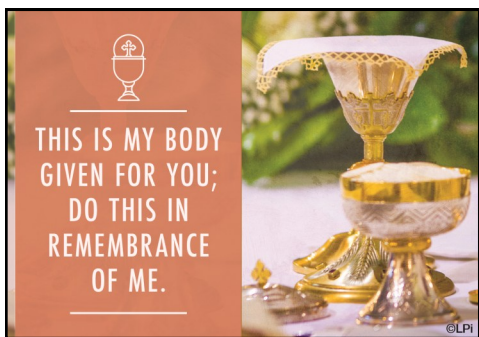

FR. FRANK'S FIRE

Some of you remember well the way Catholics received communion before the Second Vatican Council. Those wishing to receive would approach the sanctuary and kneel along the communion rail. Those of you born after Vatican II may be asking, "What is a communion rail?" A priest would approach those wishing to receive communion, the altar server would place a paten under the communicant's chin (so the host would not fall and touch the ground), the priest would say, "*Corpus Christi*," the communicant responded, "Amen," and the host was placed on the tongue. After a moment of brief prayer – the communicant would leave the communion rail and return to their pew. *Corpus Christi* is Latin for the Body of Christ.

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, formally known as the Feast of Corpus Christi. This is our acknowledgement that Jesus Christ is truly present in the Eucharist. We have been given an awesome gift, and it is one of those gifts that we might take for granted. Jesus, before he died for us gave us the gift of his Body and Blood – His promise to be with us until the end of time.

As Catholics, we believe that the gifts of bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ at each Mass. The word *Eucharist* has a Greek origin and simply means Thanksgiving. Every time we gather around the Lord's Table, we gather to give thanks for the many gifts that God has given us especially the gift of Jesus.



In the Eucharist, we are invited into an encounter with Christ. Jesus comes down from heaven to be with us his people. The Eucharist is not a symbol or a sign, -- it is the actual Body and Blood of Jesus. Jesus tells us that unless we eat his Body and drink his Blood, we will not have life within us. The Eucharist is our source and summit, our nourishment and our destiny and yet so many choose to stay away occupying their time with "more important matters."

I am convinced that there is no substitute for the Sunday Eucharist; we need the Mass to nourish our souls. If we do not nourish our bodies with food and water, we will wither up and die. The same is true for our souls, if we do not nourish them with God's Word and Sacrament, our souls will die. The only place to nourish our souls with the Body and Blood of Christ is at Mass. I encourage all to make a commitment to Christ today and resolve to participate in the Sunday Eucharistic each Sunday. Not twice a year or even once or twice a month, but each week. Jesus has given us an awesome gift; it would be a shame not to receive it as often as we can.

Respectful Attitudes

On this day when we honor the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ – I want to take the opportunity to review with you some of the attitudes that we should have as we approach the Eucharist. Our society has become casual, and this attitude has slowly crept into our churches. While we may be casual with one another, we need to remember that we are not equal to God but a part of God's creation. This is hard for us to accept. While loved by God – we should approach him with great reverence and respect.

Upon entering and exiting the Church, we are to genuflect to the Blessed Sacrament acknowledging the presence of Christ among us. This is a gesture not only of reverence but also symbolic of our surrender to Christ.

Our culture loves chewing gum – everywhere you go people of all ages are chomping away. Chewing gum is not appropriate in the Church and especially during Mass. Please properly dispose of your gum before entering the Church.

We are a people "on the go" and because of this many of us carry "to go" cups of just about everything imaginable. We have cups of coffee, water bottles, juice boxes and cans of soda. Except for young children, I ask that you dispose of your "to go" items before you enter the Church. The Church is designed as a house of prayer and not a place to sip coffee – so there is no place to put your to go items in the pews.

I have noticed that young boys and men are wearing baseball caps into the Church. Out of respect for the Eucharist and the Presence of Jesus, males of any age should remove their hats upon entering the Church. The practice of wearing “baseball caps” is becoming more prevalent.

The way we act in Church reflects our attitudes and understanding of the Most Holy Eucharist. Let us take the opportunity on this great day to remind ourselves of the importance of the Eucharist. May we always remember to treat the Eucharist with great reverence, respect, devotion and awe.



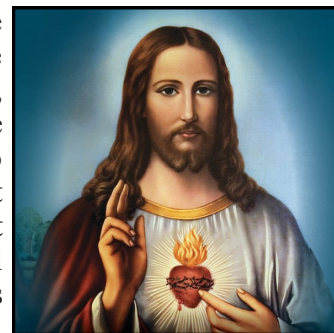
Celebrating the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence

This June, the Bishops of the United States will consecrate the United States to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This will mark the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. The actual consecration will take place on Thursday, June 11 on the eve of the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

I share with you a reflection on the consecration written by Archbishop Alexander K. Sample, the Chairman of the Committee for Religious Liberty:

On November 11, the bishops of the United States voted to consecrate this nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The consecration will take place in 2026 to celebrate America’s semiquincentennial, that is, the two hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. What does this mean? Why consecrate the nation to the Sacred Heart?

Devotion to the Sacred Heart has developed over the centuries following the experiences of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque and the apparitions she witnessed in the seventeenth century. Popes have lauded the practice of consecration of the self, home, and even whole nations to the Sacred Heart. In his encyclical instituting the Solemnity of Christ the King, Pope Pius XI, drawing on the teaching of Pope Leo XIII, commended the “pious custom” of consecrating the nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus as a way to recognize the kingship of Christ. By celebrating this important national anniversary with this devotion, we have the opportunity to encourage all Catholics to honor our Lord and to “infuse the spirit of the Gospel into various communities and departments of life.”



With his encyclical, *Dilexit Nos*, Pope Francis brought devotion to the Sacred Heart to the forefront of our contemporary Catholic life and culture. He noted: “In contemplating the pierced heart of the Lord, who ‘took our infirmities and bore our diseases,’ we too are inspired to be more attentive to the sufferings and needs of others and confirmed in our efforts to share in his work of liberation as instruments for the spread of his love. As we meditate on Christ’s self-offering for the sake of all, we are naturally led to ask why we too should not be ready to give our lives for others.” In *Dilexi Te*, Pope Leo invited us to contemplate Christ’s love, which moves us out on our mission to attend to our sisters and brothers suffering in the world today, particularly in our care for poor and vulnerable people. As we reflect with gratitude on the blessings God has bestowed on our country, our devotion to the Sacred Heart demands that we consider how we might foster truth, justice and charity in American life. We are called to bring our faith into the actions we take and the lives we lead in our communities. We celebrate the ways the Church has contributed to a more just world, and we invite all in our society to see the face of Christ reflected in each sister and brother. We welcome God’s “kingdom of justice, fraternity and solidarity,” remembering that “God has a special place in his heart for those who are discriminated against and oppressed, and he asks us, his Church, to make a decisive and radical choice in favor of the weakest.” This anniversary and consecration will be a great opportunity to promote the beautiful devotion to the Sacred Heart and to encourage the laity to offer their lives in service to God and their country.

EL ESPIRITU DE PADRE FRANK

Algunos de ustedes recuerdan bien la forma en que los católicos recibían la comunión antes del Concilio Vaticano II. Aquellos que deseaban recibirla se acercaban al santuario y se arrodillaban junto al comulgatorio. Aquellos de ustedes que nacieron después del Vaticano II tal vez se estén preguntando: «¿Qué es un comulgatorio?». Un sacerdote se acercaba a quienes deseaban recibir la comunión; el acólito colocaba una patena bajo la barbilla del comulgante (para que la hostia no cayera ni tocara el suelo); el sacerdote decía: “*Corpus Christi*” el comulgante respondía: “Amén” y la hostia era depositada sobre la lengua. Tras un breve momento de oración, el comulgante se retiraba del comulgatorio y regresaba a su banco. “*Corpus Christi*” Significa Cuerpo de Cristo en latín.

Este fin de semana celebramos la Solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo, conocida formalmente como la Fiesta del Corpus Christi. Esta es nuestra afirmación de que Jesucristo está verdaderamente presente en la Eucaristía. Hemos recibido un don extraordinario, y es uno de esos dones que a veces podríamos dar por sentado Jesús, antes de morir por nosotros, nos entregó el don de su Cuerpo y su Sangre: su promesa de permanecer con nosotros hasta el fin de los tiempos.

Como católicos, creemos que las ofrendas de pan y vino se transforman en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo en cada Misa. La palabra Eucaristía tiene un origen griego y significa, sencillamente, Acción de Gracias. Cada vez que nos reunimos alrededor de la Mesa del Señor, nos congregamos para dar gracias por los muchos dones que Dios nos ha concedido, especialmente el don de Jesús.



En la Eucaristía, somos invitados a un encuentro con Cristo. Jesús desciende del cielo para estar con nosotros, su pueblo. La Eucaristía no es un símbolo ni un signo; es el verdadero Cuerpo y la verdadera Sangre de Jesús. Jesús nos dice que, a menos que comamos su Cuerpo y bebamos su Sangre, no tendremos vida en nosotros. La Eucaristía es nuestra fuente y cumbre, nuestro alimento y nuestro destino; y, sin embargo, muchos eligen mantenerse alejados, ocupando su tiempo con «asuntos más importantes».

Estoy convencido de que no existe sustituto para la Eucaristía dominical; necesitamos la Misa para nutrir nuestras almas. Si no nutrimos nuestros cuerpos con alimento y agua, nos marchitaremos y moriremos. Lo mismo ocurre con nuestras almas: si no las nutrimos con la Palabra de Dios y los

Sacramentos, nuestras almas morirán. El único lugar donde podemos nutrir nuestras almas con el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo es en la Misa. Animo a todos a hacer hoy un compromiso con Cristo y a decidirse a participar en la Eucaristía dominical cada domingo. No dos veces al año, ni siquiera una o dos veces al mes, sino cada semana. Jesús nos ha hecho un regalo extraordinario; sería una lástima no recibirlo tan a menudo como nos sea posible.

Actitudes respetuosas

En este día en que honramos el Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo, quiero aprovechar la oportunidad para repasar con ustedes algunas de las actitudes que debemos tener al acercarnos a la Eucaristía. Nuestra sociedad se ha vuelto informal, y esta actitud se ha ido infiltrando lentamente en nuestras iglesias. Si bien podemos ser informales entre nosotros, debemos recordar que no somos iguales a Dios, sino parte de la creación de Dios. Esto nos resulta difícil de aceptar. Aunque somos amados por Dios, debemos acercarnos a Él con gran reverencia y respeto.

Al entrar y salir del templo, debemos hacer la genuflexión ante el Santísimo Sacramento, reconociendo la presencia de Cristo entre nosotros. Este es un gesto no solo de reverencia, sino también simbólico de nuestra entrega a Cristo.

A nuestra cultura le encanta mascar chicle; a dondequiera que uno vaya, personas de todas las edades están mascando sin parar. Mascar chicle no es apropiado en el templo, y especialmente durante la Misa. Por favor, desechen su chicle adecuadamente antes de entrar al templo.

Somos un pueblo que vive "siempre en movimiento" y, debido a esto, muchos de nosotros llevamos vasos "para llevar" con casi cualquier cosa imaginable. Llevamos vasos de café, botellas de agua, envases de jugo y latas de refresco. A excepción de los niños pequeños, les pido que desechen sus bebidas y envases "para llevar" antes de entrar al templo. El templo está concebido como una casa de oración y no como un lugar para beber café; por lo tanto, no hay lugar en los bancos para colocar sus bebidas o envases.

EL ESPIRITU DE PADRE FRANK

He notado que los niños y hombres jóvenes llevan puestas gorras de béisbol dentro de el templo. Por respeto a la Eucaristía y a la Presencia de Jesús, los varones de cualquier edad deben quitarse el sombrero o la gorra al entrar al templo. La costumbre de usar "gorras de béisbol" se está volviendo cada vez más frecuente.

La forma en que nos comportamos en el templo refleja nuestras actitudes y nuestra comprensión de la Santísima Eucaristía. Aprovechemos la oportunidad en este gran día para recordarnos a nosotros mismos la importancia de la Eucaristía. Que recordemos siempre tratar la Eucaristía con gran reverencia, respeto, devoción y asombro.



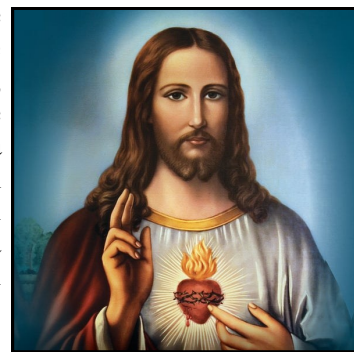
Celebrando el 250.º aniversario de la Declaración de Independencia

Este mes de junio, los obispos de los Estados Unidos consagrarán los Estados Unidos al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. Esto marcará el 250.º aniversario de la firma de la Declaración de Independencia. La consagración propiamente dicha tendrá lugar el jueves 11 de junio, en la víspera de la Solemnidad del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús.

Comparto con ustedes una reflexión sobre la consagración, escrita por el Arzobispo Alexander K. Sample, Presidente del Comité para la Libertad Religiosa:

El 11 de noviembre, los obispos de los Estados Unidos votaron a favor de consagrar esta nación al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. La consagración tendrá lugar en 2026 para celebrar el semi-quincentenario de los Estados Unidos; es decir, el doscientos, cincuenta aniversario de la firma de la Declaración de Independencia. ¿Qué significa esto? ¿Por qué consagrar la nación al Sagrado Corazón?

La devoción al Sagrado Corazón se ha desarrollado a lo largo de los siglos, a raíz de las experiencias de Santa Margarita María Alacoque y de las apariciones de las que fue testigo en el siglo XVII. Los Papas han elogiado la práctica de consagrarse a sí mismo, el hogar e incluso naciones enteras al Sagrado Corazón. En su encíclica por la que instituyó la Solemnidad de Cristo Rey, el Papa Pío XI —basándose en la enseñanza del Papa León XIII— recomendó la "piadosa costumbre" de consagrar la nación al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús como un modo de reconocer la realeza de Cristo. Al celebrar este importante aniversario nacional con esta devoción, tenemos la oportunidad de alentar a todos los católicos a honrar a nuestro Señor y a "infundir el espíritu del Evangelio en las diversas comunidades y ámbitos de la vida".



Con su encíclica *Dilexit Nos*, el Papa Francisco situó la devoción al Sagrado Corazón en el primer plano de nuestra vida y cultura católica contemporánea. Él señaló: "Al contemplar el corazón traspasado del Señor, quien "tomó sobre sí nuestras dolencias y cargó con nuestras enfermedades", nosotros también nos sentimos inspirados a estar más atentos a los sufrimientos y necesidades de los demás, y confirmados en nuestros esfuerzos por participar en su obra de liberación como instrumentos para la difusión de su amor. Al meditar sobre la auto entrega de Cristo por el bien de todos, nos sentimos naturalmente impulsados a preguntarnos por qué nosotros también no deberíamos estar dispuestos a dar nuestra vida por los demás". En *Dilexi Te*, el Papa León nos invitó a contemplar el amor de Cristo, el cual nos impulsa a salir en misión para atender a nuestros hermanos y hermanas que sufren en el mundo de hoy, particularmente en nuestro cuidado de las personas pobres y vulnerables. Al reflexionar con gratitud sobre las bendiciones que Dios ha derramado sobre nuestro país, nuestra devoción al Sagrado Corazón exige que consideremos cómo podemos fomentar la verdad, la justicia y la caridad en nuestras vidas. Estamos llamados a integrar nuestra fe en las acciones que emprendemos y en las vidas que llevamos dentro de nuestras comunidades. Celebramos las formas en que la Iglesia ha contribuido a un mundo más justo, e invitamos a todos en nuestra sociedad a ver el rostro de Cristo reflejado en cada hermano y hermana. Acogemos el "reino de justicia, fraternidad y solidaridad" de Dios, recordando que "Dios tiene un lugar especial en su corazón para aquellos que son discriminados y oprimidos, y nos pide a nosotros, su Iglesia, que hagamos una opción decisiva y radical en favor de los más débiles". Este aniversario y consagración constituirán una gran oportunidad para promover la hermosa devoción al Sagrado Corazón y para alentar a los laicos a ofrecer sus vidas al servicio de Dios y de su país.

Papa Leon publica enciclica Magnifica Humanitas

La nueva enciclica del Papa León XIV, Magnifica Humanitas, es uno de los documentos más interesantes y actuales que ha publicado la Iglesia en muchos años. En ella, el Papa reflexiona sobre cómo la inteligencia artificial está cambiando nuestra forma de vivir, trabajar, comunicarnos e incluso hacer la guerra. Pero más allá de hablar de tecnología, el centro del mensaje es la dignidad de la persona humana y la necesidad de no perder nuestra humanidad en medio del progreso digital.

El Papa deja claro que la tecnología no es mala en sí misma, pero advierte que nunca puede reemplazar la conciencia, la compasión ni la responsabilidad moral de las personas. Uno de los puntos más llamativos es su llamado a "desarmar la inteligencia artificial", especialmente cuando se usa para vigilancia masiva, manipulación, exclusión social o armamento autónomo. También alerta sobre los riesgos de que grandes empresas tecnológicas acumulen demasiado poder y de que millones de trabajadores sean desplazados sin protección ni justicia social.

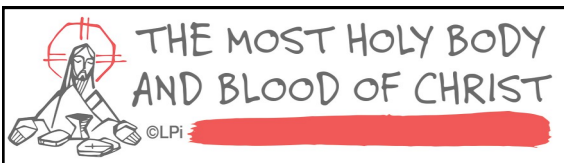
Además, el documento tiene detalles muy interesantes: el Papa utiliza referencias culturales como El Señor de los Anillos para explicar los peligros del poder sin límites, habla del riesgo de convertir al ser humano en "un dato" o "un algoritmo", y recuerda que ninguna máquina puede reemplazar el amor, la libertad o la capacidad humana de perdonar.

Es una lectura profunda, moderna y muy necesaria para creyentes y no creyentes. Nos invita a pensar qué tipo de humanidad queremos construir en el futuro y cómo usar la tecnología sin perder el alma, la solidaridad ni la esperanza. Vale mucho la pena dedicarle tiempo y leerla con atención.

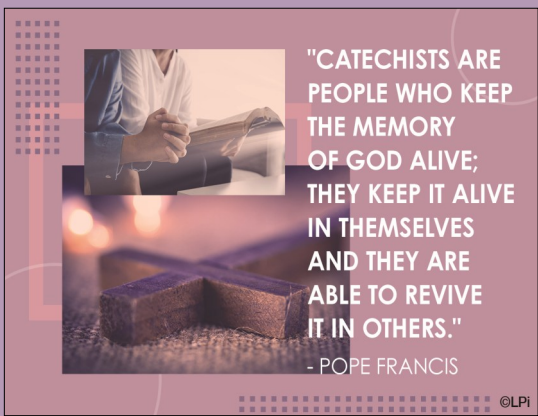
