
THEY WERE OVERJOYED AT SEEING THE CONSTRUCTION

MATTHEW 2:10

Father Frank's Fire

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, and epiphany simply means revelation. We celebrate the revelation that Jesus Christ is the true Light of the World, and that salvation is meant for everyone and not just a select few. The Epiphany of the Lord is God's revelation to the Gentiles that Jesus is the Savior of the world. The wise men presented gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. These were not ordinary gifts, but gifts fit for a king. The wise men from the East represent us — the Gentiles — recognizing Jesus as our Lord, Savior and King. Jesus is the only star that we should follow because once we find Christ, we have found what we are truly longing for -- the only One who can bring us fulfillment and joy.

I pray that we all recognize Jesus as our Savior. Let us make a commitment today to follow the true Star – the true Light of the World – Jesus Christ. Our world is filled with so many lights that are contrary to the gospel. These lights give us the illusion that we are safe. The world's lights are often brighter and



more appealing to our senses than the gentle and tender light of faith. So many prefer the lights of the world because there is no challenge or call to conversion. In the end, all of the world's lights will burn out and turn to dust, leaving those who trusted in these false lights in darkness. The only light that will remain is Christ. The choice is ours to live in the Light of Christ or to live in the darkness of the world.

We had a wonderful celebration of Christmas and the Church was filled with many guests and visitors. It was good to see our college students return. The Church looked beautiful, the liturgies and music truly gave praise to God. I am so grateful to all those who have helped to make Christmas such a joyful celebration. 

Have you ever heard someone say that they had an epiphany? This is like saying they had an "Aha" moment or they suddenly realize something. If you were reading a comic book and a character in the book had an epiphany, there

may be a picture with a lightbulb and exclamation point drawn. It's like a BRIGHT idea. If you have had an epiphany, it is usually something that happens suddenly and changes the course of whatever it is that you are doing. For instance, remember when you were learning how to tie your shoes? It was kind of hard to figure out. Then one day you had an epiphany! You learned how to tie your shoes just right. You never made the same mistakes again because what you learned changed the way you always tie your shoes!

Today we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. On this day we celebrate when Christ made Himself known to the world. In our first reading (Isaiah), we hear the beautiful words, "Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you." Just like light helps us to see things in the dark, God's glory is the light that shines on us.

In the second reading (Ephesians), we hear St. Paul say that "The mystery was made known to me by revelation." Revelation means to make known or that something that was a secret is now no longer a secret. St. Paul was letting people know that God is revealing himself through Jesus Christ. When St. Paul told people about Jesus – this Epiphany of the Lord changed the way people were living. People started to see God differently because God was revealed to us in the form of a human, Jesus Christ. They had an example to live by in Jesus. We all know Jesus is the Son of God, but the people in this time did not know this.

These two readings then lead us to the Gospel that talks about the Magi visiting Jesus. The Magi followed a bright star in the sky! It must have been an amazing big star for the Magi to follow it. When the Magi arrived, Baby Jesus was revealed to them. They prostrated themselves (kneeled) before him – similar to what we do when we enter a church. We prostrate or slightly bow to pay our respects to Our Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The Magi traveled a great distance to meet Jesus and they gave him presents of gold, frankincense and myrrh. So just like when we have an epiphany and it can change the course of what we are doing, our faith is the same way. Once we truly learn that Jesus is our light, we can begin to live our lives in the way Jesus lived his.

Let's pray: We pray that Jesus is revealed to us. Help us to be stewards of His love. Amen.
