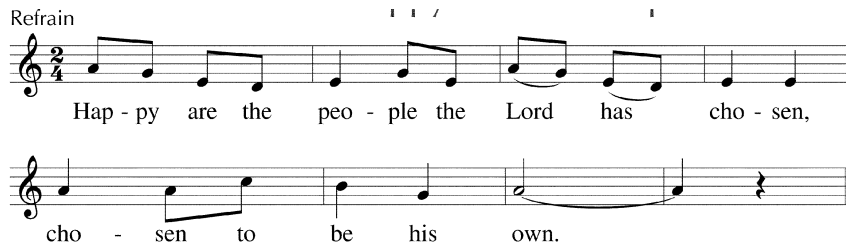
First Reading: Dt 4:32-34, 39-40

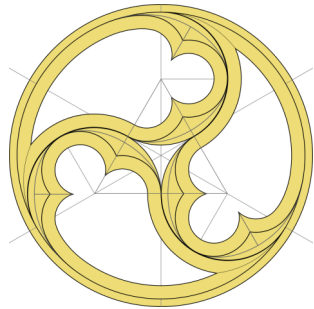

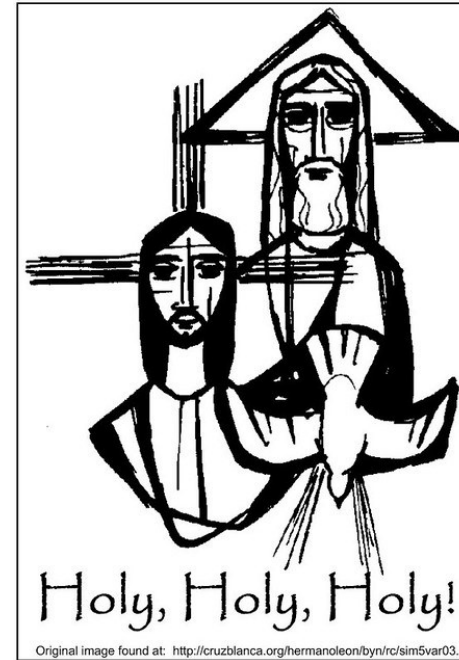

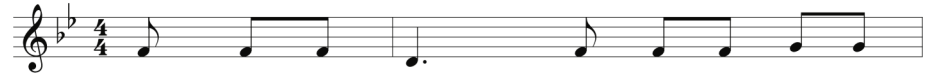
