Father Frank's Fire

This weekend is the First Sunday of Lent. Our Lenten journey leads us to take an honest look at our lives and how we live our faith. Jesus resisted the devil's temptations in today's gospel, and we are called to do the same. However, this does require a little bit of rigorous honesty with ourselves. If we are unwilling to take an honest look at our lives, attitudes and behaviors, our Lenten journey comes to a screeching halt. However, if we are willing to acknowledge our sinfulness, repent, and walk with Jesus to Calvary – we can be forgiven, and we can rise with Him on Easter morn. Our Lenten journey does not end in sin or death, but rather it continues to Resurrection and New Life. Our Lenten theme reminds us that we are on a journey; we are *"Pilgrims of Hope."*

Lenten Regulations

Fasting is an ancient discipline in the Church and, together with almsgiving and prayer, will help us prepare to celebrate Easter.

- Catholics 14 years and older are to **abstain** from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of **fast**. Catholics over 18 but not yet 59 are to eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs.

Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross have been and continue to be a traditional devotion during the Lenten Season, and are generally prayed on Fridays in remembrance of Good Friday. The Stations of the Cross are a form of prayer, a devotion that allows us walk the Way of the Cross with Jesus – helping us to understand what he did for us. Every Catholic Church in the world has the Stations of the Cross on their walls. These are not just pretty pictures, paintings, or statutes – they are meant to help us understand that Jesus suffered greatly for us and to lead us deeper into prayer. If you have not noticed our stations, I invite you to look at the walls around the Church – these stations tell the story of Christ's love, his suffering and his death.

I strongly urge you not to ignore these next 40 days of Lent, but to make the most out of them. In addition to our Mass schedule, this Lent St. Michael will be offering:

- ✠ Lenten Prayer Books;
- ✠ Daily Lenten Reflections written by fellow parishioners;
- ✠ Stations of the Cross on Fridays;
- ✠ Opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation; *and*
- ✠ A presentation by Dr. Jenny DeVivo on "Hope for the Future of the Church."

Use these various opportunities for prayer to deepen your relationship with Christ. Please check the bulletin and website for additional opportunities. Each year God gives us this time for our renewal and conversion. What is more important than your soul? May we rise from the ashes of sin and come alive with the fire of faith given to us at Pentecost!

The time is here – the Lenten season! A time for all of us to grow closer with God, our Father. Lent is a time where we get ready and prepare for Easter. There are many ways to prepare ourselves for Easter: saying prayers, doing kind gestures, giving up things that aren't good for our bodies (like sugar and chips), trying to change our bad behaviors and giving to the needy. Hopefully by now you have decided to do something special to draw you closer to God. When I was little, I always had a tough time deciding what to do. I didn't want to give up something that was too hard for me because I didn't want to end up cheating. I didn't want to give up something too easy because I wanted to feel like I was actually challenging myself and growing closer to God.

In the Bible, it says that we should not tell everyone what we are doing; we should do it quietly and without complaining or showing off. We aren't supposed to look miserable or sad that we can't have candy, if that is what we gave up. Why do you think it is important to do that? Part of the reason is that God wants us to keep our Lenten promise with love and an open heart. If we complain about it, we may hurt God's feelings. After all, God wants us to be closer to Him, not become annoyed that we are doing something for Him.

Imagine that your birthday is coming up. How would you feel if your family and friends complained about having to prepare for your special day? Wouldn't it hurt your feelings to hear someone make a negative comment about making your cake? Wouldn't it feel more special to see your loved ones excited to do something special for you? We should look at our Lenten promises the same way. Keep them with love and excitement so that God can feel us growing closer to him.

Whatever you decide your Lenten promise will be, let it be something that will make you feel good about doing it. That way, on Easter Sunday, you can be so happy that you grew closer to God and hopefully to the community of people around you! One thing I know for sure is that this world needs a lot of love and help. So if you are stuck deciding what to do as your Lenten promise – I have a suggestion for you: spread love and kindness all around. Try your best to be a little more kind, a little more patient, and if you have too much of something, share it. Every time we honor God by behaving like his son Jesus, we are being the very best version of ourselves. Grow with God this Lenten season and feel the Holy Spirit fill your heart.

St. Michael Mental Health Awareness Ministry MARCH PRAYER GATHERING

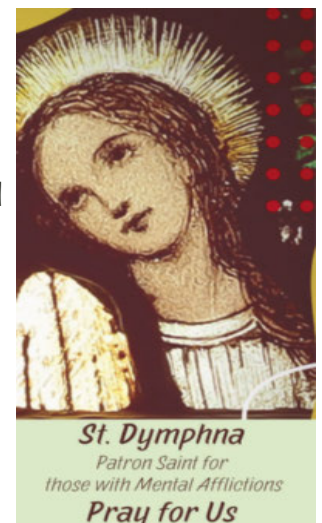

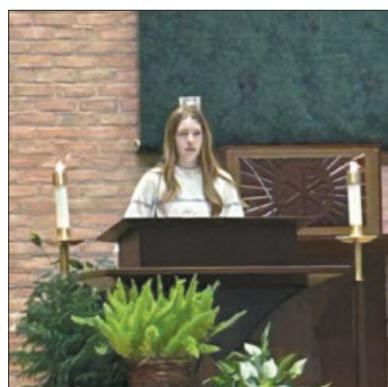

Este fin de semana es el primer domingo de Cuaresma. Nuestro camino cuaresmal nos lleva a examinar honestamente nuestra vida y cómo vivimos nuestra fe. Jesús resistió las tentaciones del diablo en el evangelio de hoy, y estamos llamados a hacer lo mismo. Sin embargo, esto requiere un poco de honestidad rigurosa con nosotros mismos. Si no estamos dispuestos a examinar honestamente nuestra vida, actitudes y comportamientos, nuestro camino cuaresmal se detiene de golpe. Sin embargo, si estamos dispuestos a reconocer nuestra pecaminosidad, arrepentirnos y caminar con Jesús hasta el Calvario, podemos ser perdonados y podemos resucitar con Él en la mañana de Pascua. Nuestro camino cuaresmal no termina en el pecado ni en la muerte, sino que continúa hacia la Resurrección y la Nueva Vida. Nuestro tema cuaresmal nos recuerda que estamos en un viaje; somos *“Peregrinos de la Esperanza.”*

Reglamento de Cuaresma

El ayuno es una disciplina antigua en la Iglesia y, junto con la limosna y la oración, nos ayudará a prepararnos para celebrar la Pascua.

- Los católicos de 14 años o más deben **abstenerse** de comer carne el Miércoles de Ceniza, el Viernes Santo y todos los viernes de Cuaresma.
- El Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo son días de **ayuno**. Los católicos mayores de 18 años pero menores de 59 deben comer sólo una comida completa. Se permiten dos comidas más pequeñas según sea necesario para mantener las fuerzas según las necesidades.

Estaciones de la Cruz

El Vía Crucis ha sido y sigue siendo una devoción tradicional durante la Cuaresma. El Vía Crucis se reza generalmente los viernes en recuerdo del Viernes Santo. El Vía Crucis es una forma de oración, una devoción que nos permite recorrer el Vía Crucis con Jesús, ayudándonos a entender lo que hizo por nosotros. Todas las iglesias católicas del mundo tienen el Vía Crucis en sus paredes. No son solo imágenes bonitas, pinturas o estatuas, sino que están destinadas a ayudarnos a comprender que Jesús sufrió mucho por nosotros y a llevarnos a una oración más profunda. Si no has notado nuestras estaciones, te invito a que mires las paredes que rodean la iglesia: estas estaciones cuentan la historia del amor de Cristo, su sufrimiento y su muerte.

Les recomiendo encarecidamente que no desperdicien estos próximos cuarenta días de Cuaresma, sino que los aprovechen al máximo. Además de nuestro programa de misas, esta Cuaresma St. Michael ofrecerá:

¿Qué es la Cuaresma?

La Cuaresma es un tiempo de preparación espiritual y reflexión que dura cuarenta días, desde el Miércoles de Ceniza hasta el Sábado Santo. Es un tiempo para arrepentirse de los pecados, purificarse y renovar la vida cristiana.

¿Qué se hace durante la Cuaresma?

- Se practica la abstinencia y el ayuno

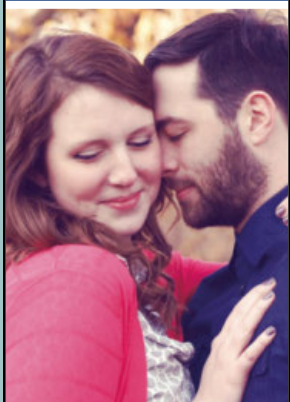
