# Father Frank's Fire

In our first reading today from Exodus, God gave Moses and the Israelites the Ten Commandments, sometimes referred to as the Decalogue. The Commandments are referred to by some as the "negative law" filled with all of the "you shall nots." If we take time to consider the Commandments, we can easily see that the Law helps people to live in peace and harmony with each other. The first three Commandments tell us about our relationship with God, and the other seven tell us how we should treat one another. If we would only follow the Commandments – what a wonderful world we would live



in. The Commandments are for our own good. Sadly, many people in our world think of them as requests. God did not deliver the Ten Requests but the Ten Commandments. During Lent, it is time for us to remember that we are not God and that we are just dust. The reason why we live and breathe is that God has willed it so. Lent gives us the opportunity to examine our lives and return to God. Let us take advantage of this great opportunity for conversion.

#### **Catherine's Caring Cause**

As I mentioned in a previous article, there is an organization that was founded by two Sisters of Mercy — Sister Joanne Persch and Sister Pat Murphy — called Catherine's Caring Cause. Named for Catherine McAuley, the foundress of the Sisters of Mercy, Catherine's Caring Cause seeks to help those migrants pursuing asylum in the United States. This organization finds an apartment for a sponsored family, provides case management for legal and medical needs, and support from mentors. It provides rent and utilities for six months and furnishings for the apartment. It also helps mentor and acclimate the new arrivals to their new environment, as well as prepares the family to assume the financial and other responsibilities when the six months of support has been completed



This is not a handout but a way to help eliminate some suffering in our world. The sisters provide goals for the families to meet to continue in the program. I would like to direct our Lenten almsgiving to this fine organization. We will have a one-time collection next weekend — March 9 and 10 — and all of the monies will be forwarded to Catherine's Caring Cause. During Lent, monetary donations will be accepted at the parish office and in the weekly collection — please clearly mark envelopes "Catherine's Caring Cause."

I understand that the current migrant situation may stir up strong reactions. I am not making a political statement – those statements are the responsibility of our elected leaders. I am offering an opportunity for us to help the stranger. While this may not do much to provide a solution, we can

help to reduce some suffering. Remember the words of Jesus during the Last Judgement scene in Matthew's gospel, "Amen I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" and a few verses later, "Amen I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me."

#### The Power of Prayer

I am a firm believer in the power of prayer. So many people underestimate what can be accomplished through prayer. Intercessory prayer is when one person prays for the needs of another. Many times people leave Mass asking the priests to pray for them or for one of their loved ones. It is a privilege to be asked to pray for someone and that should not be taken lightly.

Everyone can offer these types of prayers and I would like to start a new ministry at St. Michael. I would like to form prayer teams that would be available after Mass to pray for others. Instead of coming to the priest and asking for a prayer sometime in the future, the prayer team members will be available to offer prayer with the asker. I know that many feel embarrassed about asking for prayer. There is nothing to fear, for prayer is so powerful. Some may feel reluctant to pray for others. Again, there is nothing to fear, as there is no wrong way to pray.

My vision is to begin slowly — perhaps selecting a weekend once a quarter. Prayer teams will be available after each Mass that weekend to pray with those seeking prayer. A priest will be available for those seeking the Sacrament of the Sick. My initial thought is to call this weekend a Day of Prayer and Healing.

In order to form this ministry, I will need volunteers to form prayer teams. No experience is necessary. Formation will be offered so that the people praying will become comfortable praying with others. Remember, Jesus says that where two or three gather in his name – he will take his place among them.

I ask that you think about if God is calling you to be part of a prayer team. I am looking for a date to have an initial meeting, probably after Easter.



## 3rd Sunday of Lent March 3, 2024

We live in a world that is broken by sin, self -sufficiency, material greed and isolation

caused by various factors. A world that is in need of healing and a change of heart. It always has been.

Just like today, God's people in Old Testament times needed help in focusing on the right things in life. In today's first reading, they are given the Ten Commandments to assist right living. But people are people and they continued to worship false gods and offer worship focused on externals.

Today's gospel reading is action-packed. Frustrated to say the least, Jesus confronts his people and challenges them to think about what they are doing. He speaks in metaphors about the temple of His body. His disciples do not fully understand what he means until Jesus is raised from the dead. But we, who know the whole story, can appreciate its meaning. Jesus is the new temple. He came to give a new and deeper meaning to all that we do.

Jesus came to help God's people live in a new way while fulfilling the old law. He shows us the way to heal ourselves and restore our relationship with God. When our lives are broken by sin and despair, he reaches out with His unending love and compassion. When we think we can live completely on our own, or in the virtual world we create, Jesus reminds us that we must include others. When we hoard our material goods, Jesus shows us how to get down to what really matters as we reach out to the poor. When we isolate ourselves, and think we can go it alone, Jesus shows us that only complete dependence on God will save us. Jesus knows our human nature and understands it well!

- How well do I know my human nature and where it can go wrong?
- How will I spread God's love and compassion this week?

Spring is just a few weeks away. It is such a wonderful time of the year. The temperature begins to warm and the world around us begins to take on a fresh new look. The

flowers start to bloom, the trees start to put on leaves, and the grass begins to turn bright green. Everything is so beautiful and new! There are other things that tell us that Spring is here, too. For one thing, baseball season begins, and everyone begins spring cleaning! Spring is a good time to give your house a good cleaning and rid your home of the junk you don't need.

Did you know that Jesus also performed a Spring cleaning of his house? The Gospel tells the story of how Jesus got rid of unwanted things. It was time for the annual Passover celebration, so Jesus traveled to Jerusalem. When he arrived, he went to the temple and he couldn't believe his eyes. There in the temple area he saw people selling cattle, sheep and doves for others to use as sacrifices in the temple. There were tables set up for money changers (like banks) so that people could have the right currency to pay their temple taxes. It looked more like a carnival than a house of worship.

Jesus did not like what he saw. He was so angry that he made a whip out of a cord. He drove the people out of the temple, and the sheep and cattle, too! And he scattered the money changers' coins all over the floor when he knocked their tables over! To the ones who were selling the doves he said, "Get these out of there! How dare you turn my Father's house into a market." Yes, I would say that Jesus did some spring cleaning in the temple that day!

As we think about Jesus cleansing the temple, we should also think about some other cleaning that needs to be done. We are in a season called Lent. At first, the word Lent meant 'the season of spring'. But it has now become much more than that. It is a time to look inside ourselves and see if there is anything in us that needs to be changed. Ask yourself, "How can I be more like Jesus and show kindness to others?" Offer yourself to Jesus to work through you and show you how to be more like him. Help others who are suffering and can use a kind and friendly person in their lives. Showing kindness to others is a way to clean and rid yourself of unwanted sins. Are there some areas of your life where you need some "Spring cleaning?" I know there are in mine!

Let's Pray: Dear Jesus, during this time when we think of "Spring cleaning", we ask you to forgive us when we do wrong and to make us clean. Amen.



## Lent—A Time for Change

Consider positive lifestyle changes during Lent. The U.S. Bishops tell us we are called to not only abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to also seek true inner conversion of heart and follow Christ's will more faithfully. One area where the world could benefit from personal conversion is what Pope John Paul II called an "ecological conversion." This is a conversion "whereby the effects of their encounter with Jesus Christ becomes evident in their relationship with the world around them" (LS 217).

In Laudate Deum, Pope Francis encourages us to modify lifestyles to reduce pollution and waste, and to "consume with prudence." Even though these everyday actions will not produce an immediate, notable effect on climate change, "we are helping to bring about large processes of transformation" and a new culture of care. Francis tells us to "put an end to the irresponsible derision that would present this issue as something purely ecological, 'green,' romantic, frequently subject to ridicule by economic interests. Let us finally admit that it is a human and social problem on any number of levels."

### Why You Should Make a Joyful Noise and Sing at Mass

#### Reason #4: Important texts should be sung.

"Sing to the Lord," a document released in 2007 by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, states that the Gospel Acclamation has the purpose of welcoming the "Lord who is about to speak to them" and, if NOT SUNG, may be omitted altogether. (STL, no. 161 and no. 163) The Church, in her infinite wisdom, suggests that the importance of announcing the Gospel is elevated best by singing, and that it may be better to eliminate the Gospel Acclamation rather than recite it.

La razón por la que vivimos y respiramos es que Dios así lo ha querido. La Cuaresma nos da la oportunidad de examinar nuestras vidas y regresar a Dios. Aprovechemos esta gran oportunidad de conversión.

#### Catherine's Caring Cause (La Causa Solidaria de Catherine)

Como mencioné en un artículo anterior, hay una organización fundada por dos Hermanas de la Misericordia, la Hermana Joanne Persch y la Hermana Pat Murphy, llamada Catherine's Caring Cause. Catherine lleva el nombre de Catherine McAuley, la fundadora de las Hermanas de la Misericordia. Catherine's Caring Cause busca ayudar a aquellos migrantes que buscan asilo en los Estados Unidos. Esta organización encuentra un apartamento para una familia apadrinada y brinda gestión de casos para necesidades médicas y legales y apoyo a mentores. La organización proporciona alquiler y servicios públicos durante seis meses, ayuda a amueblar el apartamento y asesora y aclimata a los recién llegados a su nuevo entorno, además de preparar a la familia para asumir las responsabilidades financieras y de otro tipo cuando se hayan completado los seis meses de apoyo.



Esto no es una limosna sino una forma de ayudar a eliminar parte del sufrimiento en nuestro mundo. Las hermanas proporcionan metas que las familias deben cumplir para continuar en el programa. Me gustaría dirigir nuestra limosna de Cuaresma a esta excelente organización. Tendremos una colecta única el próximo fin de semana, el 9 y 10 de marzo, y todo el dinero se enviará a Catherine's Caring Cause. Durante la Cuaresma, se aceptarán donaciones monetarias en el centro parroquial y en la colecta semanal; marque claramente los sobres como "Catherine's Caring Cause."

Entiendo que la actual situación migratoria puede provocar fuertes reacciones. No estoy haciendo una declaración política; esas declaraciones son responsabilidad de nuestros líderes electos. Estoy ofreciendo una oportunidad para que ayudemos al extraño. Si bien esto puede no ayudar

mucho a brindar una solución, podemos ayudar a reducir parte del sufrimiento. Recuerde las palabras de Jesús durante la escena del Juicio Final en el evangelio de Mateo: "De cierto les digo, todo lo que hiciste a uno de estos hermanos míos más pequeños, a mí lo hiciste", y unos versículos más tarde: "De cierto les digo a ustedes, lo que no hiciste a uno de estos más pequeños, a mí no lo hiciste."

#### El Poder de la Oracion

Creo firmemente en el poder de la oración. Mucha gente subestima lo que se puede lograr mediante la oración. La oración intercesora es cuando una persona ora por las necesidades de otra. Muchas veces la gente sale de Misa pidiendo a los sacerdotes que oren por ellos o por alguno de sus seres queridos. Es un privilegio que te pidan orar por alguien y eso no debe tomarse a la ligera.

Todos pueden ofrecer este tipo de oraciones y me gustaría comenzar un nuevo ministerio en St. Michael. Me gustaría formar equipos de oración que estuvieran disponibles después de la Misa para orar por los demás. En lugar de acudir al sacerdote y pedirle una oración en el futuro, los equipos de oración estarán disponibles y ofrecerán la oración con quien la pide. 


