Father Frank's Fire

I think one of the most common words in every day speech is "LOVE." It is a word that rolls off our tongues with little thought. We say that we love people, objects and even feelings and emotions. We can say that we love almost anything. I am convinced that we do not know what true love really is. The scriptures, however, offer us an insight. "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." Today Jesus reminds us that true love requires commitment and action – it is more than just saying "I love you."

Jesus not only told us that he loved us, but he also showed us by opening his arms on the cross. He gave us everything that he had and then commands us to love as he did. This is not an easy task. How many of us are willing to give so much for another? Yet this type of love identifies us as Christ's disciples. Christian love is not for the faint of heart. We cannot love without God. Jesus reminds us that we need to strive to love each other.






