Father Frank's Fire

Jesus reminds us today that the greatest commandment is to love God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength. To put it more simply, to love God above all people and things, and to love him with everything we have. Put God first in your life and everything else will fall into place. Jesus also reminds us that the second commandment is to love your neighbor as yourself. Love is the key word. For many love is an emotion that we have difficulty controlling. However, in the scriptures love is described more as a choice. We choose to love, to hate, or to be simply indifferent.

A quick look at the news shows us that violence and hatred dominates our society. Every Monday we get news reports of the number of shootings that occurred over the weekend. We have become so immune to violence that many times we do not even notice or care.

We hear about hostage taking, of mass shootings in work places, stores and even schools. Leadership, not only political but also religious, have ramped up attacks on people who hold different views from them. There is a division in the Church, as our leadership attempts to deal with the significant challenges ahead of us. It seems as if we have lost respect for one another. Does the current climate reflect a society that is rooted in the love of God and neighbor?



What can we do? Pray! Pray for our nation, pray for our leaders, pray for the Church and pray for the world that we will recognize God's command to love. It may seem too simple but I am convinced that it is only through the power of prayer that we will recognize the absolute necessity to love God and one another.

State of St. Michael Parish

Each year, the pastor of every parish is called upon to report "the state of" the parish. In the pages that follow, you will see a glimpse of the financial position of St. Michael Parish for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2024, and 2023. I want to begin by thanking you for your generosity to St. Michael Parish. I am aware that many sacrifice for the good of our parish and I am grateful.

The pastor is charged with the care of the spiritual needs of the parish, and he also is entrusted with the parish's resources. I, like you, am called to be a good and faithful steward of the many blessings, resources and responsibilities that God has entrusted to me. I do not take this lightly.

The major source of revenue for the church is the Sunday and Holy Day Collections. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, total collections amounted to \$1,875,602. Our budget was \$1,879,350 – total collections were \$3,748 or 0.2% below budget. If we compare fiscal year 2024 to fiscal year 2023 – our collections are \$43,806 or 2.4% higher than last year's amount of \$1,831,796. This is truly a testimony to the generosity of our parishioners.

Overall, the financial results of the parish are good and indicative of your generosity. The parish's net operating income for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024 is \$292,669. The increase in net operating income is primarily attributed to the increase in interest and investment income. During fiscal year 2024, interest rates were rising and, as a result, so did interest and investment income. We are now in a period of declining interest rates and, as such, I expect a decrease in interest and investment income.

St. Michael Parish has NO debt and all of our financial obligations are current. It is because of your generosity that we stand strong today able to face the challenges that tomorrow will bring.

There is so much more to St. Michael Parish than just its finances. It is through our Outreach Ministries such as St. Vincent de Paul that the hungry are fed. St. Michael offers a variety of programs, prayer experiences and resources to help with faith formation for all ages. Through our Liturgical Ministries, God is praised and worshiped each day. The Ministers of Care make sure the homebound and hospitalized remain connected to our community. Our parish school and religious education programs are forming the next generation of Catholics – the ones to whom the sacred deposit of faith will be entrusted. QUEST gives teenagers an opportunity to remain connected to the Church during their high school years.

Last year, St. Michael welcomed 131 new disciples through the Sacrament of Baptism. One hundred forty-seven (147) children received the Eucharist for the first time and 144 were sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit through the Sacrament of Confirmation. Twenty (20) couples were united through the Sacrament of Marriage and we said good-bye to 126 of our parishioners. Through the work of the Church, we preached the Good News of Salvation, reconciled those in need of forgiveness and cared for the poor, the ill and the dying. We were the face of Christ to many and most of this work — the mission of Christ — is done by you, the parishioners of St. Michael Parish.

I would like to thank the current members of the Parish Finance Council who help me sort out the financial details, offer advice and help me to make necessary decisions. I am grateful for their wisdom and dedication to our parish. A special thank you to Diana Vitela, our Business Manager, for her hard and faithful work to St. Michael. She helps keep the parish operations running smoothly and efficiently. The daily tasks and projects are completed because of her tireless efforts.

You may have noticed that included in your envelope packets is an envelope simply titled "Capital Improvements." This envelope is for those unforeseen costs that the parish often faces, such as roof repairs; repairs to or replacement of the heating and cooling systems; electrical issues; and so on. These and others arise unexpectedly and are often not budgeted in the normal operating costs of the parish. For example, during the summer months several of our older air-conditioning units needed to be replaced at a cost of approximately \$77,000. These costs were not expected nor budgeted for – they were paid from parish savings. The "Capital Improvements" envelope will be used only for expenses such as these.

Thank you for your support and generosity. We have a rich tradition of faithful response to God's calling. We have much to be grateful for. Our past was amazing, and our present and future will be glorious if we continue to work together by sharing our time, talent and treasure. We cannot expect someone else to do this for us. We must serve as one and be Christ to one another. St. Michael is our spiritual home; I ask for your help so that everything we do may give true honor and glory to God!





Dear St. Michael Parish Family,

Last year, I wrote to you about Reverend William Killeen, a retired priest who served in your parish as an associate pastor from June 1989 to April 1991. The Archdiocese had received an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor while Father Killeen was assigned to St. Patricia Parish more than 40 years ago. In keeping with our child protection policies, the allegation was reported to civil authorities and the person making the allegation was offered the services of our Victim Assistance Ministry. Father Killeen cooperated with my direction to remain out of ministry while the allegation was investigated.

The Archdiocese Independent Review Board met this week to evaluate the results of the investigation. They determined that there is not a reasonable cause to believe Father Killeen sexually abused a minor. In addition, the Board recommended that Father Killeen be returned to ministry and that the file be closed. After prayerful consideration, I have accepted their recommendations and restored Father Killeen's faculties to minister in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

The welfare of the children entrusted to our care is our paramount consideration. Consequently, we take seriously all allegations of sexual misconduct. It is to the credit of our priests that they support our child protection policies. They understand that only by applying a meticulous and impartial process to all allegations can we remain committed to our work of assisting survivors and, with the help of independent advisors, thoroughly evaluate all allegations.

At the same time, I am committed to restoring the good name of those so accused if the case is unsubstantiated. To that end, I publicly affirm that Father Killeen is a priest in good standing and express sincere appreciation for his many years of service to the People of God in the Archdiocese of Chicago. This period away from ministry has been challenging for him. He deserves our respect and gratitude and I hope you will join me in thanking him for his long-standing dedication.

In closing, I encourage anyone who believes they have been abused by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee to come forward. You will be received with respect and compassion. To report abuse please refer to the Archdiocesan website at www.archchicago.org.



St. Michael Mental Health Awareness Ministry NOVEMBER PRAYER GATHERING Wednesday, Nov. 20 7:00pm in the Chapel








