FR. FRANK'S FIRE

This weekend Jesus again uses parables to describe the Kingdom of God. Jesus wants us to know that once we have discovered the Kingdom – we will do everything to be a part of this Kingdom. So precious and so joyful is God's reign that we should be willing to give up everything in order to possess such a great gift.

The parable of the buried treasure is indeed a provocative one. The treasure is found in another's field. The finder risks everything in order to buy the field without the owner finding out about the buried treasure. This appears to be stealing or deceitful at best because the owner is unaware of what is truly being sold. Perhaps the Kingdom of heaven is like that -- where choices have to be made and risks have to be taken so that we can obtain it.

The parable of the pearl of great price is similar but this time deception is not involved. The merchant finds this great pearl and is willing to buy it at any price. The question is, is the pearl really worth the price? Perhaps the pearl is not extraordinary, but just an ordinary everyday pearl. What if the merchant is wrong and risks everything for it? I think the meaning is that the wise person is willing to take a risk and move quickly for the Kingdom and the fool waits for certainty that may never come.

The question is what are we willing to give up in order to obtain the Kingdom? Are we willing to give up our sinful ways, our bad attitudes or our judgments upon others? We must always remember that we cannot buy our way into heaven. The Kingdom was purchased by the blood of Jesus' cross, and he freely offers it to us as a gift. Yet our Lord reminds us that we should desire this gift and be willing to sacrifice in order to receive it.

In contemporary society, we seemed to have come to delude ourselves into believing that everyone will be going to heaven. Yet the scriptures constantly remind us not to be so arrogant and self-assured. *"The angels will go out and separate the wicked from the righteous and throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth."* These are not my words, but the words of Jesus himself. We have nothing to fear if we live as Jesus asked us to do and not as we want to do. The Kingdom is open to all people. The invitation is given, but are we willing to change our lives, attitudes and behaviors to be able to possess the glory of heaven?

World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

This weekend we celebrate World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Pope Francis instituted this wonderful day back in 2021. World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly coincides with the Memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne (grandparents of Jesus) celebrated on July 26.

In his letter, written in 2021, Pope Francis told our grandparents and others the importance of their memories and dreams that they pass down to younger generations not to mention the importance of passing down the roots of our faith.

Pope Leo has chosen the theme, "I will not forget you" from Isaiah 49:15. In a statement from the Dicastery for the Laity, the Family and Life, the Holy Father chose this theme "to emphasize how God's love for every person never fails, not even in the frailty of old age." This is a hopeful message of comfort for all those grandparents and the young at heart, especially those who live alone or feel forgotten. This is also an important time for all of us to recognize that they are a precious presence in our lives and are a blessing.

All four of my grandparents came to the United States in the 1900s from what is now Poland. They came here to seek a better life and worked for their families. While they spoke in broken English, each of them shared their faith with me. I remember their houses were adorned with Crucifixes, pictures of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and they attended Mass celebrated in Polish at their respective parishes. Their memories of the harshness of Eastern Europe and their faith have helped form me. I am grateful for the lessons they taught me about our faith, disappointment, struggle and hope. I just wished that I paid closer attention to them when they were still alive sharing their memories.

Let us offer a prayer for all those whose wisdom and experiences have shaped our lives, that they may know of our love and gratitude for their presence in our lives.

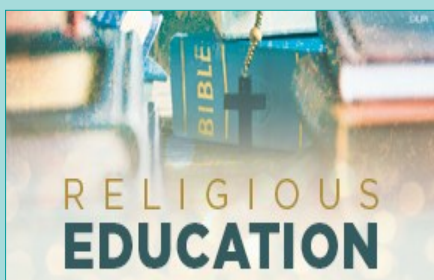

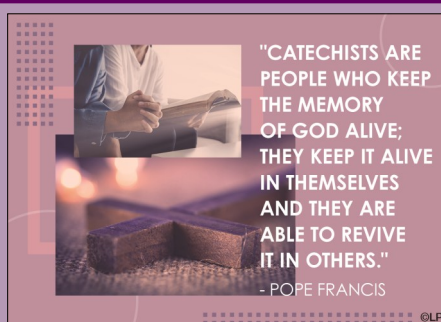

EL ESPIRITU DE PADRE FRANK

Este fin de semana, Jesús vuelve a utilizar parábolas para describir el Reino de Dios. Jesús quiere que sepamos que una vez que hayamos descubierto el Reino, haremos todo lo posible por formar parte de él. El reino de Dios es tan valioso y fuente de tanta alegría que deberíamos estar dispuestos a renunciar a todo para poseer un don tan grande.

La parábola del tesoro escondido es, ciertamente, provocadora. El tesoro se encuentra en el campo de otra persona. Quien lo encuentra arriesga todo para comprar el campo sin que el dueño se entere del tesoro oculto. Esto parece un acto de robo o, en el mejor de los casos, de engaño, ya que el propietario desconoce lo que realmente está vendiendo. Quizás el Reino de los Cielos sea así: un lugar donde debemos tomar decisiones y asumir riesgos para poder alcanzarlo.

La parábola de la perla de gran valor es similar, pero en esta ocasión no hay engaño de por medio. El comerciante encuentra esta gran perla y está dispuesto a comprarla a cualquier precio. La pregunta es: ¿realmente vale la perla ese precio? Quizás no sea una perla extraordinaria, sino una común y corriente. ¿Y si el comerciante se equivoca y lo arriesga todo por ella? Creo que el mensaje es que la persona sabia está dispuesta a correr riesgos y actuar con prontitud por el Reino, mientras que el necio espera una certeza que tal vez nunca llegue.

La pregunta es: ¿qué estamos dispuestos a dejar atrás para alcanzar el Reino? ¿Estamos dispuestos a renunciar a nuestras conductas pecaminosas, a nuestras malas actitudes o a nuestros juicios sobre los demás? Debemos recordar siempre que no podemos comprar nuestra entrada al cielo. El Reino fue adquirido mediante la sangre de la cruz de Jesús, y Él nos lo ofrece gratuitamente como un regalo. Sin embargo, nuestro Señor nos recuerda que debemos desear este don y estar dispuestos a hacer sacrificios para recibirlo.

En la sociedad actual, parece que nos hemos engañado creyendo que todos irán al cielo. Sin embargo, las Escrituras nos recuerdan constantemente que no debemos ser tan arrogantes ni estar tan seguros de nosotros mismos. *“Los ángeles saldrán y separarán a los malvados de los justos, y los arrojarán al horno de fuego, donde habrá llanto y crujir de dientes.”* Estas no son palabras mías, sino las palabras de Jesús mismo. No tenemos nada que temer si vivimos como Jesús nos pidió, y no como nosotros queremos hacerlo. El Reino está abierto a todas las personas. La invitación está hecha, pero ¿estamos dispuestos a cambiar nuestras vidas, actitudes y comportamientos para poder alcanzar la gloria del cielo?

Día Mundial de los Abuelos y las Personas Mayores

Este fin de semana celebramos el Día Mundial de los Abuelos y las Personas Mayores. El Papa Francisco instituyó este maravilloso día en 2021. El Día Mundial de los Abuelos y las Personas Mayores coincide con la memoria de los santos Joaquín y Ana (abuelos de Jesús), que se celebra el 26 de julio.

En su carta de 2021, el Papa Francisco destacó la importancia de los recuerdos y sueños que transmiten a las nuevas generaciones, así como la importancia de preservar las raíces de nuestra fe.

El Papa ha elegido el lema “No me olvidaré de ti”, tomado de Isaías 49, 15. En un comunicado del Dicasterio para los Laicos, la Familia y la Vida, se explica que el Santo Padre escogió este tema “para subrayar cómo el amor de Dios por cada persona nunca falla, ni siquiera en la fragilidad de la vejez”. Es un mensaje de esperanza y consuelo para todos los abuelos y para quienes conservan un espíritu joven, especialmente para aquellos que viven solos o se sienten olvidados. Es también un momento importante para que todos reconozcamos que ellos representan una presencia valiosa en nuestras vidas y son una bendición.

Mis cuatro abuelos llegaron a Estados Unidos en el siglo XX procedentes de lo que hoy es Polonia. Vinieron en busca de una vida mejor y trabajaron por el bien de sus familias. Aunque hablaban un inglés rudimentario, todos ellos compartieron su fe conmigo. Recuerdo que sus casas estaban adornadas con crucifijos e imágenes del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús y del Inmaculado Corazón de María, y que asistían a misa en polaco en sus respectivas parroquias. Sus recuerdos de la dura realidad de Europa del Este y su fe han contribuido a formarme. Agradezco las lecciones que me transmitieron sobre nuestra fe, la decepción, la lucha y la esperanza. Ojalá hubiera prestado más atención cuando aún vivían y compartían sus recuerdos.

Ofrezcamos una oración por todos aquellos cuya sabiduría y experiencias han moldeado nuestras vidas, para que conozcan nuestro amor y gratitud por su presencia en ellas.
