

Father Frank's Fire

Our first reading today from the Book of Sirach gives us something to ponder. Sirach says, "The fruit of a tree shows the care it has had; so too does one's speech disclose the bent of one's mind." Speech allows us to communicate with each other, and to share our thoughts and ideas. Yet today so many people speak without thinking, and their words can cause pain and suffering to another. A wise person chooses their words carefully. Today, so many people spew out profanity, lies, and half-truths in order to justify their positions. It does not seem to matter if they are telling the truth – only that they are able to sway others to their side.

We have all seen how social media and other forms of electronic communication have caused a great amount of suffering to individuals. We have heard of those who have been bullied and harassed to the point of taking their own life. People are able to hide behind these means of communication and feel free to say things that they would not say to someone's face. If we take the advice of Sirach, we quickly understand that words can wound and that the vicious cycle of rhetoric has to end. When we treat one another with kindness and respect, we can put aside our differences and work together to build a better world. It is easier to tear down one another, than to try to understand them. Destruction is from the evil one – Jesus challenges us to love one another.

Ash Wednesday

This Wednesday, March 5th is Ash Wednesday. We are marked or signed with ashes to remind us of who we are sinners - and like the barren branches, we anticipate the coming of Spring – the coming of new life. Lent is a time to acknowledge our need for repentance and turning back to the Lord. Lent is not just a time "to give up" something, but a time of decision – deciding for conversion and returning to God. During Lent we are called to purify ourselves through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and the traditional disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. St. Michael will be offering several opportunities to renew and strengthen our faith during Lent. You will have an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, to pray the Stations of the Cross and other opportunities for prayer.

The Holy Season of Lent

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends quietly on Holy Thursday before the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. For 40 days, we prepare to celebrate the great day of Easter, the highest feast day of the entire Church year. With the Mass of the Lord's Supper, we enter into a new season, the Sacred Triduum (the three days) that intensely leads us to the glory of Easter. At the heart of the liturgical year stands the Sacred Triduum, all other seasons either lead up to or flow from these sacred days. Everyone should mark his or her calendars now and plan to celebrate with us these sacred days — April 17, 18, 19 and the joy of Easter Sunday, April 20. We then celebrate Easter for 50 days until the day of Pentecost on Sunday, June 8.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Fasting is an ancient disciple in the Church and, together with almsgiving and prayer, will help us prepare to celebrate Easter.

- Catholics 14 years and older are to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast.
 Catholics over 18 but not yet 59 are to eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs.

I strongly urge you not to waste these next 40 days of Lent, but to make the most out of them. Use the various opportunities for prayer to deepen your relationship with Christ. Each year God gives us this time for our renewal and conversion. What is more important than your soul? May we rise from the ashes of sin and come alive with the fire of faith given to us at Pentecost!

The start of the Lenten season is just a few days away. As Catholics, we are asked to make Lenten promises to show our appreciation for Jesus and to honor all the sacrifices he made

for us. This is a time for real prayer and connection to draw us closer to God.

Nowadays it may seem like everyone is out for themselves and only looking out for number one. It seems that looking out for ourselves is the main object and goal of the world today. Yet, when we read the bible, we are reminded that we should be giving of ourselves. We should be looking out for the needs of others rather than our own. We should be self-sacrificing rather than self-serving.

We are very good at pointing out a dozen sins of someone else's life but don't always take an honest look at our own faults. It is easier to point fingers at others' mistakes and sins, but it is harder to hear when someone points at our faults. We tend to be quick to anger and defend our choices.

All of this is in today's Gospel. Jesus told his disciples, "Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will they not both fall into a pit?" This is a great example of the humor Jesus often used to teach. I mean have you ever seen a blind man leading a blind man in the street? Of course not. Each person in the world today is blindly trusting the other one to lead them. Following the wrong person will lead them both to fall. We have to be careful who we choose to follow because they can lead us to the wrong path.

We have to understand that Jesus is saying we are all students. We are learners and pupils. Jesus said no disciple is superior to the teacher, but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher. We need to choose a teacher or mentor that will guide us into becoming good Catholics - someone who will help us grow in our faith and teach us ways to grow closer to Jesus.

Lent is the perfect time to grow closer to Jesus. Finding a mentor to inspire us to be self-sacrificing and do things to enrich other lives is so important. All of us are following and listening to someone. All of us are taught by someone. Who are you following and what are you learning? A Godly friend or teacher is there to point you right to Jesus, and to teach the word of God. This Lenten season be that teacher to someone. Do God's good work and be inspiring and giving in a world that is struggling. Show Jesus your promise to him by helping others.

Let's Pray: Father, thank you for giving us the greatest gift we can ever receive. Help us show and guide each other closer to you. Amen.

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults: Dignity of Baptism

You need to come only one night to audition.







El Espiritu del Padre Frank

La primera lectura de hoy, tomada del libro de Sirácida, nos da algo para reflexionar. El Sirácida dice: "El fruto de un árbol muestra el cuidado que ha tenido; así también la forma de hablar revela la inclinación de su mente." El habla nos permite comunicarnos unos con otros y compartir nuestros pensamientos e ideas. Sin embargo, hoy en día, muchas personas hablan sin pensar, y sus palabras pueden causar dolor y sufrimiento a otros. Una persona sabia elige sus palabras con cuidado. Hoy en día, muchas personas arrojan blasfemias, mentiras y medias verdades para justificar su posición. No parece importar si están diciendo la verdad, solo que sean capaces de convencer a otros de ponerse de su lado.

Todos hemos visto cómo las redes sociales y otras formas de comunicación electrónica han causado un gran sufrimiento a las personas. Hemos oído hablar de personas que han sido intimidadas y acosadas hasta el punto de quitarse la vida. Las personas son capaces de esconderse detrás de estos medios de comunicación y sentirse libres de decir cosas que no dirían a la cara de alguien. Si seguimos el consejo de Sirácida, enseguida comprendemos que las palabras pueden herir y que el círculo vicioso tiene que terminar. Cuando nos tratamos unos a otros con amabilidad y respeto, podemos dejar de lado nuestras diferencias y trabajar juntos para construir un mundo mejor. Es más fácil destruir a los demás que tratar de comprenderlos. La destrucción viene del maligno: Jesús nos desafía a amarnos unos a otros.

Miercoles de Ceniza

Este miércoles 5 de marzo es Miércoles de Ceniza. Estamos marcados con cenizas para recordarnos que somos pecadores, y como las ramas estériles, anticipamos la llegada de la primavera, la llegada de una nueva vida. La Cuaresma es un tiempo para reconocer nuestra necesidad de arrepentimiento y de volver al Señor. La Cuaresma no es solo un tiempo para "renunciar" a algo, sino un tiempo de decisión: decidir por la conversión y volver a Dios. Durante la Cuaresma, estamos llamados a purificarnos a través del Sacramento de la Reconciliación y las disciplinas tradicionales de la oración, el ayuno y la limosna. St. Michael ofrecerá varias oportunidades para renovar y fortalecer nuestra fe durante la Cuaresma. Tendrás la oportunidad de recibir el Sacramento de la Reconciliación, rezar el Vía Crucis y otras oportunidades para orar.

El Tiempo Sagrado de la Cuaresma

La Cuaresma comienza el Miércoles de Ceniza y termina tranquilamente el Jueves Santo antes de la Misa vespertina de la Cena del Señor. Durante cuarenta días, nos preparamos para celebrar el gran día de Pascua, la fiesta más importante de todo el año eclesiástico. Con la Misa de la Cena del Señor, entramos en una nueva temporada, el Triduo Sagrado (los tres días) que nos conduce intensamente a la gloria de la Pascua. En el corazón del año litúrgico se encuentra el Triduo Sagrado; todos los demás tiempos conducen a estos días sagrados o se derivan de ellos. Todos deberían marcar sus calendarios ahora y planificar celebrar con nosotros estos días sagrados, 17, 18 y 19 de Abril, y la alegría del Domingo de Pascua, 20 de Abril. Luego celebramos la Pascua durante cincuenta días hasta el día de Pentecostés, el 8 de Junio.

REGLAMENTO DE CUARESMA

El ayuno es una disciplina antigua en la Iglesia y, junto con la limosna y la oración, nos ayudará a prepararnos para celebrar la Pascua.




