

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord and epiphany simply means revelation. Today we celebrate the revelation that Jesus Christ is the true Light of the World, and salvation is meant for everyone and not for a select few. The Epiphany of the Lord is God's revelation to the Gentiles that Jesus is the Savior of the world. The wise men presented gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. These were not ordinary gifts, but gifts fit for a king. The wise men from the East represent us, the Gentiles, recognizing Jesus as our Lord, Savior, and King. Jesus is the only star that we should follow because once we find Christ, we have found what we are truly longing for, the only One who can bring us fulfillment and joy.

I pray that we all recognize Jesus as our Savior. Let us make a commitment today to follow the true Star – the true Light of the World – Jesus Christ. Our world is filled with so many lights that are contrary to the gospel. These lights give us the illusion that we are safe. The world's lights are often brighter and more appealing to our senses than the gentle and tender light of faith. So many prefer the lights of the world because there is no challenge or call to conversion. In the end, all the world's lights will burn out and turn to dust, leaving those who trusted in these false lights in darkness. The only light that will remain is Christ. The choice is ours to live in the Light of Christ or to live in the darkness of the world.

The Church looked beautiful, and the liturgies and music truly gave praise to God. I am so grateful to all those who helped make Christmas such a joyful celebration. The entrance rite is so beautiful, as each parish participating has a "star lantern" that is fashioned out of bamboo and paper. These lanterns symbolize the preparing of our hearts to welcome and receive Christ our Light on Christmas. After a parish hosts one of the nine Masses, their star lantern becomes part of the entrance procession. This year St. Michael had the third Mass so there were not a lot of lanterns. Thank you to the Filipino community for allowing us to share in this beautiful tradition.

Let us continue to enjoy one another's culture. Let us not be afraid to learn from each other, as all cultures have a richness that can benefit others.

Taking Home the Sunday Scriptures The Epiphany of the Lord January 7, 2024

What's your point? We get that question a lot. We can ramble at times or become disjointed in our thoughts. When reading and hearing Sunday Scriptures, we often find the nutshell by looking at the responsorial psalm or the Gospel acclamation. From Psalm 72 we hear "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you." The verse for the Gospel acclamation is Matthew 2:2: "We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." We need to see the light, and to follow with our actions and our In Matthew's Gospel today we see two extremely different perspectives: two different reasons for searching for Jesus. In some ways, this resembles the polarization in our world today. What one group sees as good for our nation or world, those with opposing views think will wreck the country.

The Magi were astrologers who saw a vision in the sky and tried to find a way to follow it and discover the newborn king of the Jews. Herod heard about this king, and his reaction was dark and negative. He saw the birth of such a king as a threat to his power as the Roman leader of the country. He wanted the Magi to pass on to him what they knew about this Christ Child. On a more personal level, depending on our perspective, we can either feel threatened or excited by changes. Clearly, it took time for the Magi to get to their destination. Nevertheless, they "prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures . . . " Do we continue looking for Jesus, even if takes a while and he is not where we expect to see him? Are we paying attention to the signs showing us the way to Him? What gifts do we have to offer to Him in homage? After seeing him, the Magi were warned in a dream not to go back the way they came. But if we have seen the Christ Child, how can we go back to where we were? We must continue to respond to God's call to move forward and grow in our lives. We must seek the right and just path and turn away from all that leads us astray.

Every Christmas we set up our Christmas decorations and we watch in enjoyment. We unpack our Nativity sets and place them for all to see. The shepherds are set in place and the three wise men, whose names are said to be

Balthasar, Melchior and Casper, come to seek Baby Jesus. Yet, I have to wonder, have we ever really stopped to understand who these men really are? The answer lies in the Epiphany of the Lord. The three wise men came from a nearby kingdom seeking the birth of our Savior and King. They are important because they were not only diplomats (an important person) bearing peace offerings; they were wise men on a spiritual quest to find their true king and the source of true Wisdom. They were wise because after they heard the King was born, they wanted to worship and honor him.

The story says they went to Jerusalem and asked some priests there if they knew where to find the King. The priests knew where Jesus was to be born because they had been told by the prophet Micah. They told the wise men they would find the new King in Bethlehem. The wise men did not have a map to guide them. They had something even better. God gave them a STAR to guide them. The wise men followed the directions of the priests and followed the star that God gave them, and it led them right to Jesus. When they found him, they gave him gifts and bowed down and worshipped him.

Wise men, women, boys and girls are still searching for Jesus. There are people who want to help—people like priests and religious education teachers friends. There is no map to help us find Jesus, and there is no star to follow. Sometimes our lives are beyond difficult, or even heartbreaking. Where is our map? We are looking for Jesus. What we do have is God's Holy Word in the Bible. What we do have is the Holy Spirit! We have the ability to help each other and love each other, regardless of any difficult times. Pick up the phone and call that person who may be all alone. Leave a gift on the doorstep of someone less fortunate (yes, even after Christmas). Give and you shall receive. This is how we seek Jesus now. Let us be wise like the three wise men knowing we will find the true and only source of wisdom and happiness—Jesus and God's Word!

Let's Pray. Dear Jesus, we seek you today because we want to worship you and crown you as our King. Let us seek you when we are lost. Amen.


