Resurrección de Jesús.

¿Por qué existe la Cuaresma?

La Iglesia la instituyó para ayudar a los cristianos a convertir el corazón, es decir, a volver a Dios con más sinceridad. Tiene raíces muy antiguas, inspiradas en la Biblia: Jesús ayunó 40 días en el desierto antes de comenzar su misión (Mt 4,1-11). Los 40 años del pueblo de Israel en el desierto, tiempo de prueba y purificación. Los 40 días de Moisés y Elías en encuentro profundo con Dios. El número 40, en la Biblia, simboliza prueba, purificación y preparación.

¿Para qué sirve la Cuaresma?

La Cuaresma existe para que el creyente: Revise su vida y su relación con Dios y con los demás. Reconozca sus errores y pida perdón. Se prepare interiormente para vivir la Pascua con un corazón renovado. Por eso es un tiempo más sobrio, reflexivo y penitencial.
