The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him.

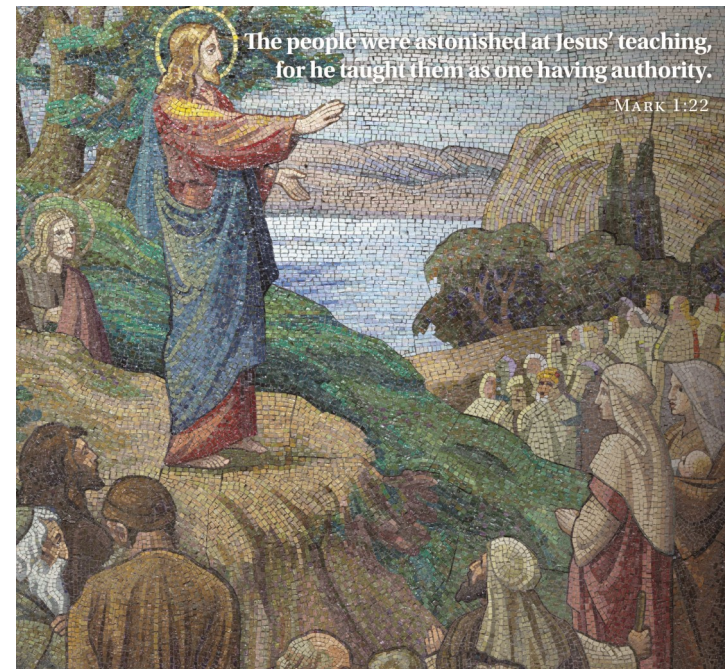
All were amazed and asked one another,

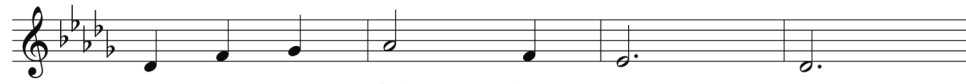

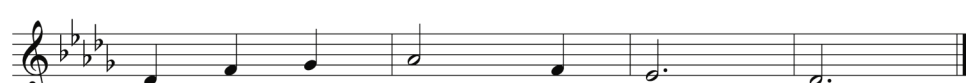
