## Father Frank's Fire

Happy Easter! We have one more week to celebrate Easter. Today we celebrate the Ascension of Jesus into heaven. When I was growing up Ascension Thursday was celebrated forty days after Easter – it was always a Thursday – and was a Holy Day of Obligation. Several decades ago, the Bishops of the United States decided to move the Solemnity of the Ascension to the Seventh Sunday of Easter and that is why we celebrate the Ascension this weekend and not on Thursday.

Sometimes we just do not get it. No matter how hard we try, we just cannot seem to understand. I must admit that for most of my life I did not understand the significance of the Ascension. I thought, “What’s the big deal?” Jesus tells us that in order for the Holy Spirit to come – He must return to the Father in heaven. When I was young, I did not understand the power and the importance of the Holy Spirit’s presence and action in the world. For without the Holy Spirit – we can do nothing. The Holy Spirit gives us the courage and strength to live and share our faith.

After Jesus ascended into heaven, his disciples stood there looking into the sky. Why? The answer is simple, they did not understand – they did not know what to do. The angels said, “*Why are you standing there looking into the sky?*” To put it another way – do not just stand there; there is something that you have to do – now go and do it! In the gospel, they were given a mission, “*Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature.*” It was not until the Holy Spirit came that they understood the importance of their mission. However, once the Spirit descended upon them they went out with courage and vigor and proclaimed the Good News to anyone who would listen. We know that they were successful for here we are, thousands of years later and thousands of miles from Jerusalem and We Believe in the saving power and love of Christ.

It seems to me that we are like the first disciples standing around and looking into the air. We also have a mission to tell the world of God’s love for us. We are called to share our faith with those around us. Sometimes we are afraid because we do not want to be made fun of. Jesus invites us to let go of our fears and to do the work he has entrusted to do.

### Memorial Day

This weekend we take time to remember all those who have given their lives for our nation. We are reminded that freedom comes at a cost. In fact, our true freedom as the children of God came at the cost of Jesus’ blood. Let us remember all those who gave their lives and continue to give their lives for our nation. May we be grateful for their sacrifices and the sacrifices of their families. We will have only one Mass on Memorial Day at 8:00AM.

### Pentecost

Next weekend, we celebrate the great Solemnity of Pentecost. This is the birthday of the Church, when the Holy Spirit came down upon the apostles. Pentecost also marks the end of the Easter Season. I pray that each of us will be open to receive the gift of God’s Holy Spirit.

The past two years have been difficult for many as the global pandemic caused isolation and loneliness. Many of our parishioners miss the interactions that they had with fellow parishioners prior to the pandemic. The Parish Pastoral Council has been looking for ways to help strengthen us as a community of believers. Next weekend, on Pentecost Sunday, we will have an opportunity to gather in the Multi-Purpose Room to spend some time with each other. There is not an agenda – but simply a time to build upon the relationships we have and to form new ones.

I am going to be the first to admit – I am not good at remembering names. For half of my time at St. Michael we had to wear masks. Once the masks were off – I had an even harder time. We are going to try something new. On Pentecost, as we gather in the MPR, we are going to ask you to wear nametags. The Holy Spirit asked the apostles to move out of their comfort zones and I pray we are all willing to do so as we get to know each other again.

May this Pentecost breathe fire, life, and renewal in our lives and in the life of the Church. Let our prayer be a simple one, “Come Holy Spirit Come!”

**Calendar – Priest Convocation**

Every three years, the Archbishop of Chicago convenes a convocation of all priests. Because of COVID it has been four years since the priests of the Archdiocese and Cardinal Cupich have gotten together to pray, reflect and have honest discussions about how the Church can minister to the people of the Archdiocese. Cardinal Cupich has asked all of the priests to gather at a convocation beginning Monday June 27 – Thursday June 30.

Because of the convocation, all of the priests will be away from the parish beginning the afternoon of Monday June 27 and returning on Thursday evening June 30. There will be no morning Masses beginning Tuesday, June 28. There will be one morning Mass on Friday, July 1 at 8:00AM and the regular schedule will follow. The Cardinal has asked that the faithful still gather to pray for the priests and the parish will be offering prayer services during the time the priests are away. Those times are to be determined. I am aware that some may become angry that all of the priests are away, however the gospel tells us that Jesus often went with his disciples alone to teach them and to pray with them. I ask for your understanding and your prayers.

## Taking Home the Sunday Scriptures

### Ascension of Our Lord —May 29, 2022

The Acts of the Apostles and Luke's Gospel use the same word—witnesses—to describe the disciples' role in the new world order. In our culture, a witness can be passive, a mere onlooker, or more active, a formal expert who provides sworn testimony in a trial. Over the next weeks and months we will hear testimony by those in politics in our country. As we know, some of that testimony will be true, and some will be false. Those who will testify will not have an easy time as their words are either believed or not. The Greek word for witness is martyr. In today's politics and in today's gospel we see things happening and we are not sure what to believe. And there will be a cost for some. Some will be martyred.

In today's gospel we see unbelievable things happening with our eyes of faith. The disciples watch Jesus float into the air. Then an angel plainly appears to them and promises them that Jesus will come again. They see this happen. Unbelievable isn't it? And immediately before ascending, Jesus makes a promise to them: You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses . . . to the ends of the earth." That is real lasting power unlike anything we can earn. Their mission is not a superficial task to confirm the idle rumor that Jesus really floated in mid-air. No, they must be willing to swear—even with their lives—that Jesus is the Christ who accepted an agonizing crucifixion on our behalf, rose from the dead, ascended into heaven, and promised to come again to offer final salvation.

Just imagine how Jesus disciples felt. THEY WITNESSED AND BELIEVED! And the story we continue to hear and pass on IS TRUE! WITHOUT A DOUBT! Countless witnesses have died to transmit the saving legacy of Jesus Christ. And we have inherited that truth. It is our legacy, too.



Did you ever watch a balloon float up into the sky? It's a fun thing to watch (to see a balloon ascend into the sky) – once released into the air, it gets smaller and smaller and disappears within the clouds. It's a very simple thing but very enjoyable to watch. Sometimes, we may even have a hard time letting go of the balloon because we don't want it to disappear. We talk about the Ascension of Jesus into heaven – When Jesus died, he rose from the dead and then he ascended into heaven after 40 days. Jesus ascended into the clouds and went to heaven OR he went up into the clouds....ascension is a big word but Jesus deserves a big word since he did a pretty amazing thing! Imagine his friends that saw this marvelous thing occur. They probably did not want to see him go because they loved and cared for him so much. Close your eyes and try and imagine what it would be like to see Jesus ascend into heaven. What would you feel? How would you react in seeing him float into the sky like a balloon and disappear into the clouds? His friends were probably very emotional and crying happy tears, sad tears and tears of joy. They knew they were following the right man but they were in awe to see him leave them in such a fantastic way. They knew if they continued their work for God, they would go into heaven just like Jesus did. They knew that even though Jesus ascended into heaven, he is still with us. Jesus is in church, in the Eucharist, the sacraments and in all the people around you. Remember that Jesus is always with you. Know that when you believe in him, you too will live forever in heaven. Let's pray: Heavenly Father. We know that Jesus promised us eternal life in heaven. Please help us to forgive those that hurt us and love one another the way that Jesus taught us so that we can have eternal life in heaven. Amen

## El Fuego del Padre Frank

¡Felices Pascuas! Tenemos una semana más para celebrar la Pascua. Hoy celebramos la Ascensión de Jesús al cielo. Cuando estaba creciendo, el Jueves de la Ascensión se celebraba cuarenta días después de la Pascua, siempre era un jueves, y era un Día Santo de Obligación. Hace varias décadas, los Obispos de los Estados Unidos decidieron trasladar la Solemnidad de la Ascensión al Séptimo Domingo de Pascua y es por eso que celebramos la Ascensión este fin de semana y no el jueves.

Pensé: "¿Cuál es el gran cosa?" Jesús nos dice que para que el Espíritu Santo venga, Él debe regresar al Padre que está en los cielos. Cuando era joven, no entendía el poder y la importancia de la presencia y acción del Espíritu Santo en el mundo. Porque sin el Espíritu Santo, no podemos hacer nada. El Espíritu Santo nos da el coraje y la fuerza para vivir y compartir nuestra fe.

Después de que Jesús ascendió al cielo, sus discípulos se quedaron allí mirando al cielo. ¿Por qué? La respuesta es simple, no entendían, no sabían qué hacer. Los ángeles *dijeron*: "*¿Por qué están parados allí mirando al cielo?*" Para decirlo de otra manera, no se queden allí; hagan lo que tienen que hacer, ¡ahora vayan y háganlo!
