

Father Frank's Fire

Our Christmas celebration is now over. Last week we celebrated the Baptism of the Lord. The Christmas trees, lights, wreaths and Nativity crèche have been taken down and stored away. Our Church has returned to its beautiful simplicity. We once again enter Ordinary Time. The vestments are green – reminding us that God is present not only in the high and low points, but also in the ordinary events in our lives. We shall continue to observe Ordinary Time until the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday, March 5, 2025.

Today's second reading reminds us that there are various kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit. Each of us has been given a unique gift – a gift that only we have. This spiritual gift is not meant only for us, but it is meant for others. I think we can all agree that it would be tragic if a doctor gifted with healing chose not to practice. It would be unfortunate if a teacher gifted with the ability to work with young students and is effective in their lives chose not to teach at all. Sometimes we do not recognize our own gifts and we need the help of others to point them out.

I urge you to discern the gifts that you have been given. Pray and ask God how you are to use your gifts. Not using a God-given gift is the same as throwing a gift away. How would you feel after searching for weeks for the perfect Christmas gift – and the recipient opened it, looked at it and then tossed it into the trash? You would feel anger and disappointment. How must God feel when we carelessly choose not to share our gifts? Remember the gifts that have been given to us are not meant only for us, but they are meant for the benefit of others. *Choose to share your spiritual gifts with others today!*

The Wedding Feast at Cana

Our gospel today is the Wedding at Cana and here Jesus performs his first miracle. It seems that at the feast they ran out of wine. Not having a generous supply of wine at a wedding would have been a tremendous embarrassment for the bride and groom, and their families. Mary intercedes and tells Jesus of the dilemma. Jesus completely seems uninterested in the entire situation, but Mary has faith and tells the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Jesus changes simple water into wine.


This is not only a miracle, but it also is a sign. Wine is a symbol of a banquet, a celebration, a party. This is a sign of baptism. Jesus uses ordinary water and turns it into wine – signifying how the waters of baptism change us so that we can enter the great celebration of the heavenly kingdom – the banquet of life. We are changed into something greater – from sinful humanity to children of God.

Anniversary

January 22 marks the 52nd anniversary of the United States Supreme Court's decision on Roe v. Wade, a decision that led to legalizing abortion in the United States. This decision marked the beginning of a dark period for people of faith.

On June 24, 2022, the United States Supreme Court overturned the Roe v. Wade decision that made access to an abortion a federal right in the United States. People of faith rejoiced, but this decision did not end abortion. It allows the various States to pass their own laws. This can be considered a victory for Respect Life advocates, but it is a victory in a battle – there is still work to be done.

There are many who have suffered emotional scars because of an abortion. The Archdiocese of Chicago offers a program call Project Rachel that helps those suffering from emotional and spiritual scars of abortion.



This program is confidential and free. Project Rachel provides post-abortion healing for mothers, fathers, grandparents and others. Through this program the Church reaches out and offers healing and support to those broken by abortion. If you would like more information about Project Rachel, call 312-337-1962. The Church does not abandon but seeks to bring healing and reconciliation with this wonderful ministry.

It is easy to say, "I am Pro-Life." The gospel challenges us not only to talk the talk – but also to walk the walk. That means we, as a society, need to help provide for those who cannot take proper care of themselves or their children. Let us commit ourselves to helping spread a culture of life in our world. Let us ask God for the strength and the grace to accept the Church's teaching on the consistent ethic of life. Let God be God – and we can be his servants treasuring one of the greatest gifts we have – LIFE!

A Jubilee of Hope

Pope Francis has declared a Jubilee Year. The Jubilee Year runs from Dec. 29, 2024 to Dec. 28, 2025. It is the Jubilee of Hope and we are all on a pilgrimage of hope. Jubilee Years are special years of grace and forgiveness; they are years set aside to encourage us to seek God's mercy, to renew the focus on our spiritual life or even go on a journey – even within our parish boundaries.

Cardinal Cupich opened the Jubilee Year locally by celebrating Mass at the Cathedral of the Holy Name. Throughout the year, all are invited to participate in the Jubilee by visiting designated pilgrimage sites. The Archdiocese of Chicago has designated 24 churches and missions as pilgrimage sites and St. Michael has been designated as one of those sites.

Pope Francis has granted special indulgences to the faithful who observe and take part in the celebration of the Jubilee by visiting locations that have been designated as pilgrimage sites. The indulgence is a gift of divine mercy. More information about the Jubilee Year and about the indulgences will be forthcoming in future bulletins. Additional events to celebrate the Jubilee will also be listed as they are planned.

Have you ever just flipped through a newspaper? I realize modern times has many of us reading the news from our phones, but the newspaper is a reliable source that is available, no matter if you have wi-fi or not. The

newspaper often reports on good news, bad news, sports, weather, stories and more. It is a great way to keep up with what's happening in the world around us.

The Bible is a lot like a newspaper. It gives reports from moments in history and tells stories of things that happened a long time ago. What if we read the Gospel was an article in today like it daily newspaper? Today's story is from the Gospel of John. The word Gospel means "Good News," so let's imagine that we are reading an article from the Daily Galilean or The Jerusalem Times. Listen to this headline: "Wedding Guest Turns Water Into Wine." Wow! That sounds interesting; let's read the rest of this story!

On Tuesday, a woman named Mary was in Cana to attend a wedding. A large number of guests, including her son, a man named Jesus, also attended the wedding. Guests at the wedding were reportedly having a good time until the host ran out of wine. At that point, it seemed that the happy celebration might turn into a disaster. Some of the wedding guests thought that perhaps Jesus might have a solution to the problem, so they reported to Him that they were out of wine. When told about the problem, Jesus at first seemed unwilling to do anything, but after some encouragement from His mother, He finally agreed to help.

Eyewitnesses at the wedding reported that Jesus noticed several large water jars nearby and instructed some servants to fill them with water. After the jars had been filled with water, He told them to dump some of the water out of the jars and take them to the man in charge of serving the wine. When the wine steward tasted the water, he discovered it had been turned into wine. Wedding guests were amazed at the turn of events and said that the wine was the best they had ever tasted. As a result of this miraculous event, many people are following Jesus everywhere He goes, and many believe that He even is the long-awaited Messiah.

Well that made a pretty good news story, didn't it? Do you know what is great about this story? Just as Jesus performed a miracle by changing water into wine at the wedding celebration more than 2,000 years ago, He is still working miracles in the hearts and lives of people today. If you will let Him, He will work a miracle in you and you can share with those around you.

Let's Pray: Dear Jesus, work a miracle in all of us today. Amen.



Dear Father Frank and St. Michael Parishioners,



2024 was a very busy year for the St. Vincent DePaul Society. Because of your wonderful generosity, we were able to help 15 families with rent and mortgage payments, 13 families to avoid shut-off of utilities and 40 families to receive huge gifts of food for Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas. There were also requests for things like car repair and home health needs. We

invite people who ask to come into our pantry regularly to choose food to help them through tight times.

You probably don't realize just how generous you are as a group. We are the recipients of the collections taken at Mass on Holy Thursday and Thanksgiving. We deposit an amazing amount of money from the four poor boxes near each of the entrances and by the pantry. We also receive several thousands of dollars from personal charitable foundations and random checks left in the St. Vincent de Paul mail box in the office. This doesn't include the grocery and gas cards from the Easter crosses and the Giving Tree at Christmas. Our pantry is kept full by parishioners who leave grocery bags filled with basic canned and boxed goods on a regular basis.

The St. Michael Student Council, the Teen Ministry, Quest families and Religious Education Families keep our pantry full with regular food drives and provide Easter baskets and Christmas gifts for kids. The Knights of Columbus generously deliver large checks and purchase winter coats for kids in the families we help. Jewel Osco (131st and LaGrange) and Richard's Building Supply provide Holiday meals and Longhorn Steak House shares frozen meat for our freezer through a corporate "Harvest" program. We also work in concert with the General Assistance Office at Orland Park Township and together, we are able to fill the needs of many families in need.

The list of what we receive — and are therefore able to disperse to people looking for help — seems endless. At the top of that list is YOU!! We thank you and continue to pray for you. We hope that 2025 is a happy and healthy year for you and that you will continue to help bring comfort to your neighbors.

Nuestra celebración de Navidad ya terminó. La semana pasada, celebramos el Bautismo del Señor. Continuaremos observando el Tiempo Ordinario hasta el comienzo de la Cuaresma, el Miércoles de Ceniza, el 5 de marzo de 2025.

Sentirías ira y decepción. ¿Cómo debe sentirse Dios cuando decidimos descuidadamente no compartir nuestros dones? Recuerda que los dones que se nos han dado no son solo para nosotros, sino para el beneficio de los demás. ¡Decide compartir tus dones espirituales con los demás hoy mismo!

Jesús parece completamente desinteresado en toda la situación, pero María tiene fe y les dice a los sirvientes: "Hagan lo que Él les diga". Jesús convierte el agua simple en vino.
