


"Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me."

# Father Frank's Fire

"Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." Like a good teacher, Jesus often used images and examples to help illustrate his message.


The scriptures speak to us about sacrifice; about putting the needs of others before our own. Parents know this very well; often times they put their own needs and desires second as they take care of their children. They do so willingly, without bitterness or resentment. They sacrifice for their children. Our society is also encountering a new type of sacrifice — adult children taking care of their aging and ill parents. This situation also requires a significant amount of patience on the part of the caregiver, as well as on the part of the one in need of care. Adult children sacrifice their time and treasure to care for the needs of their parents.



Unfortunately, we live in a society that does not value sacrifice. Everything around us keeps shouting, "live for the moment," "live for yourselves," and "take as much as you can." I believe it is attitudes like these that have contributed to the decline of respect in our society. This attitude ignores the needs of others and focuses only on ourselves. These messages are contrary to the gospel. Jesus reminds us that we are not to live for ourselves, but we are to live for others — in essence dying to ourselves so that others may live. Just as a grain of wheat — when it dies to itself — only then can it produce an abundant harvest. The same is true for us; only when we sacrifice for others can we bear abundant fruit.

It is important to be aware of the fruits of our efforts. If our efforts bring about love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control, we can be assured that we are following the Holy Spirit – for these are the fruits of the Holy Spirit. If the fruit of our efforts bring about anger, bitterness, resentment, greed, jealousy, envy, rivalries or factions, then we are not following the Holy Spirit but some other spirit that is not of God. Let us always be open to the working of the Holy Spirit among us.

#### **Two Great Saints**



Happy St. Patrick's Day. This is a great day to celebrate Irish heritage. The Fifth Sunday of Lent ranks higher in the liturgical calendar than the memorial of St. Patrick. The Irish immigrants came to the United States with great courage, pride, and faith, and they were able to overcome many obstacles and prejudices. This should be a reminder to us of those who face the same obstacles and prejudices in our country today.

On this day, consider the life of St. Patrick, the great patron of Ireland. Patrick's faith was so strong, his love for the Church so deep, that he changed a nation forever. May we have the courage and the faith of Patrick so that we, too, can change the world. St. Patrick, pray for us!

Tuesday, March 19 is the Solemnity of St. Joseph, husband of Mary. This is a day celebrated by many nationalities but especially the Italian and Polish. Pope Francis has a strong devotion to St. Joseph who was the provider and protector of the Holy Family. In his office, (so I am told, as I have never been invited in) Pope Francis has a statue of St. Joseph who is sleeping. Seems strange to us, but it makes perfect sense that even the saints have to sleep. Every time the Holy Father has a difficult problem that he does not know how to handle – he places it under the sleeping St. Joseph – trusting that he will guide the Holy Father with a solution.

Pope Francis says to us, "Each of us can discover in Joseph – the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence – an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble." Think of how many people in our lives that do so much for us and often go unnoticed. They are in our midst – the many volunteers that work so hard behind the scenes so that we can celebrate Mass and the other Sacraments. The same is true for so many that sacrifice their time for others. St. Joseph, husband of Mary, protector of the Holy Family and patron of the Universal Church, pray for us!

### Passion (Palm) Sunday

Next weekend is Passion Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. This is the most sacred time in the Church's year. Holy Week has the most moving liturgies, as we

are invited to enter into the Paschal Mystery. We are not spectators, but we are a part of these great events of salvation history. The reading of the Passion reminds us of Christ's great love for all.



5th Sunday of Lent March 17, 2024 In today's first reading, Jeremiah says: "No longer will they have to teach their

friends and relatives how to know the Lord." *Really*? Are we so assured of our faith today, and of what God wants us to do and how to live out our faith? Do we no longer have to teach others to know the Lord? What is the truth?

If we listen daily to the media, we are bombarded by conflicting messages. Even the leaders of our Church sometimes disagree about what to teach. But this is the thing . . "Christ Jesus, when He was in the flesh, became the source and salvation for all who obey Him." Do we still believe that Jesus is our source and salvation?

In today's gospel, Jesus' public ministry is concluding. A request from some Greeks symbolizes/ signals that the nations of the world now want to know Jesus! The time is ripe, and the world desires Him. Jesus' mission is fulfilled and He will be glorified by losing His life and by making of Himself an offering for others.

Fast forward to today and today's politically charged world. The Catholic Christian faith, and God's Love and Compassion, now spread throughout the world, and people still seek the truth. People want to know the price of salvation. Let's pray for God's message to break through any confusion our world may be experiencing. Jesus tells us how: "Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am there also will my servant(s) be."

Think of the strongest magnet in the world and let's imagine that it is Jesus. The drawing power of even the strongest magnet reminds me

of something that Jesus taught about Himself. He draws people to Himself. The people who were following Jesus didn't understand why Jesus had come to earth. They thought that he had come to set up an earthly kingdom. But Jesus didn't come to build up an earthly kingdom; his kingdom is heavenly. He came to earth to die for our sins, so that we could become part of his heavenly kingdom right here on earth. Jesus knew that the day of his crucifixion and return to heaven was near, so he spoke to his followers and said, "I am troubled now." Jesus wondered: "What should I do?" Should I pray to the Father and ask him to save me? No, this is the very reason that I came—and when I am lifted up, I will draw everyone to myself." The Bible reminds us that Jesus gave us that message so that we would know how He was going to die.

Let us learn from Jesus and pray. Jesus, in times of trouble, let us be drawn to You like a magnet. Amen.

# Pick Up **Lenten Crosses** in the Narthex


During the season of Lent we are once again reminded of our need to commit ourselves to prayer, fasting and almsgiving.



Si nuestros esfuerzos producen amor, gozo, paz, paciencia, bondad, fidelidad, gentileza y dominio propio, podemos estar seguros de que estamos siguiendo al Espíritu Santo, porque estos son los frutos del Espíritu Santo. Si el fruto de nuestros esfuerzos produce ira, amargura, resentimiento, avaricia, celos, envidia, o rivalidades, entonces no estamos siguiendo al Espíritu Santo sino a algún otro espíritu que no es de Dios. Estemos siempre abiertos a la obra del Espíritu Santo entre nosotros.




