

John 3:16


Father Frank's Fire

Today is the Fourth Sunday of Lent. Where has the time gone? The Fourth Sunday of Lent is known as *Laetare Sunday*. *Laetare* simply means rejoice. This Sunday sets a tone of joyful anticipation for the Easter mystery, as do the Rose vestments that are worn this weekend.

A major theme in John's gospel is the difference between light and darkness. Jesus is the true light of the world and he has come to lead us out of the darkness of our sins. We are to walk in the light, to be part of the light and to radiate that light to everyone we meet.

Often times we find ourselves in the darkness of our own sinfulness. We are filled with anger, jealously, greed, envy, rivalries and acts of selfishness. We know that they are wrong, and yet we seem to be stuck in the darkness. Today's gospel states clearly, "And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light." Wow, what an indictment of human nature.

Why do we prefer darkness? Why do we prefer to live in the past rather than move into the light of Christ? Why do we choose to wallow in self-pity and in our wounds instead of saying "ENOUGH – I want to live in Christ's light?" This Lent I challenge all of you to walk away from the darkness and walk into the



brightness of God's light. Say to yourselves, "I will not live in fear or anger. I will not live being suspicious of everyone and everything. I will not live in guilt or shame – NO, I WILL LIVE as a follower of Christ!"

How can we be so confident? Today's scripture gives us the confidence that we need, "For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." The words of Jesus give us the assurance that we are truly loved and cared for by God. Jesus came to give us life so that we can live it to the fullest. If Jesus did not come to condemn, why are we so willing to condemn others? I invite you to make a firm resolution today to be open to the movement of God in your lives and to embrace God's gifts of forgiveness, love and compassion. Our response to God's abundant gifts is to share them with others. God's gifts are never meant for ourselves, but instead they are meant for the world. May we have the courage to share Christ's Light with all we meet.

Catherine's Caring Cause

Our second collection this weekend will be taken up for Catherine's Caring Cause that is run by two Sisters of Mercy. Catherine's Caring Cause seeks to help migrants seeking asylum in the United States. This organization finds an apartment for a sponsored family, provides case management for legal and medical needs and support for mentors. The organization provides rent and utilities for six months and furnishings for the apartment. It also helps mentor and acclimate the new arrivals to their new environment, as well as prepares the family to assume the financial and other responsibilities when the six months of support has been completed.

This weekend will be a one-time collection and all of the monies will be forwarded to Catherine's Caring Cause. During Lent, monetary donations will be accepted at the parish office and in the weekly collection – please clearly mark envelopes "Catherine's Caring Cause." While this may not do much to provide a solution, we can help to reduce some suffering.

4th Sunday of Lent March 10, 2024 Today's passage from Ephesians is a magnificent statement of the Good News.

The rationale for being a Christian can be no clearer than this—by God's grace we have been saved. Paul assures us today that our salvation is not a commodity that we have earned or worked for. We have been taken out of darkness into the light of eternal life solely because of God's loving grace.

As followers of Christ, we choose to live lives of good deeds as a fitting thanksgiving for all we have been given. God loves us so much, and has saved us! The gospel reminds us that this free gift of salvation was given when God sent his only begotten Son, who then gave up his own life freely so that none of us might perish.

Jesus Christ, lifted up on the cross, is our reminder that we have been saved ... gratuitously. And through God's great mercy, compassion and love, we are destined to live forever. This Lent may we accept the challenge to walk toward the light, reject the darkness of evil and seek God's truth. Let us be signs of Christ's loving presence for others as we Spread God's love and compassion.

- When and how do I know that God loves me so much? What signs point to God's great love for me and for all his people?
- What can I do to be a better "sacrament," or sign, of healing in my family? In my Community? In my Workplace?
- When and how do I hear the messengers sent to me by God?

One of the hardest things I have ever tried to do is to act like Jesus. He is so perfect. So many stories in the bible tell of the many cruel people all around Jesus. But never once did he act

like them. He was always loving, forgiving and kind to those he encountered. But it's so hard to act like Jesus when people are cruel to us, isn't it?

Today's Gospel from St. John is probably one of the most popular. Why did God send Jesus to earth to walk among us? God sent us Jesus because He loved us so much. God didn't want to lose us to darkness. He wants us to be in heaven with Him. He wants us to know that as long as we believe, we will live forever in heaven with God.

God did not send Jesus to tell us how much he disapproves of our behavior. He sent us Jesus to show us HOW to live and HOW to love and respect one another. In doing this, Jesus suffered a lot to show us the truth about God so that we, too, could be saved.

Every time I see Jesus hanging on the cross, I think about how much that must have hurt. I feel a lot of emotions. The first emotion is sadness. Sadness because Jesus just wanted us to love one another. The second emotion is disappointment. I'm disappointed that our fellow human beings hated the idea of believing in God so much, that they did this to Jesus. But then I feel the emotion of hope. Hope that all that Jesus did for us will allow us to be with God in heaven. The final emotion I feel is determination. I am determined to listen to and to follow the Word of God.

However, like I said – it can be so hard to follow Jesus, the Word, when the world around you can seem so cruel. You can feel alone if you are constantly feeling like nothing is going your way. But look at Jesus on the cross. Did it look like things went the way he imagined? I am sure Jesus was sad and disappointed to see the anger that people had.

But Jesus was happy to change the hearts of many, and he remained hopeful and determined to do God's will. He SAVED SO MANY PEOPLE – and He is saving each one of us, too! There is a lot of beauty all around us and that should be our focus each and every day. Don't let the dark actions of others take away the beauty that surrounds you. Even when times are tough, look to Jesus to help give you the strength. If Jesus can handle the pain on the cross, you can handle anything that comes your way, with love and forgiveness.

Let's pray: Heavenly Father, help me to be determined to love like Jesus. Amen.




Pick Up Lenten Crosses in the Narthex


El Espiritu del Padre Frank

Hoy es el Cuarto Domingo de Cuaresma. ¿A dónde se fue el tiempo? El Cuarto Domingo de Cuaresma se conoce como *Domingo Laetare*. *Laetare* significa regocijarse. Este domingo establece un tono de gozosa anticipación del misterio pascual, al igual que las vestimentas rosas que se usan este fin de semana.

Un tema importante en el evangelio de Juan es la luz y las tinieblas. Jesús es la verdadera luz del mundo y ha venido para sacarnos de las tinieblas de nuestros pecados. Debemos caminar en la luz, ser parte de la luz e irradiar esa luz a todos los que conocemos.

A menudo nos encontramos en la oscuridad de nuestra pecaminosidad. Estamos llenos de ira, celos, avaricia, envidia, rivalidades y actos de egoísmo. Sabemos que están equivocados y, sin embargo, parecemos estar atrapados en la oscuridad. El evangelio de hoy dice claramente: "Y este es el veredicto: que la luz vino al mundo, pero el pueblo prefirió las tinieblas a la luz". Vaya, qué acusación de la naturaleza humana.

¿Por qué preferimos la oscuridad? ¿Por qué preferimos vivir en el pasado en lugar de avanzar hacia la luz de Cristo? ¿Por qué nos revolcamos en la autocompasión y en nuestras heridas en lugar de




