and followed him. - Lk 5:10-11


Father Frank's Fire

In today's gospel, we are introduced to the first disciples. We meet Simon the fisherman. It seems that Simon knows two things: he knows how to fish properly and he knows that he is a sinner. When Jesus entered into Simon's boat, things began to change. Simon realized that Jesus can catch fish and that Jesus has forgiven Simon. Simon, James and John get out of their boats, leave their nets behind and begin to follow Jesus – they are now to be fishers of men and women.

I think that Jesus desires to get into our boats. Of course, I am writing metaphorically. ***Jesus desires to be a part of our lives.*** Just as Jesus showed Simon how to fish, so too does Jesus show us how to live. We, just as Simon, realize that we are sinners and are not worthy to be in the presence of Jesus. Yet Jesus does not leave us. He instead forgives us and helps us along the path of life to leave our sinful past behind and begin to live anew.

Isaiah also realizes that he is unworthy. He is filled with fear until God purifies his lips with an ember, a cleansing fire. Once purified, Isaiah can now proclaim God's Word and, when he hears that God is looking for a messenger, he quickly volunteers, "*Here I am, send me!*" God called; Isaiah answered.

Just as Jesus called the disciples by name, so too does he call us. We are called by name and asked to become fishers of men and women. Our calling from Jesus is unique to all of us. Some are called to be parents; some healers; some teachers; some priests, deacons or religious; and some are called to live in the world and to give witness to Christ by the way they live their lives. Let us not hide from our calling but instead embrace it. ***May we leave our nets behind and follow in the footsteps of Christ.***



Jubilee of Hope – Pilgrims of Hope

St. Michael is a designated pilgrimage site for the 2025 Jubilee of Hope. For centuries, indulgences were granted by the Church during Holy Years. An indulgence is a remission of the temporal punishment a person is due for their sins. Why are indulgences important? Pope Francis writes, "Every sin leaves its mark. Sin has consequences, not only outwardly in the effects of the wrong we do, but also inwardly, inasmuch as every sin, even venial, entails an unhealthy attachment to creatures, which must be purified either here on earth, or after death, in the state called Purgatory." In this, the Holy Father quoted the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Cardinal Angelo De Donatis, the head of the Apostolic Penitentiary, a Vatican court that deals with the granting of indulgences, wrote that a person, "moved by a spirit of charity," is "purified through the sacrament of penance and refreshed by Holy Communion," and prays for the pope and makes a pilgrimage, is able to obtain from the treasury of the Church a plenary indulgence with the remission and forgiveness of their sins.

What are the requirements to obtain this plenary indulgence?

- Visit a designated Jubilee pilgrimage site. St. Michael is one of those sites.
- Sacramental Confession before or after visiting the designated pilgrimage site.
- Receive the Eucharist at Mass – before, during or after visiting a pilgrimage site.
- Make a profession of faith and offer prayers for the Holy Father's intentions. This can be fulfilled by reciting the Apostles' or Nicene Creed, and praying an Our Father and a Hail Mary for the pope's intentions.

A visit is more than just walking into the Church. A visit to a designated pilgrimage site should include some time in prayer and adoration before the Lord present in the tabernacle of the Church or the Adoration Chapel.



Have you ever gone fishing? It can be very relaxing to sit by the quiet water, away from noise or distractions. Once you feel a pull at the fishing pole, it can be very exciting to see what it is you are going to catch! Now, if this was your job – it may not be so relaxing because if you don't catch fish, it would mean that you would not eat or get paid.

Now imagine that you are out all day fishing and you catch nothing. It is the end of the day and all you want to do is rest and try again tomorrow. It can be so disappointing. This is what happened to Simon. He had been out all-day fishing and had already started to clean off his net. He was done. Then Jesus comes by and tells him to lower his net for a catch. Simon tries to explain to Jesus that he's been out fishing all day and has been unsuccessful, but Jesus still commands him to lower the nets.

When they lowered the nets, they caught a great number of fish. So many fish that the nets were going to burst open! When Simon realized that it was Jesus that made this happen, he fell to his knees and realized that he was wrong to doubt Jesus. However, Jesus was not upset with Simon. He said, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." From that moment on, they left everything and followed Jesus.

What does it mean when Jesus said that they would be "catching men?" It meant that Simon and the fisherman were now going to speak the Word of God and have people come to listen. If people listened to what they had to say, the people would begin to follow Jesus and his ways. For every person that did not know God, Simon and the other fishermen who became Jesus' disciples, would reach out to other people to get them to follow Jesus.

As a parent, sometimes I wonder if my own children understand what I try to explain to them about our beautiful religion. It can feel like fishing. We pray at meals, go to church and do volunteer work but *do my children really get it?* I feel like a fisherman waiting to see my hard work in action. Are my kids well-behaved, kind and forgiving? When I see them act like Jesus – that is a fish in my net. When I see them talk about God or pray without me having to ask, that is another fish for my net. I know that they will be great fishermen of men! You can too! Keep praying and learning about God and you will be a wonderful disciple.

Let's Pray: Dear God, help us to help guide people into your Light. Amen.



Dios llamó, Isaías respondió.

Así como Jesús llamó a los discípulos por su nombre, también nos llama a nosotros. Somos llamados por nuestro nombre y nos pide que nos convirtamos en pescadores de hombres y mujeres. Nuestro llamado de Jesús es único para todos nosotros. Algunos están llamados a ser padres, algunos sanadores, algunos maestros, algunos sacerdotes, diáconos o religiosos y algunos están llamados a vivir en el mundo y dar testimonio de Cristo con la forma en que viven sus vidas. No nos escondamos de nuestro llamado, sino que lo abracemos. Dejemos atrás nuestras redes y sigamos los pasos de Cristo.

Jubileo de esperanza - Peregrinos de la esperanza

St. Michael es un lugar de peregrinación designado para el Jubileo de la Esperanza de 2025. Durante siglos, la Iglesia ha concedido indulgencias durante los Años Santos. Una indulgencia es una remisión de la pena temporal que se le debe a una persona por sus pecados. ¿Por qué son importantes las indulgencias? El Papa Francisco escribe: "Todo pecado deja su huella. El pecado tiene consecuencias, no sólo externas, en los efectos del mal que se comete, sino también internamente, en cuanto que todo pecado, incluso venial, lleva un apego malsano a las criaturas, que debe ser purificado ya sea aquí en la tierra o después de la muerte, en el estado llamado Purgatorio". En esto, el Santo Padre citó el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica.

El cardenal Angelo De Donatis, jefe de la Penitenciaría Apostólica, el tribunal vaticano que se ocupa de la concesión de indulgencias, escribió que una persona, "movida por un espíritu de caridad", es "purificada mediante el sacramento de la penitencia y refrescada por la Sagrada Comunión" y reza por el Papa y hace una peregrinación, puede obtener del tesoro de la Iglesia una indulgencia plenaria con la remisión y el perdón de sus pecados.

¿Cuáles son los requisitos para obtener esta indulgencia plenaria?

- Visita un lugar de peregrinación conmemorativo del Jubileo. San Miguel es uno de esos lugares.
- Confesión sacramental antes o después de visitar el lugar de peregrinación designado.
- Recibir la Eucaristía en la Misa, antes, durante o después de visitar un lugar de peregrinación.
- Hacer una profesión de fe y ofrecer oraciones por las intenciones del Santo Padre. Esto se puede hacer rezando el Credo de los Apóstoles o el Credo Niceno, rezando un Padrenuestro y un Avemaría por las intenciones del Papa.

Una visita es más que simplemente entrar en la Iglesia. Una visita a un lugar de peregrinación designado debe incluir un tiempo de oración y adoración ante el Señor presente en el Sagrario de la Iglesia o en la Capilla de Adoración.
