Jesus said to them in reply, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were greater sinners than all other Galileans? By no means! But I tell you, if you do not repent, you will all perish as they did!" - Lk 13:2-3

Father Frank's Fire

In today's first reading, Moses daringly asked God his name. God replied, "I am who am." This certainly gives us something to ponder. The divine name, I AM, reminds us that God is not a being (not even a Supreme Being), but rather, God is the source of all being. God is the source of all existence and of all life. God always was, is, always will be. This mystery is difficult for us to understand – because we think with human constructs. For us, everything has a life span – that is a beginning and an end. This is not so for God – because God simply is. God is the author of life and the source of all that exists. While the name "I am who am" sounds strange to us – it gives us plenty to meditate over.

Our Jewish ancestors considered the name of God so sacred that they would never even speak it. I think that we can learn a lesson from our ancestors when we find ourselves using the name of God in some vulgar or inappropriate way. I am amazed at how many consider it acceptable to use or defile God's or Jesus' name in anger, but they get upset when people use "other" words.

Lent is a time of prayer and conversion. Perhaps this is the time to once again look at our attitudes toward God's name. Do we give proper reverence to God's name? Have we disrespected the name of Jesus, Mary or the saints? Let us ask God to give us the grace to enter into the mystery of "I AM."

Human Suffering

In today's gospel, the prevailing attitude of the people and religious leaders was that if you were a victim of an illness, disaster or some other type of suffering, you were being punished for some previous transgression. Likewise, when someone was healthy, comfortable and wealthy, they were thought to be highly favored by God. Even today, when people suffer from a natural disaster, addiction or a terminal illness, we sometimes fall into the trap of believing that God's wrath was upon them. When things go well for someone, we immediately think that God's blessings are upon them.

Jesus tells the people and us that this is not true. Good fortune and human suffering are not the result of God's blessing or curse. God rains upon the good, as well as the bad. It is by the fruit of our lives that we will be judged, and not by the individual circumstances of our lives. Human suffering does not mean we are not loved by God. Prosperity and health do not mean we have found favor with God. For it is by the power of the Cross that we are saved and made free.

Why should I?

Are you a registered parishioner of St. Michael? I am often asked to sign forms for people that have been asked to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. This request entails a moral obligation for me. They generally ask me to verify that the person is a practicing and active Catholic. They assure me that they regularly go to church, yet I do not recognize them and they are not in the parish records. To be honest, it is very difficult and embarrassing at times to question people unnecessarily, and this often leads them to mistrust and become angry with the Church. When I was at St. Cajetan, I happened to be in the office and the receptionist had stepped away. A woman wanted to have a form signed so that she could be a sponsor. She said to me, "I am a parishioner and I am good friends with the pastor." I said, "Oh how nice – I am the pastor and I do not think I know you." She replied, "Oh, you must be new. How long have you been here?" I said, "Just twelve years." It is sad that people get angry when challenged to tell the truth.

There is an easy solution. Become a registered, contributing and active parishioner. Once a person finishes school, gets a job or is married, they take on adult responsibilities and no longer come under the registration of their parents. Please register, as this will be of great help if you would like to receive one of the Sacraments for yourself or a newborn child, or if you simply wish to obtain a letter of recommendation to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. Imagine planting a rose seed. Each day you water it. You put it in a nice bright window and make sure you take good care of it. Your reward will be a beautiful plant filled with roses. It would be

disappointing if you put all this time and effort into this plant and it didn't give you any roses. You would feel like your time and effort was wasted, wouldn't you?

Jesus loved to speak in parables to explain things so people could understand them, and that's what he did in today's Gospel. Jesus tells a parable about a fig tree that was planted in an orchard. The tree was not growing any fruit and the owner of the tree wanted the gardener to cut it down. However, the gardener told the owner, "I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not, you can cut it down."

What this parable is trying to tell us is that God always gives us second chances to change our bad behaviors. We can repent or express regret or sadness for doing wrong. Sometimes, we do not know we are doing wrong — once we learn that our actions are wrong, we can try our best to do better. Even though the tree would not give fruit, the gardener didn't want to cut it down and give up on the tree; he wanted to try to give it some extra attention so that it could grow and bear fruit!

Repent means to truly be sorry for your sins. If we do not live our lives with Jesus, and if we do not live our lives as Jesus wants us to, we are wasting our faith. Your parents and caregivers bring you to church; they sign you up for religion classes; they pray with you each day and do so much more. They are doing all that they can to plant the seed of FAITH in you! They want you to grow with Jesus so that you can continue to spread the word of LOVE to one another.

We do make mistakes along the way, but it is important to know that God will not just chop us down like a tree that doesn't bear fruit. He will always give us the opportunity to change, to turn our eyes towards Him and to repent! Let us not waste the work our caregivers are doing to help us to grow with Jesus! Remember to plant the seeds of love and faith to all those you cross paths with.

Pray this: Dear God, I ask that you help me remember all that my loved ones have taught me about you. Help me to always plant seeds of kindness. Help me to remember that You love me and that I always can change for the better. Amen.







El Espiritu del Padre Frank

En la primera lectura de hoy, Moisés, con valentía, le preguntó a Dios su nombre. Dios respondió: "Yo Soy el que Soy." Esto sin duda nos da algo en qué reflexionar. El nombre divino, YO SOY, nos recuerda que Dios no es un ser (ni siquiera un Ser Supremo), sino la fuente de todos los seres. Dios es la fuente de toda existencia y de toda vida. Dios siempre fue, es y siempre será. Este misterio nos resulta difícil de comprender, porque pensamos con conceptos humanos. Para nosotros, todo tiene un ciclo de vida: un principio y un fin. Para Dios, esto no es así, porque Dios simplemente es. Dios es el autor de la vida y la fuente de todo lo que existe. Aunque el nombre "Yo Soy el que Soy" nos suene extraño, nos da mucho que meditar.

Nuestros antepasados judíos consideraban el nombre de Dios tan sagrado que jamás lo pronunciaban. Creo que podemos aprender una lección de nuestros antepasados cuando nos encontramos usando el nombre de Dios de forma vulgar o inapropiada. Me sorprende la cantidad de personas que consideran aceptable usar o profanar el nombre de Dios o de Jesús con ira, pero se molestan cuando se usan otras palabras.

La Cuaresma es un tiempo de oración y conversión. Quizás sea el momento de reflexionar sobre nuestra actitud hacia el nombre de Dios. ¿Le damos la debida reverencia? ¿Hemos faltado al respeto al nombre de Jesús, María o los santos? Pidamos a Dios que nos dé la gracia de adentrarnos en el misterio del "YO SOY."

Sufrimiento Humano

En el evangelio de hoy, la actitud predominante del pueblo y de los líderes religiosos era que si eras víctima de una enfermedad, un desastre o cualquier otro tipo de sufrimiento, estabas siendo castigado por alguna transgresión previa. De igual manera, cuando alguien gozaba de salud, bienestar y riqueza, se creía que era altamente favorecido por Dios. Incluso hoy, cuando las personas sufren un desastre natural, una adicción o una enfermedad terminal, a veces caemos en la trampa de creer que la ira de Dios estaba sobre ellas. De igual manera cuando las cosas le van bien a alguien, inmediatamente pensamos que las bendiciones de Dios están sobre esa persona.

Jesús les dice a la gente y a nosotros que esto no es cierto. La buena fortuna y el sufrimiento humano no son resultado de la bendición ni la maldición de Dios. Dios derrama su gracia sobre los buenos y los malos. Seremos juzgados por el fruto de nuestras vidas, y no por las circunstancias individuales. El sufrimiento humano no significa que no seamos amados por Dios. La prosperidad y la salud no significan que hayamos encontrado el favor de Dios. Porque es por el poder de la cruz que somos salvos y liberados.

¿Por qué debería hacerlo?

¿Es usted feligrés registrado de San Miguel? A menudo me piden que firme formularios para personas a quienes se les ha solicitado ser padrinos de Bautismo o Confirmación. Esta solicitud implica una obligación moral para mí. Generalmente me piden que verifique que la persona es católica practicante y activa. Me aseguran que asisten regularmente a la iglesia, pero no los reconozco ni figuran en los registros parroquiales. Siendo honesto, a veces es muy difícil y vergonzoso interrogar a la gente innecesariamente, y esto a menudo los lleva a desconfiar y a enojarse con la Iglesia. Cuando estaba en San Cayetano, estaba en la oficina y la recepcionista se había alejado. Una mujer quería que le firmara un formulario para poder ser madrina. Me dijo: "Soy feligresa y soy buena amiga del párroco". Le dije: "¡Qué amable! Soy el párroco y creo que no la conozco." Me respondió: "Debe ser nuevo. ¿Cuánto tiempo lleva aquí?" Le dije: "Solo doce años." Lamentablemente, la gente se enoja cuando se les reta a decir la verdad.
