Assembly: Lord, make haste to help us.


All make the sign of the cross as we say.


Presider: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit...

Assembly: As it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.


Musician begins Hymn immediately

MORNING HYMN: Were You There – G2 #416










Presider and lector sit and cantor moves to ambo to lead psalm. Musician allows at least 5 seconds of silence and then begins.

PSALM PRAYER


Presider: Let us pray ...

R: Amen

Presider sits and Cantor comes to ambo to lead 2^{nd} Psalm. Musician allows at least 5 seconds before beginning.

PSALM 147: Bless the Lord, My Soul - GC2 #141

PSALM PRAYER

Presider: Let us pray ...

Almighty and merciful God, you freely forgive those who confess their sins, as did David, the prophet king of Israel. We acknowledge our offenses before you. Restore the joy of our salvation, and wash away all our sins in the precious blood of your beloved Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

Lector remains seated for 20 seconds of silence following the psalm prayer and then moves to ambo to proclaim the scripture.

READING: Isaiah 52:13-15

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

See, my servant shall prosper,
he shall be raised high and greatly exalted.
Even as many were amazed at him –
so marred was his look beyond human semblance
and his appearance beyond that of the sons of man –
so shall he startle many nations,
because of him kings shall stand speechless;
for those who have not been told shall see,
those who have not heard shall ponder it.

The Word of the Lord.

Lector is seated.

Presider allows 30 seconds of silence. Lector remains seated. Presider stands and introduces responsory:

RESPONSORY

Presider: For our sake Christ was obedient accepting even death,

death on a cross.

Assembly: Therefore, God raised him on high and gave him the name above all

other names.

Bow head slightly while saying the following:

Presider: Glory be to the Father and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Assembly: As it was in the beginning is now and will be forever.

For our sake Christ was obedient accepting even death, death on a cross.

Presider allows 5 seconds of silence.

Musician begins the music. All stand. Presider leads all in making the sign of the cross as cantor sings, "Blessed be," at the beginning of the canticle.

INTERCESSIONS (introduced by Presider)

Presider: For our sake, our Redeemer suffered death was buried and rose again.

With heartfelt love, let us adore him and pray...

Intercessions are sung by the cantor.

Cantor: Please join in singing "Lord, Hear our Prayer."

O Christ, you willingly accepted your cross: help us to walk along your way, we pray ...

O Christ, when wounded you did not make threats: show us how to forgive to the very end, we pray ...

O Christ, when forced to suffer you did not rebel: transfigure our refusals, we pray ...

O Christ, you see our suffering and failures: help us to accept our own shortcomings and failures, we pray ...

O Christ, you see the pain in the exiled and abandoned: help us to persevere in our suffering and suffer with others, we pray ...

O Christ, you know the many needs of our times and of your people; may we place them all in your loving care, and give our lives so that others may live, we pray...

Allow some time for silence so those watching can add their own intentions.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Holding the book at the chair the presider introduces the Lords' Prayer with the following words, then places the book on the chair and with hands raised in the orans position sings with the Lord's Prayer with the cantor:

Presider: With our eyes fixed on Jesus,

whose blood was shed for our redemption,

let us seek pardon and peace from God as we sing:

Our Father...

CLOSING PRAYER:

Presider: All-powerful and ever-living God,

your only Son went down among the dead

and rose again in glory.

In your goodness

raise up your faithful people,

who were buried with him in baptism,

to be one with him

in the eternal life of heaven,

where he lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit,

one God, for ever and ever.

R: Amen.

BLESSING:

Signing him/ herself as he/she says the following words:

Presider: May the Lord + bless us,

protect us from all evil

and bring us to everlasting life. Amen.

Musician begins the music for the closing hymn.
